
## The Your War!

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#### You are fully embroiled in an ongoing war! (Eph 6:10-20)

There is no escape and no one is exempt. (Ecc 8:8) If you imagine you are not involved, it probably means you have chosen the wrong side. While the war I speak of is being fought (to begin with) in the hearts and minds of men and women, (Luke 2:29-35) it is manifest and clearly visible in the actions of humankind; and, in God's actions toward the wicked. (Rom 1:18 of 1:18-2:2) Christ has ridden forth from heaven on the pages of the Bible, using the words from his mouth as a sword to destroy the enemies of truth; (Rev 19:11-16; Rev 2:16) the beliefs of those attacking truth being consumed in the light of the words Jesus's Father taught him, and which he now teaches us. (John 12:48-50) Everyone who has heard Christ's words and chosen to listen, must (in these latter days) become active in telling others about God and his son. (Pro 30:4; 1 Cor 15:34 Rom 15:20-21) Speaking about Christ is the reveal of whose side we have chosen in this, mankind's last and final war. (Print this little booklet [using Adobe Reader] and gift it to everyone you know!)

### We have reached the full limit of the appointed times!

(Eph 1:9-10 of 2-14) You are being gathered by God, or, you are choosing not to be. That is your only choice! You have heard God's command (Mat 17:5) and are building a real and protecting faith in the words of his Christ, or, you are not... (John 12:44-50; John 3:18-19)

If you are kind hearted, and so terrified by what you see happening in today's world, this booklet can help. If you are a kind hearted person living in the danger zone near a border between nations (such as, right now [Jan, 2022], in Russia or Ukraine or the US – Mexico border), this Bible knowledge is for you. If you are a kind hearted white person living in a largely black neighborhood, such that you are terrified to go out at night (or even to be inside your own home at night), this is for you. If you're a member of any race who is capable of hearing Christ, and you have chosen to have true faith in his words (Mark 4:10-11; Mat 13:10-17) but have to fear other humans because of your ethnicity, it's for you. If you live in a nation where gangs have taken control and/or threaten your safety (and that seems most all of them today), this is for you. (Acts 3:19 of 19-26) If you are terrified by the accepted tolerated resistance to law and order, which only escalates attacks on law keepers while it continues

to break down society (as spineless or complicit politicians pretend it isn't happening), you need to and should know what God has promised. (Isa 5:20-23) This Bible knowledge is for all righteously inclined persons caught homeless and neglected, for those being physically or sexually or emotionally abused, for those forced from youth to practice ways of life they abhor, and on and on... The list is nearly without end of people living in distress because of the terrors from this wicked world – living in fear of the few problems herein mentioned (along with oh so many others - all of them a part of the tribulation of these last days). Our old world system and society is failing in so many ways, causing people to suffer loss and even die; yet in the midst of it all, many are willing to riot and protest or to go on strike to destroy or harm even what remains. The killing of all such unrepentant troublemakers by God is our only solution or hope. (Psa 58:1-11) Every single righteous person will understand and remember that simple truth going forward and forever.

If you are a person "sighing and groaning" over the terrible things you see happening to this world (Eze 9:4; Acts 3:19 of 19-26), this Bible truth is for you. Please don't imagine I highlight these problems suggesting you should or even can make it better. Taking sides on any of these issues (the issues dividing destroying mankind) only puts you in the midst of wrongdoers. Rather, you need to realize the wonderful work God is doing in the midst of it all. Again, since it is God's work, (2 Chron 20:17a) you don't have to join with any of the (polarized troublemaking) groups of this world; you only need (and you must only) follow Christ. You should actually separate yourself from all the divisive organizations comprising this world. (Rev 18:4 of 1-8) All the people who are members of one of this world's factions, and so, are actually causing or adding to our problems. Each one has what they consider excellent reasons for whatever stand they have taken; and so, each one is righteous in their own conscience. (Pro 3:7; Job 32:1) The most dangerous, of course, are those united in imagining their sect is made up of the true servants of God; his "only true" servants many of them believe. Such groups imagine themselves the most "right" of all. Then, in addition to such religious fanatics, the other self-righteous groups are endless: The group that doesn't believe they should be forced to wear a Covid mask, for example, are convinced they are right; while the group believing everyone should commonsenseically wear a mask,

they are also right (each one in their own mind and heart). (Pro 12:15; Deu 12:8) The terrible fact that some individuals in both groups are so convinced of their own righteous stand (are so radicalized), they are willing to kill or harm those who disagree with them (physically or judgmentally [emotionally]), well, that is most terrifying. That's the dangerous thing you need to avoid becoming part of: You must avoid joining any of the religions or sects or races forming the groups actually dividing humankind. While joining any of them only makes you another part of our problem, do not fear. You can find relief in Christ's words; helping you understand why you are caught up in this war in the first place. Also, Jesus taught us what you need to do to stay alive. I believe we witness the time of the destruction by God of all that are wicked... (Psa 37:27-40; Psa 58:10-11)

As I heard one person say in a somewhat crude (but accurate) way, "all of mankind is floating in a giant toilet bowl," one that has already started to swirl. It's not a clean toilet either. It's full of every vile thing you can think of. God's vengeance is now being revealed among the practicers of badness. (Rom 1:18 of 18-32) If you long for peace under the rule of Christ, (Rom 5:20-21 of 12-21) you likely appreciate how ancient Lot felt, while he was forced to live (for a time) among a law defying people. (2 Pet 2:7-9 of 1-13) Even after being blinded by God, Lot's wicked neighbors were "wearing themselves out" continuing to seek badness. (Gen 19:6-11) God set Lot free! Similar to Lot's day, (Luke 17:22-30) people today are so vile they don't just want to practice their chosen forms of badness, they want the rest of us to approve their wickedness; to assure them it's OK. (Rom 1:32 of 28-32) They should be warned it would prove absolutely useless to them if every person alive approved their depravity. God is who they have to worry about, and, He sent Jesus to give us knowledge that makes us all accountable! (Heb 4:12-13; Rom 1:18-23) Those choosing badness are thus without excuse! Please ponder my words because if they are true, it is going to get very bad very quickly for those choosing to ignore Christ. (1 Thes 5:3 of 1-9; Ps 37-10)

Why the war? Well, that's mankind's oldest story, right? You have surely heard some of the many different ideas about it; and probably, many times. Have you, though, taken time to consider the details? By "details," I mean the real explanation of what we see happening in

today's world; the explanation that comes only from the Bible? Be warned: If you imagine you have gotten to know Bible truth by being involved in some human religious sect, you likely haven't heard God's truth at all... (Mat 7:15) No matter how much Bible truth a religious sect weaves into their doctrine (a mixture of what the Bible actually teaches and human reasoning - Mat 16:8 of 5-12), if they fail the simple test of directing people only to Christ for spiritual food, (Mat 17:5) they are demon worshippers. If they have people they refer to as brothers of Christ, or stand-ins for him, you must know that is bad... (Mat 23:1-15) Whatever lies you might have previously heard, please now consider a brief overview of mankind's history as explained by the Bible: Humanity's first parents made the free will choice to rebel against our Creator. (Gen 3:1-15) The results of their transgression are displayed in (or by) the world we witness today; as we must live in the world our sin has created. That rebellion by Adam and Eve took place about 6000 years ago and humanity has been suffering ever since. (Rom 8:20-22) If there is a Creator who is both good and powerful, many ask, why has he tolerated all this suffering for these 60 centuries? The answer is both simple and complex: What I mean by that seeming contradiction is the solution is complex in all its moving parts, but very simple if you put forth a little effort to understand (what the Bible actually teaches). When Adam and Eve followed Satan to rebel against God, just putting a stop to them could have been fast. God could simply have killed the rebels instantly. There are, however, some problems with that solution: One problem for us is none of us, since we are all descendants of Adam and Eve, were yet born. God could have built new humans, or course, but all his works are perfect, including mankind. Being perfect means He never has to redo anything. So, if He had started fresh by recreating mankind, would that have indicated there was something wrong with his Creation? Also very important to us, would you and I even be here? The new race He created would be, but not you and me. We are descendants of Adam. Second problem with quickly destroying the rebels: What would keep these same terrible problems from coming up yet again, at some future date, by other humans who would once again choose to sin against the direction of our Father? Remember, we all remain free moral agents; meaning we have the ability to choose, and then to do what is right, or wrong. (Some people are determined to imagine they can steal "the right to choose for themselves" what is right and wrong, as they dismiss the Bible as

foolishness. No one can steal the ability or power to choose what is right and wrong. The world and the tribulation we have created provide the obvious demonstration of why.) So... How can God recreate a paradise (like Eden) where his free sons and daughters can live forever; (Isa 11:1-12; Psa 37:29) without having to worry someone will once again abuse their precious gift of freedom (to again cause harm)? The hindsight answer is now simple, really: Just allow time to help everyone see and understand the importance of absolute obedience to our Grand Creator. In other words, give everyone the chance to really decide who they want to serve; while or after they also come to understand why. That is what the previous 6000 years of created humanity's existence has been about: Everyone is being given the chance to decide if they want to follow Satan and Adam and Eve (or any other humans), or, if we are going to follow Christ. That's the only two options! The value of your life, then, is manifest in (or by) your choosing to follow Jesus; or, in your choice to follow anyone else. Remember too... God isn't actually killing anyone in one sense; because this wicked world would soon destroy everyone if God didn't step in to help us using his Christ. (Mat 24:21-22)

Another, and most important facet of our 6000 years of existence, then: The birth of Jesus Christ. Right after Adam and Eve sinned, God promised he would raise up a deliverer who would crush Satan's head. (Gen 3:15; 1 John 3:8b) About 2000 years after Eden, God revisited that promise when He told the righteous man Abraham the earlier prophesied deliverer (the promised "seed of the woman") would be one of Abraham's descendants. (Gen 22:18) Then, another 2000 years, and Jesus was born as the seed of Abraham; as the seed of the woman, of course; and also, as God's son. (John 1:34 of 29-34) Now, yet a third 2000 years have passed since mankind killed the son of God, and you and I are witness to the second coming (or return) of Christ. So, you ask, what difference has this whole thing made, really? What have these 6000 years, with so much suffering, accomplished? Why was it necessary? The answer is easy! It has provided mankind time to gain knowledge as a basis for understanding our need to make our "one" choice; the choice to follow Christ in obedience to our Father (and Creator). This 6000 year history will serve as an eternal touchstone proving our absolute need to follow our God without question or reservation. Why? Because everything God does is perfect. That means there is no room for any

improvement to God's rule in any way: Mankind has been given time to try every conceivable form of human government. They have all failed. We have tried all our plans and ideas, which have only produced hate along with the polluted world and tribulation we are living surviving in. We have created a world so bad it would soon kill us all, if God didn't intervene. (Mat 24:21-22) He soon will... (Pro 21:18; Psa 58; Hosea 10:4-8) Another thing Jesus did: He came to become the ransom sacrifice for the sins of all repentant humankind. (Acts 3:19 of 19-26) Since God is perfect and can touch nothing unclean, (Jas 4:8; Dan 12:10; Lev 11:44-45) Christ serves as the mediator between us. (1 Tim 2:3-6) We are sinful and horrible, but when God sees us reflected in our faith in Christ, we appear clean. (2 Cor 3:12-18) Then, as we become intimately familiar with the sayings of God's son, so familiar his words become a part of us, we don't just appear clean, we are transformed by Christ's sayings (changed by God's spirit - John 6:63) into a new Creation: We are returning (being born again) to perfection. (2 Cor 5:17; John 3:3 of 1-8; Gal 6:12-16; Eph 1:8-10) To put an end of all badness so as to restore paradise, however, does first require God destroy all those who are making it bad; or transform them if possible. The problem is, even God can't make a person good (force them to be good) and still allow them the cherished freedom as his sons and daughters. (Rom 8:21 of 18-22) A robot that says I love you has no meaning. A child that says it, however, because it is true, can mean everything! So, each person who is God's friend (Isa 41:8) must choose righteous obedience for themselves. Every single one of us who will live must make that same choice! And, making that choice is our purpose and is for sure what we are all doing. That's why God has patiently tolerated humankind's 6000 year growth, even in our imperfection. (Rom 9:22 of 19-26) It's really all very simple: We are each one choosing to obey our Father's command to follow Christ, (Mat 17:5) or, we are choosing to follow someone else. (John 3:19) It doesn't matter who that someone else is! What is the benefit gained by having that knowledge and warning? You can realize you must never follow any of the many religious sects or governments or races or gangs; any of those being exalted by some as the solution to our problems. They have all become so polarized (radicalized), you can't join any of them without also joining in (taking responsibility for) their hate. (Religionists who imagine they can judge those who don't agree with them as lost to God are displaying the worst kind of hate.) You must not follow anyone

teaching anything beyond your need to simply listen to Christ. (2 John 1:9-11; 1 Cor 4:6) No matter what good intentions such people may have, they're all headed to destruction; and ignorantly trying to lead you there.

It can be a little scary to guit following other humans, as you stand on your own two feet to become a Christian; doing so by following Jesus alone. The question is: Do you really believe God can protect you while you refuse to join (or choose to abandon) the sects of this world? A few years ago, some terrorist group herded a group of 40 or 50 people into a field and shot them down. Two brothers were wounded and fell among the dead. Later, they got up and went on with life; those two brothers being the only survivors. Did God protect them? I certainly wouldn't presume to render that judgment, but maybe... The short Bible book of Esther records one of many accounts where God did preserve those he loved, against seeming certain death. And, it shows his protection was sometimes for family groups, probably because of their shared familial love for God. (Pro 13:20; 1 Cor 15:33-34) The Bible recounts, for example, God protected Rahab along with her father's household. (Josh 6:1-27 of 2:1-6:27) Question then: What do you really and actually believe will prove to be your protection? God can preserve alive who he loves; and, I believe, we are now living in the time He is going to start (or has already started) doing exactly that. (Job 33:13-30)

Soon, this final war will be over. (Rev 19:19 & 16:16) While the world is full of people promising this religion or that religion can help (or this sect or race or gang will help you), don't be fooled by any of them. Just remember, as you contemplate your part in this war (and you do have a part in it), it is really easy to identify who is upright: Those who teach just and only what Christ taught, by directing you to listen to God's son for your own self, they are trying to help. If anyone is directing you to their sect, or to anyone or anything besides the words of Christ, you can know they are false prophets and workers of lawlessness. (Mat 7:15-16 of 13-23) You can always depend on people, and only on those people, who direct you to read the words of Jesus for yourself. (2 John 1:9-11) That means the only way "you" can teach others what Christ taught is to direct them to read his words for themselves (Christ's words found only in the Gospels by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John). That is because Jesus very

plainly warned you are not God's appointed teacher. (Mat 23:8-10 of 1-15) You and I are just learning, which means we no doubt remain confused about many points. We're all just reaching our arms of faith out to Christ, from our giant toilet bowl. Jesus, however, was never stained by it. Direct everyone to hear (read) Christ for themselves: Then, whether they (we) actually listen to and obey Christ forms or is the basis of our judgment; of ourselves. (John 3:19 of 14-21) If you have elevated a religious (or other) sect of men to lead you, can you still imagine you are a follower of Christ? If you follow a doctrine of men, doesn't that really mean you remain a worker of lawlessness? (Mat 7:21-23)

No judgment by us! While I speak about the danger posed by religious people and their sects, there is one good thing about my faith: I don't feel any need to judge any of them. I just do my best to tell what Jesus said, and people judge themselves by their response to his words (including you and me). When people speak what they believe in the name of Jesus, they are likely taking responsibility for what they assert. What business could I have in that? I don't believe most religious people are bad, just misled to believe they are listening to Christ. (Mat 7:21-23) Most think they are doing good. Religious people have been led to some doctrine of faith, and once joined to it, feel the need to justify it. They get hooked on a course with other people, all trying to persuade others to join "them." At that point, they seem to stop directing people to Christ, but to their group! I really do know, however, I'm not a judge. So... If you are in a group who really is directing people to Christ, rather than to group membership, God's blessings upon you! Just be very careful, group membership brings responsibility for Group activities. (Jos 7:10-26)

This amounts, then, to a thumbnail sketch of my faith... (See: JustBibleTruth.com/WhatNow.pdf) Is my understanding correct, though? Is my faith based in what is real, or just on what I have fantasized? I hope I am right, of course. I pray I am. I believe I am. (Well, I try to believe I am...) But am I, am I really right? That's the thing about faith, you see: We all build it, and then, we all wait to find out if ours is based in truth. That's what I await. Whether you choose to acknowledge or not, that's what you await as well. You do have faith in something, even if it's just in yourself. All any of us can do, really, is decide what our

own personal faith is; and all the while, if we are wise, being cautious "our faith" is based on the words of Christ. In my case, if it's just my own reasoning that got me here, I have certainly painted myself into a perfect corner. (1 Cor 15:19) It's not just me, though. My hope fits in both me and you and every person who has lived. We've all had our part. I am not aware of any scripture that contradicts doesn't support my faith. (If you know scriptures that contradict my hope, please tell me. – support@justbibletruth.com; 270-343-2030) There are no loopholes in what I believe, and there is no way to escape. (Ecc 8:8) That's the thing that convinces me, actually, what I believe is true: The things I believe are just too perfect and wonderful for humans to have dreamt up. (Acts 17:29-31) Also, my faith provides a perfect and eternal solution to all mankind's problems. What other solution could there possibly be? The everlasting memory of the history of these first 6000 years of created humankind should keep any sane person from ever again rebelling against our Heavenly Father; in even the tiniest way. Knowledge of how He dealt with the sins of our first parents, as well as those of ourselves; along with seeing how He recreated (or rescued) paradise from the terrible world we turned his creation into, should make each of us love him with all our heart. That's our only real choice! And, well, that's also our judgment... (John 3:19) Our terrible world conditions provide a theater causing or allowing people to both decide and then to display if they are good or bad. We see some Russian troops backing up huge vehicles to avoid running over Ukrainian civilians. We also see proof others rape and loot and torture and murder people, including little children, all without compassion. Make no mistake: God is watching! He sees everything; not only what small percentage we see. Hateful actions show they don't know Christ, and from the basis of their judgment. (John 3:19-21 of 16-21) God will repay each one according to their deeds; including you and I... (Mat 16:27; Luke 21:22-28; Heb 10:30-31; Rom 12:17-19; Deu 32:35) In Luke 12:32 (cover) Jesus said he came to bring his Father's kingdom. He said that would happen when things got so bad all life would be destroyed without the kingdom's intervention. (Mat 24:21-22) He also said his followers should be happy when we realize it is time. (Luke 21:28) Rejoice... That time seems now!

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"All who come to God believe he exists and is good." Heb 11:6

While I have and do encourage you (and everyone alive) to abandon all forms of religion (along with all other groups lyingly asserting you must join them to do good), that doesn't mean I am suggesting you be alone. (Heb 10:24-25) Nor do I suggest you break any laws or refuse to support your nation. (Rom 13:1; Mat 22:21) What I always rather do suggest, to everyone, is simply to follow the sayings of Christ. If you do that, you are set free and will have many friends who also love Jesus and his Father. (John 8:31-32) One thing to keep close: You can't ever know who Christians are! That is because those who actually do know Christ call themselves Christian. (Acts 11:26) At the same time, those who think they know him but are really **Doeg** followers of some religious sect, also assert they are, well, Christians. And, according to Jesus, some of them sincerely believe. (Mat 7:23 of 21-23) Their problem: They aren't really listening to Christ? In those same verses Jesus said many proclaiming faith in him are wrong! Of course, you can easily identify who is directing others to Christ, as well as who is producing bad fruit by directing them to their sect of men. Danger though, that still doesn't tell you if they are good or bad or still learning. Since we are all just acquiring knowledge and understanding, God must be the only judge of who is pleasing to him. You can freely associate (so as to talk about Jesus) with everyone who sincerely wants to consider what God's son said. What you must never do, however, is imagine you can form a group made up of those who are "true Christians." That's what all these churches have done! Once armed with such arrogance and selfrighteousness, they feel free to judge that everyone who has seen the light so as to join them is pleasing God; and, of course, those of us who don't follow them are lost. (Mark 9:38-40) That is the most hateful judgment you can render another: If you can be deceived to imagine you and/or your colleagues can judge who is disapproved by God. (Luke 6:37-38) That hate (judgment) has caused most wars. It continues to alienate people (Pro 16:28) and destroy relationships and families.
