Student of the Bible?



Would you believe many people *imagine* they are students of God's word, when in fact they are not?<sup>(a)</sup> Could we be deceived in that way? Perhaps more importantly, is there a way we can know for certain we are not misled?<sup>(ll)</sup>

**The Book of John**  
(and the theme of the Bible)  
**made simple.**

Becoming God's friend is a natural thing. God is looking for those who are looking for him. (2 Chron 16:9-10) (Darby Translation) "For the eyes of Jehovah run to and fro through the whole earth, to show himself strong in the behalf of those whose heart is perfect toward him." God directs those looking for Him to the teachings of his son Jesus. (John 6:44 - "Literal Version) No one is able to come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him." Jesus then teaches us who God is. (Matt 16:17 - Contemporary English Translation) "...The only one who truly knows the Father is the Son. But the Son wants to tell others about the Father, so that they can know him too."

Picking up the Bible to study can seem overwhelming, what with it containing nearly 2000 pages. If you consider, however, the first 1000 of its pages are the Hebrew Scriptures or the Old Testament. They are largely to introduce a promised Messiah, and to illustrate our need for him. Next, we find the four short books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, containing about 40 pages each. They are parallel accounts of the earthly teachings of God's son, that promised Messiah; the Bible books that follow these four gospel accounts contain some prophecy, along with the documented efforts of early Christians to apply the teachings of Jesus.

If you are one whom God is drawing to his son, you should take special notice of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. As Jesus himself said, he came to make his Father known to us: (John 7:26 - Good News Bible) "I have made you known to those you gave me out of the world." (John 17:26 - Darby Translation) "...I have been born for this, and for this I have come into the world, that I might bear witness to the truth."

Clearly understanding just one of those 40 page Gospels, then, can help you know our Creator and his Son. It means you're very life. As Jesus himself said: (John 17:3 - New Living Translation) "Whoever knows me and knows the Father who sent me into the world, that they shall be knowing I, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom I have sent into the world."

If you understand the Book of John, and, therefore, the theme of the Bible, you can answer these questions: (See Job 4 - Modern King James Version) "What has gone on at Maron and has come down? Who has gathered dew in his hand? Who has been his name in his generation? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What is he, that he answers, and what is his name?" Surely you know.

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But the path of the righteous ones is like the bright star, going higher and higher until the day is fully established. - Job 1:16

Book of John:

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"All who come to God believe He exists and is good." Heb 11:6

Are you a student of God's word? Jesus warned us many people would come to him in the last day expecting his help and saying they were his followers. He also said he would tell some of them to get away because he didn't know them at all.<sup>a</sup> *We do know the secret to avoid being shunned by our lord in that way.* Do you? It's very simple, really, and *it is not a secret at all.* Even so... Most (or at least many) people seem unwilling to see or to hear and remain ignorant. Jesus clearly explained everything we need to know, and what we need to do.<sup>(kk)</sup> The secret is: We simply need to be careful to listen to what Jesus actually taught!

Let us consider a real life example that illustrates this very common misunderstanding and failure by well-intentioned Bible students. The danger we attempt to help you recognize is that many are being misled to believe they are students of the Bible (and of Jesus Christ) when they actually are not. This insight came while reading a portion of the Bible with two individuals (as an effort by the three of us to learn more about it). Each of the two consider themselves mature Bible students. Something surprising came to light. As the reading progressed from the book of Matthew (one of the four short Gospel recordings of Jesus's teachings), neither of the two people we mention could follow the theme Jesus was presenting for even one single chapter of Matthew. They both consider themselves to have considerable Bible knowledge and it might surprise you that they actually do! Either one of them can quote many different verses from the Bible as their personal definitive proof that their "faith" is real. Even so, in this example, neither one of them could actually follow and understand the theme of what Jesus was saying. The two are members of a religious sect whose followers take considerable pride in themselves as Bible scholars. And yet, neither could follow the Bible's theme through even one chapter of Matthew's recording of what Jesus was sent by his Father to teach.<sup>(g)</sup> Which sect they are part of makes little difference for the purpose of our consideration. This same error infects members of most all of Christendom's varied sectarian religious groups. Please seriously consider the danger being

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Luke 13:24-27 ESV "Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. revealed here: Do many years of imagined Bible study, by people who pick and choose verses from the Bible to support an organizational doctrine they have been taught; does that really make them followers of Christ and true Bible students? If they can't follow even one chapter from one book of one of the Gospel accounts of what Jesus taught, beginning to end, can they imagine they know Christ? Could they be in danger of having Jesus tell them to get away because he didn't know them; because they had actually remained followers of men and "workers of lawlessness?"<sup>(a)</sup> Studying the doctrine of some religious sect using their so called "Bible study aids" is not Bible study! Again we plead, please take notice of this danger and that Jesus did warn you about it!<sup>(t)</sup> Our intent is not to judge these people right or wrong, mind you. If they are convinced they are pleasing to Jesus's Father,<sup>b</sup> that is their choice to make and it is their own responsibility.<sup>(y)</sup> We are each one rendering judgment over ourselves by our response to Jesus's words.<sup>(iii)</sup> Our ~~desire~~ *need* is to simply pass along Jesus's warning that everyone should examine their faith, to be certain it really is a faith based in what he actually taught (rather than what people say he taught).<sup>(a)</sup> Each and every one of us has precisely that same responsibility: We must know for ourselves what God's son taught.<sup>(g)</sup> Our effort here is to warn you about the danger of being misled, but more importantly, to help you see just how easy it is to understand the message Jesus brought us. Religionists make it seem hard. It is not!<sup>c & (l)</sup> Would a God who is good make getting to know him a hard thing to do?

The example we considered simply shines the light on the great failing of all the varied religious sects who are only professing to be Christian. Their failing is always the same: They don't actually study and teach what Jesus taught. It is easy to identify them, once you start to actually read and recognize Jesus's warnings to be on the watch for them.<sup>(t)</sup> Many of them truly believe they are students of God's Word.<sup>(a)</sup> What defines each one of them as a sect is the same defective study process shared by *all* cults. They all study from what most of them refer to as Bible study aids. Each sect has its own and different (sectarian) study materials, of course, but they are all being misdirected to replace the Bible with their chosen writings by men. (The Bible was, of course, written down by men; but it was inspired by God.<sup>d</sup> There is no reason to believe Bible study aids are inspired!)<sup>e</sup> Rather than simply joining together and

actually reading what Jesus taught from the Bible, cults are identified as they use materials produced by other men. Cults jump around in the Bible picking and choosing scriptures in support of their own sectarian doctrine. Most of them actually believe that is Bible study. *It is not!*<sup>(qq)</sup> Please understand: This is a ~~secret~~ *simple solution* Jesus gave that can protect you.<sup>(kk)</sup> To actually know Jesus Christ, then, you have to read and learn for yourself what he actually taught (as recorded in the four short Gospels by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John).<sup>(h)</sup> It ain't rocket science. What you can never do, is learn what *Jesus taught* by jumping around from scripture to scripture, allowing yourself to be guided you do so by the writings of some sect of men. And yes, you are wise if you recognize that does include this booklet. The saving grace for this material, however, is that it always directs you to the importance of the teachings left us by Jesus Christ. Once you recognize and understand that importance, you need only read for yourself what he taught! We never direct you to rely on us to be your teacher or spiritual guide. We always direct you to Jesus.

By sitting at the feet of Jesus (by reading and meditating on what he said; on what he was sent by his Father to teach),<sup>(h)</sup> we expose our thinking processes to the mind of God.<sup>f</sup> It is the simple method

You will note some of the Bible translations we quote use the personal name of the God of the Bible: Jehovah. Many translations do. The popular King James Version makes God's personal name clear:~

**Exodus 6:3 KJV** And I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by *the name of God Almighty*, but by my name **Jehovah** was I not known to them.~

used by our heavenly Father to pattern and heal our mind.<sup>g</sup> We absolutely must, however, actually read Jesus's words to benefit ourselves in that way. Jumping around in the Bible does not achieve that healing process. Only by our making the personal choice to figuratively sit at the feet of Jesus Christ can we begin to heal ourselves.<sup>h</sup> We say again how simple this is: We sit at the feet of

Recognize: "Christian" is the only scripturally inspired name for the true followers of Jesus.\*~

Jesus Christ, in our day in time, by reading what God inspired to be recorded in the Gospels about his son.<sup>i</sup> There is only about 200 pages in all four of the Gospels combined. The method God uses to help us, then, operates exactly the same for each and every receptive person: God is looking through all the earth for each person who is looking for him.<sup>j</sup> Jesus is God's method of speaking to each and every righteously inclined individual He finds. God simply directs the righteous to the teachings of his son. Very simply: Your life depends on your learning what Jesus was sent by Jehovah<sup>(f)</sup> to teach you.<sup>k</sup>

Most people who create Bible study aids probably mean well. We certainly mean well as we work to produce this one. What is very different about this material, however, is that *it directs you to read for yourself what Jesus came to teach*. We make clear, over and over, that's all the help we can give. Directing others to the teachings of Jesus is all the help any of us can ever be. Any asserted Bible study aid, that doesn't direct and encourage you to actually read what Jesus came to teach in the Bible, will instead attempt to lead you into the doctrine of its producers. They have picked out scriptures in support of what they believe, of course. You need to recognize that to be very different from simply reading what Jesus taught. Men can pick and choose scriptures to make the Bible say anything they want. Learning what *Jesus Christ himself* said, however, is your protection. *It is your only protection!* As an example of picking scriptures to support doctrine: We should love others because of God's great love for us. Religionists will pick out a scripture like 1 John, chapter 4, verse 19 for support: "*As for us, we love, because he first loved us.*" That is a true statement, of course, and that scriptural principle is valuable to know. What that process of learning a single scripture doesn't really do for you, however, is help you fully understand why love is important. It doesn't give the full benefit of you what Jesus was sent by his Father to pass along to each and every one of us.<sup>1 & (g)</sup> Jesus came to help us pattern our

mind so as to start learning to think like his Father (as much as humans possibly can). More accurately, Jesus came to help us think and feel like he does. Jesus is perfect and he knew his Father is perfect, and that any choice to disobey his Father would cause harm to someone. Jesus knew his own happiness, and ours, rests in obedience to his Father's teachings.<sup>m</sup> God doesn't require any more of us than is absolutely necessary to protect us and all his creation. God's protection must extend to each and every one of us. He is good! The world we have created, by our disobedience to God, stands as an eternal touchstone illustrating our absolute need to obey Jehovah. The one and only way you can really grasp and

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so that they can know him too. (23) Jesus then turned to his disciples and said to them in private, "You are really blessed to see what you see! understand that is by reading the Gospel recordings of what Jesus taught,<sup>(m)</sup> book by book, beginning to end; with the constant emphasis being on stretching your mind over the whole of what Jesus therein displayed himself to be. Jesus doesn't just teach us facts, he teaches us about people, and why they do what they do. Reading what Jesus taught is actually the only way we can learn about ourselves.<sup>n</sup> Jesus is the perfect example of one who would always obey his Father, what ever the short term cost might be.<sup>o</sup> (There is never any long term cost in obedience to Jehovah. Obedience to our Father always brings blessing. Satan was able to punish Jesus briefly for his obedience to his Father, but Jesus has now been given glory and power by his Father beyond any other.

Soon, Satan will not be able to harm anyone ever again.)<sup>p</sup> We are not trained to think large thoughts by the world in which we live. We grow up being trained to expect instant gratification. Exercising your mind to grasp the theme of the whole of the Bible is a task, just like learning to walk was a task. (If you learn what Jesus taught in the Gospels, you will understand the rest of the Bible.) Christian maturity is the gift that comes from making yourself read and re-read, and then to apply, what Jesus Christ taught.<sup>q</sup> Trying to grasp

(5) That is how it was with Christ. He became a high priest, but not just because he wanted the honor of being one. It was God who told him, "You are my Son, because today I have become your Father!" (6) In another place, God says, "You are a priest forever just like Melchizedek." (7) God had the power to save Jesus from death. And while Jesus was on earth, he begged God with loud crying and tears to save him. He truly worshiped God, and God listened to his prayers. (8) Jesus is God's own Son, but still he had to suffer before he could learn what

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it really means to obey God. (9) Suffering made Jesus perfect, and now he can save forever all who obey him. (10) This is because God chose him to be a high priest like Melchizedek. (11) Much more could be said about this subject. But it is hard to explain, and all of you are slow to understand. (12) By now you should have been teachers, but once again you need to be taught the simplest things about what God has said. You need milk instead of solid food. (13) People who live on milk are like babies who don't really know what is right. (14) Solid food is for mature people who have been trained to know right from wrong.

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recognize modern day hypocritical religious leaders, just like he had to recognize them in his own day. As Jesus said: By their fruits you can recognize all men for what they really are.<sup>†</sup> You only need to learn from Jesus what we *should* all be doing (what fruit we should be bearing). Encouraging you to really and truly learn what Jesus taught is the whole purpose of this booklet (and of the website - [justbibletruth.com](http://justbibletruth.com)). Hence, we always emphasize your need to read the Gospels for yourself. To encourage faith in the Bible and to draw attention to this common and dangerous failing by most self-proclaimed Bible teachers, then, let us consider the chapter in Matthew that proved to be the problem for the people we consider in our example. It could just as easily be most any chapter from any of the four Gospel recordings of Jesus's teachings (Matthew, Mark, Luke or John).

Before we begin, please consider a little Bible background that will help us understand not only this chapter, but everything else Jesus

said. One thing you should know is Jesus was born a Jew. The Jewish nation that had been considered God's chosen people for about 1500 years from Moses down to the Christ; or, for 2000 years if you count from the days of Abraham as the father of the Jewish nation.<sup>u</sup> That knowledge is important because God had promised a Messiah who would come from that nation (as a descendant of Abraham) and would bless all the nations of mankind (bless not just the Jews, mind you, but all of us). Those Bible (Old Testament - OT) promises caused the Jewish nation of Jesus's day to be expecting the arrival of that promised Messiah.<sup>v</sup> All of (righteously inclined) mankind had actually (already) been looking for that deliverer since he was mentioned in the very first promise by God way back in Genesis 3:15.<sup>(x)</sup> God there promised He would raise up a seed from the woman (Eve) who would crush Satan's head. Those later promises God made to Abraham<sup>w</sup> and to his seed, then, were

So now, knowing Jesus to be the promised Jewish Messiah, let us read from the Bible what the three people from our example were reading. We find Christ presenting himself the Messiah. The religious leaders, however, the very ones who should have been looking for and welcoming the son of God, were instead trying to destroy him. Why and how could that be? Because they had abandoned their love and search for truth, and had replaced it with religion (sectarianism). They loved their glory and station among men rather than the truth Jesus brought them.<sup>y</sup> So... If you are going to read what Jesus said, understanding his Jewish background is helpful to come to know him. It many times helps you understand what he said to people, and why.<sup>(v)</sup> Understanding the truth is easy, actually, if you just keep a simple and open mind.<sup>(c) & (l) & (m)</sup> You need to try to look at the big picture, rather than getting derailed by men as they pick and choose scriptures to mislead you toward following their doctrine. The Jewish religious leaders wanted the people to honor and give glory to them, even while the son of God was in their midst trying to teach them the truth. They were so bold and foolish as to want Jesus to go along with them.<sup>z</sup> He wouldn't ever! Religion hasn't changed since the

days of Jesus. They don't want to hear the truth, they want to teach their doctrines and traditions. You should not go along with their teachings either.

Let's finally read, then, the chapter these three people in our example were reading. After we read it through, we will consider the whole of the chapter and what it means. We read from **Matthew chapter 21** using the Analytical Literal Translation of the Bible: And when they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, (2) saying to them, "Proceed into the village, the *[one]* opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied up and a colt *[or, young donkey]* with her; having untied *[them]*, bring *[them]* to Me. (3) And if anyone says anything to you, you will say, 'The Lord has need of them.' Then immediately he *[will]* send them." (4) Now all this happened that the word spoken through the prophet should be fulfilled, saying, (5) "Say to the daughter of Zion, Look! Your King is coming to you, gentle, and having mounted on a donkey, and a colt, *[the]* son *[or, foal]* of a beast of burden." *[Isaiah 62:11; Zech 9:9]<sup>aa</sup>* (6) So the disciples proceeded, and having done just as Jesus commanded them, (7) brought the donkey and the colt and laid their coats on them, and sat *[Him]* on them *[i.e. on the coats]*. (8) Then the very large crowd spread their own coats on the road, but others began cutting off branches from the trees and began spreading *[them]* on the road. (9) Then the crowds, the ones going in front *[of Him]* and the ones following, began crying out, saying, "'We give praise to You, *[Gr., Hosanna]* to the Son of David *[David was the second and most faithful Jewish king]*! Having been blessed *[is]* the One coming in the name of the LORD *[Jehovah]<sup>(f)</sup>*!' We give

praise to You in the highest!" [Psalm 118:26]<sup>bb</sup> (10) And when He entered into Jerusalem, the entire city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" (11) Then the crowds said, "This is Jesus the prophet, the [One] from Nazareth of Galilee." (12) And Jesus entered into the [Jewish] temple of God and threw out all the ones selling and buying in the temple, and He overturned the tables of the money-changers and the seats of the ones selling the doves. (13) And He says to them, "It has been written, 'My house will be called a house of prayer.' But you made it a 'hideout for robbers!'" [Isaiah 56:7; Jer 7:11]<sup>cc</sup> (14) And lame and blind [people] came to Him in the temple, and He healed them. (15) But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the marvelous [things] which He did, and the children crying out in the temple and saying, "We give praise to You, the Son of David," they were indignant. (16) And they said to Him, "Do You hear what these [persons] are saying?" But Jesus says to them, "Yes, did you never read, 'Out of [the] mouth of young children and nursing infants You prepared praise for Yourself?'" [Psalm 8:2]<sup>dd</sup> (17) And having left them, He went forth outside of the city into Bethany, and spent the night there. (18) But in the early morning returning to the city, He hungered. (19) And having seen a certain fig-tree by the road, He came up to it and found nothing on it except leaves only. And He says to it, "Fruit shall no longer come from you into the age [fig., forever]." And immediately

the fig-tree was withered. (20) And the disciples having seen, were amazed, saying, "How was the fig-tree immediately withered?" (21) But answering, Jesus said to them, "Positively, I say to you, if you are having faith and do not doubt, not only will you perform the *[sign]* of the fig-tree, but even if you say to this mountain, 'Be taken up and be cast into the sea,' it will happen. (22) "And all *[things]*, as much as you ask in the prayer, believing, you will receive." (23) And when He came to the temple, as He was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to Him, saying, "By what authority are You doing these *[things]*? And who gave to You this authority?" (24) But answering, Jesus said to them, "I also will ask you one word *[or, question]*, which if you tell me, I also will tell you by what authority I am doing these *[things]*. (25) "The baptism of John, from where was it? From heaven, or from people?" So they began reasoning among themselves, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' He will say to us, 'Why then did you not believe him?' (26) "But if we say, 'From people,' we fear the crowd, for all hold John as *[or, consider John to be]* a prophet." (27) And answering Jesus, they said, "We do not know." He also said to them, "Neither do I tell you by what authority I am doing these *[things]*. (28) "But what do you think? A man was having two children, and having approached the first *[one]*, he said, 'Child, be going today, be working in my vineyard.' (29) "But answering, he said, 'I will not.' But later, having regretted *[it]*, he went. (30) "And having approached the second *[one]*, he spoke in the same manner. Then answering, he said, 'I *[am going]*, lord,' yet he did not go. (31) "Which of the two did the will of the father?" They say to Him, "The first *[one]*." Jesus says to them, "Positively, I say to you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going before you into the kingdom of God. (32) "For John came to you in *[the]* way of righteousness, and you did not believe him. But the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; but you, having seen, did not regret *[it]* later *[so as]* to believe him. (33) "Be paying attention to another allegory: There was a {certain} man, a landowner, who 'planted a vineyard and put a fence around it and dug in it a

winepress and built a lookout tower' and leased it to vineyard keepers and went on a journey. [Isaiah 5:1,2]<sup>ee</sup> (34) "Then when the season of the fruits drew near, he sent his slaves to the vineyard keepers to receive the fruits of it. (35) "And the vineyard keepers having taken hold of his slaves, one they repeatedly beat, and one they killed, and one they stoned. (36) "Again he sent other slaves, more than the first [ones], and they did to them in the same manner. (37) "So at last he sent to them his son, saying, 'They will respect my son.' (38) "But the vineyard keepers having seen the son, said among themselves, 'This is the heir. Come; let us be killing him, and let us take possession of his inheritance!' (39) "And having taken him, they threw [him] outside of the vineyard and killed [him]. (40) "Therefore, when the lord of the vineyard comes, what will he do to these vineyard keepers?" (41) They say to Him, "Evil [men]! He will severely destroy them, and he will lease the vineyard to other vineyard keepers, who will render to him the fruits in their seasons." (42) Jesus says to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures, 'A stone which the ones building rejected, this [one] has become [the] head of a corner; this happened from the LORD [Jehovah],<sup>(f)</sup> and it is marvelous in our eyes?' [Psalm 118:22,23]<sup>ff</sup> (43) "For this reason I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken from you and will be given to a nation [or, people] yielding its fruits. (44) "And the one falling on this stone will be broken to pieces, but on whomever it falls, it will crush him." (45) And the chief priests and the Pharisees having heard His allegories, knew that He [was] speaking about them. (46) And seeking to take

Him into custody, they were afraid of the crowds, since they were holding Him as [*or, considering Him to be*] a prophet.

If you are able to follow the theme (or thought) of just this one chapter of Matthew, from beginning to end, you are unusual. You should take great satisfaction from that ability, and you should consider it a gift from our heavenly Father. Most of us struggle. So... Let's reconsider this chapter again, breaking it up in little blocks, and then go back and put those blocks together. If you have read the beginning of this booklet, you will understand how this chapter of Matthew starts (in verses 1-7) with Jesus in the process of announcing himself as the Messiah to his fellow Jews: A nation who has been living in expectation of the Messiah.<sup>(v)</sup> To fulfill prophecy, Jesus has his followers gather a young colt no one had ever ridden, and he then rides it into Jerusalem. The people (but not the religious leaders) are excited because of his works and his teachings, and they acknowledge him as the savior promised to come as a descendant of King David.<sup>88</sup> (8-11) ♦ Jesus enters the temple and puts a stop to the greedy money practices being carried on by the religious leaders, as their concern and effort was to take advantage of God's people. The blind and lame come to Jesus in the temple and he heals them. (12-14) ♦ Rather than praising God for the good being done by Jesus, and trying to learn from his example, the self-righteous religious leaders seek to find fault. He explains




(44) She came up behind him and touched the fringe of his garment, and immediately her discharge of blood ceased. (45) And Jesus said, "Who was it that touched me?" When all denied it, Peter said, "Master, the crowds surround you and are pressing in on you!" (46) But Jesus said, "Someone touched me, for I perceive that power has gone out from me." (47) And when the woman saw that she was not hidden, she came trembling, and falling down before him declared in the presence of all the people why she had touched him, and how she had been immediately healed. (48) And he said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace."~

These scriptures teach Jesus's ability to grant us access to his Father such that Jehovah will help us directly. We simply need to learn from Jesus what we can have faith to ask for.~

then proceeded to actually reason among themselves how they would condemn themselves either way if they answered Jesus. Even still, rather than making the simple choice to learn from God's son, they declined to answer. (23-27) ♦ Jesus begins to give them the first of two examples to illustrate their wickedness. Remember, the Jews had been in a covenant relationship with God, as they agreed to obey the commands (the Law Code) He gave them through Moses.<sup>ii</sup> Now, these people God reached out to are about to kill the son He sent to help them. The first illustration Jesus gives is about a man with two sons. The one says he will do a thing asked him by his father, and then doesn't. (The Jews were in a covenant relationship with God, having promised to do what he said.)<sup>jj</sup> The second says he won't, but then does. John came announcing Jesus as the Messiah and the religious leaders refused to believe. The sinners believed, however, and will be looked on more favorably than the rebellious Jews. (28-32) ♦ The second illustration is about a man who built a vineyard and went away, assigning people to care for it. He sends his messengers (the prophets) and finally his

own son to his caretakers. They kill them all. Next, Jesus asks the Jews what should be done with those unfaithful caretakers. They should be killed, is the reply. Thus, they condemn themselves. Jesus is the stone the builders rejected (the Jews rejected), and anyone who chooses to fall on that stone will be broken and will heal themselves by their faith what Jesus taught. Those upon whom the stone falls, however, will be destroyed. The kingdom will be taken from the unfaithful Jews and given to a nation producing the fruits entrusted to them. (Those individuals expressing faith in the teachings of Jesus comprise that new and faithful nation.) Realizing Jesus's illustrations were about them, but again refusing to learn from him, the stone hearted religious leaders continue seeking to destroy him. They had no fear of God, but rather chose to fear the people. (33-42) ♦

Using what we have considered, let's summarize this chapter. Very briefly, Jesus appears to the people as the long anticipated Messiah. He has brought truth to set them free of the hypocrisy and lies of false religious teachers.<sup>kk</sup> The common people love him, but the proud religious leaders refuse to learn the truth, and instead seek to kill him. Now, with that overview in mind, go back and read the Matthew 21 again (Page 17). Do you see how the whole of the chapter now starts to blend together as you attempt to follow it through, and how you begin to grasp it as a whole? That is the only method by which you can learn and understand what Jesus taught. Picking and choosing scriptures here and there will not help you know Christ. If you do what we just did, with each chapter of Matthew, you will soon have your own overview of each chapter. And, piecing your knowledge of each chapter together, you will start to grasp the whole of the book of Matthew. Only then will you know Christ. If you put forth the effort to do that with all

Remember: Everyone who teaches anything beyond what Jesus Christ taught, even if they use his name to do so, are actually followers of God's enemy.<sup>oo</sup> Even if they mean well, if they teach lies, let them be accursed.<sup>pp</sup> Jesus over and over warned us about them.<sup>qq</sup> Religionists want to make

up rules for you to live by.<sup>rr</sup> They don't follow their own rules,<sup>ss</sup> of course, but they try and convince you that you must do so; always asserting obedience to them is the only way you can please God.<sup>tt</sup>

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<sup>rr</sup> Colossians 2:20-23 MWT If you have died with Christ to the world's way of doing things, why do you let others tell you how to live? It's as though you were not set free by Christ<sup>(kk)</sup> and are still under the world's influence. (21) People tell you, "Don't handle this! Don't taste or touch that! Dress this way and don't wear that!" (22) All of these things deal with objects that are only being used up and consumed anyway. (23) These practices look like wisdom with their self-imposed worship, false humility, and harsh treatment of the body. Religious leaders also try and convince you the Bible is hard for you to understand. They do that to deceive you into believing you need them to explain or interpret the Bible for you. Jesus's teachings are all we need.<sup>(1)</sup> Become familiar with the barely fifty pages in each of the four Gospel accounts recording what Jesus taught. How easy our God has made it! There is so-o-o much to learn from those four Gospels.

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hard to carry [*unscriptural teachings*], yet they aren't willing even to lift a finger to help them carry those loads. (5) They do everything they do to be noticed by people. Look at the fancy things they wear. The straps with scripture verses on them which they wear on their foreheads and arms, and notice how large they make them! Notice also how long are the tassels on their cloaks! (6) They love the best places at feasts and the reserved seats in the synagogues; (7) they love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to have people call them 'Teacher [*or reverend, or elder, or deacon*].' (8) You must not be called 'Teacher,' because you are all equal and have only one Teacher. (9) And you must not call anyone here on earth 'Father,' because you have only the one Father in heaven. (10) Nor should you allow yourself to be called 'Leader,' because your one and only leader is the Messiah [*or Christ*]. (11) The greatest one among you must be your servant. You sail the seas and cross whole countries to win one convert; and when you succeed, you make him twice as much a subject of Gehenna as you yourselves are!

The easiest and most meaningful way to examine whether you are a true student of Jesus Christ is to consider if you are a good neighbor.<sup>uu</sup> How you treat other people is the true manifestation of who and what you are. It is not reflected in how you treat those who are close to you, or in how you treat people when you are in a good mood. It's how you treat everyone you come in contact with, day in and day out, every day. You can't hide it, pretend it, force it, or excuse it! A young man came to Jesus and asked him what the most important commandment was. Jesus told him to love God

(9) And Jesus continued, "You have a clever way of rejecting God's law in order to uphold your own teaching.~

Jesus do, of course, still comprise a group. It is the most wonderful group of people who have ever lived.<sup>ccc</sup> The true followers of Christ are not, however, formed or approved (judged) by men. We can never really know if those around us are Christians (are actually in that group), or only pretending to be.<sup>(ll)</sup> We don't need to try and

judge who is righteous.<sup>ddd</sup> All we need concern ourselves with is whether we are in that group!<sup>(ccc)</sup> If we are, it is because we have determined to have only one leader and teacher.<sup>(tt)</sup> It is our own personal faith in the teachings of Jesus Christ that defines us to be part of the group he started.<sup>eee</sup> It is only our faith in the promises from the Bible that have power to preserve us alive.<sup>fff</sup> As you have

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<sup>ddd</sup> John 3:16-21 BBE For God had such love for the world that he gave his only Son, so that whoever has faith in him may not come to destruction but have eternal life. (17) God did not send his Son into the world to be judge of the world; he sent him so that the world might have salvation through him. (18) The man who has faith in him does not come up to be judged; but he who has no faith in him has been judged even now, because he has no faith in the name of the only Son of God. 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one shall live by faith, and if he shrinks back, my soul has no pleasure in him." (39) But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who have faith and preserve their souls *[alive]*.

<sup>egg</sup> Job 33:17-30 GNB God speaks to make them stop their sinning and to save them from becoming proud. (18) He will not let them be destroyed; he saves them from death itself. (19) God corrects us by sending sickness and filling our bodies with pain. (20) Those who are sick lose their appetites, and even the finest food looks revolting. (21) Their bodies waste away to nothing; you can see all their bones; (22) they are about to go to the world of the dead. (23) Perhaps an angel may come to their aid--- one of God's thousands of angels, who remind us of our duty. (24) In mercy the angel will say, "Release them! They are not to go down to the world of the dead. Here is the ransom to set them free." (25) Their bodies will grow young and strong again; (26) when they pray, God will answer; they will worship God with joy; God will set things right for them again. 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believe Jesus's promises? Jesus said those alive when he returned (Bible prophecy indicates that is happening in our day in time), and who had faith, would never die at all.<sup>iii</sup> Do you believe Jesus's promise? Do you start to grasp what having faith in his promises can mean for *you*?<sup>(hh)</sup>

God is loving and kind and good.<sup>jjj</sup> Our first parents disobeyed God, and many of us have continued in their path. Jehovah has patiently allowed our bad course, so we would each one have a chance for life, and so his creation could see the damage that results from not following his counsel. Some of us recognize the problem, and some seem determined to remain head strong, self-willed and disobedient, to the bitter end. If such hateful people were left to

continue alive, they would kill us all.<sup>(ll)</sup> These conditions, brought about by our first parent's disobedience, amount to the spiritual war that rages between those who are righteously inclined and those who love badness.<sup>(x)</sup> If you try to express loving concern for others, you most likely don't feel like you fit in among many of the people of this world. You can never really feel loved and cared for. That is because people who are not looking for God have no concept of what love is.<sup>(xx)</sup> They think they do, of course, but they don't. They only care about using others to make themselves happy in some way; and then they imagine that to be love. Righteous people sense that, and can never be truly happy amidst such hateful conditions and people.<sup>kkk</sup> Our current world conditions are the proof to that obvious truth. There is, however, happiness to be found.<sup>(n)</sup> God holds out hope for us all through our faith in the son He sent. God sent Jesus to help us understand why the world is the way it is, as well as to explain the solution God had recorded for us in the Bible. By our choice to exercise faith in the son of God, we each one judge our-own-self as to whether we live or die.<sup>lll</sup> Those of

us alive in this time of the revelation and restoration, will simply keep on living based on our faith in God's promises that we can do so.<sup>(iii)</sup> Those without faith will continue in their self-willed course to death.<sup>mmm</sup> As for those who have already died, they will be resurrected and given the same choice<sup>nnn</sup> and chance for life that we all have set before us. The only choice you need consider is whether you believe what Jesus Christ said.<sup>ooo</sup> That choice is the single most important thing in life.<sup>ppp</sup> Read the four short Gospel

<sup>nnn</sup> John 5:29 GW and they will come out of their tombs. Those who have done good will come back to life and live. But those who have done evil will come back to life and will be judged. (Jesus asked his father to forgive those who killed him because they didn't know what they were doing.\*<sup>6</sup> They were ignorant of truth. People who practiced badness but were ignorant will be resurrected and taught the truth and then judged according to their response, just like we all are.)~
