(And the Theme of the Bible)

Made Simple

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But the path of the righteous ones is like the bright light that is getting lighter and lighter until the day is firmly established. - Pro 4:18

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Becoming God's friend is a natural thing. God is looking for those who are looking for him. (2 Chron 16:9 - 1890 Darby Translation) "For the eyes of Jehovah run to and fro through the whole earth, to shew himself strong in the behalf of those whose heart is perfect toward him..." God directs those looking for Him to the teachings of his son Jesus: (John 6:44 - Literal Version) No one is able to come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him..." Jesus then teaches us who God is: (Mat 11:27 – Contemporary English Translation) "...The only one who truly knows the Father is the Son. But the Son wants to tell others about the Father, so that they can know him too."

Picking up the Bible to study can seem overwhelming, what with it containing nearly 2000 pages. However, the first 1200 or so pages are the Hebrew Scriptures or The Old Testament. They exist largely to introduce a promised Messiah, and to illustrate our need for him. Next, we find the four short books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, containing about 40 pages each. They are parallel accounts of the earthly teachings of God's Son, the promised Messiah! The Bible books that follow those four Gospel accounts contain some prophecy, along with the documented efforts of early Christians to apply the teachings of Jesus.

If you are one whom God is drawing to his Son, you should take special note of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. As Jesus himself said, he came to make his Father known to us: (John 17:6 – Good News Bible) "I have made you known to those you gave me out of the world." (John 18:37 - 1890 Darby Translation) "...I have been born for this, and for this I have come into the world, that I might bear witness to the truth."

Clearly understanding just one of those Gospels, then, can help you know our Creator and his Son. It means your very life! As Jesus himself said: (John 17:3 — Analytical-Literal Transferse "Now this is eternal life: that they shall be knowing You, the only true God, and Jesus Christe whom You sent."

If you understand the book of John and, therefore, the theme of the Bible, you can answer these questions: (Pro 30:4 – Modern King James Version) "Who has gone up *to* Heaven and has come down? Who has gathered the wind in His fists? Who has bound the waters in *His* garments? Who has established all the ends of the earth? What *is* His name, and what *is* His Son's name? Surely you know.

Most scholars agree the original Greek text of this book was written by John, the son of Zebedee. [Mr 1:19¹] It is believed to have been completed about 98 CE, when John would have been over eighty years old. By that time, he had many years to reflect on, and to comprehend, what he had heard and witnessed in the presence of Christ Jesus some sixty-odd years before. God used his Spirit to help John convey that knowledge to us² in John's account of the life and work of Jesus Christ.

This is the "Modern World Translation"© of the Bible book of John. It is not a strict translation of the original text. Rather, the literal translation was compared and tempered with the recognized works of over twenty other translators and/or translation committees. The clearest understanding gleaned from those works is then offered as *The Modern*

(John 15:26-27) It is a gift to each person who seeks truth by following Jesus. They simply put forth the effort to read Jesus's words, and are able to understand what he taught us. Jesus's words are foolishness to those who don't love truth. (2 Thessalonians 2:9-10 ESV (9) The coming of the lawless one is by the activity of Satan with all power and false signs and wonders,(10) and with all wicked deception for those who are perishing, because they refused to love the truth and so be saved.) (1 Corinthians 1:18 GNB (18) For the message about Christ's death on the cross is nonsense to those who are being lost; but for us who are being saved it is God's power.)]

World Translation. Comparative selection from those works is weighted first by harmony with the rest of John and the other three Gospels, and then by consensus among the translations considered.

Some individuals may not appreciate the MWT, because it highlights a logical comparison between modern day religious leaders and the hypocritical religious leaders³ of ancient Judaism, the men Jesus contended with who were responsible for putting him to death. Many will assert no such comparison is valid because the men who killed our lord were not Christian, as many of these modern religious leaders claim to be.

Jesus was born a Jew; he was educated in the Jewish religious law and customs. He kept the Jewish religious festivals right up to the night of his death. During his ministry, he supported much of what he taught using the Old Testament record, often by saying "have you not read," or "again it is written" as he quoted from or cited those Hebrew Scriptures. Jesus came as the promised Jewish Messiah to fulfill the Law Code, and to replace, complete, or extend the Law Code and Judaism into the birth of Christianity. Jesus opened the way to eternal life for both Jews and Gentiles, to all persons who would put their faith in him as God's son. [Joh 10:1-18] Everything Jesus did was in accord with Jewish Messianic prophecy.

In presenting this Modern World Translation, we distinguish ourselves as different from other religious entities: We highlight your personal need to learn what Jesus taught... your need to learn it FOR YOURSELF!

³ (Matthew 3:7-10) ⁷ When he caught sight of many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to the baptism, he said to them: "You offspring of vipers, who has intimated to you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸ So then produce fruit that befits repentance; ⁹ and do not presume to say to yourselves, 'As a father we have Abraham.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these stones. ¹⁰ Already the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree, then, that does not produce fine fruit is to be cut down and thrown into the fire.

Mankind has been misguided, viewing religion as being our need to identify and then join with and be approved by the "right religious group." Most of these groups then proudly view themselves as Christian, view their members as the chosen among mankind, view outsiders as lesser people (as those not having the truth), and in many cases, as unworthy of life.

True Christians are not judges of others. [justbibletruth.com/Judgment.html]

Christians simply join the followers Jesus started gathering about 2000 years ago. They do so individually, in the innermost person of their heart, and no man or group holds that membership! [Jam 1:22-25⁴] Individuals join other followers of Christ simply by learning and trying to make use of what Jesus taught. Worshiping God as a group does not work! Group worship can never work because of individual free choice and responsibility. Please understand, Judaism was an organizational or group form of worship, but Jesus came to change that. The Jews had a national binding agreement with God, and they were responsible as a group. [Ex 19:7-9⁵] When one sinned, they were all

responsible. [Joshua:12-26⁶] Under the Christian arrangement, each person becomes responsible for his or her own actions. Men no longer

have other men to intercede with God for them, men who can then approve or condemn their worship. Jesus has become our one and only mediator. [1 Tim 2:5⁷] Jesus taught he was replacing the formalized group worship, supported and approved by the leaders of those various groups. He was replacing it by worship born from a spirit of truth (or out of a heart seeking truth). Each Christian thus becomes responsible before God based on that person's knowledge of truth. [John 4:19-21 & 23-26] Jesus's followers then taught how easy it is to gain that Bible knowledge.

It now falls to you, individually and personally, to have a relationship with God through your faith in his son Christ Jesus. That means, however, you must first learn what Jesus said because your faith must be based on what you personally know he taught. Be very careful about believing what people say Jesus taught! [Please consider "Do you know Jesus" - page 85.] This Modern World Translation of the Bible book of John will help you easily attain personal knowledge of Jesus's teachings. Most complete Bibles contain nearly 2,000 pages, which can be intimidating to

consider studying. Remember, the Bible is comprised of sixty-six individual books. The first thirty-nine are known as the Old Testament, or Hebrew Scriptures. They contain the first 1200 or so pages. The OT explains in the first three or four pages how mankind lost favor with God by rebelling against Him. It then explains how God immediately promised to raise up a seed from the woman who would crush Satan's head, and would bless her seed. Genesis 3:158 is the first Messianic promise. The balance of the Old Testament expands on knowledge of that promised seed, providing many prophecies about the coming Messiah.

Next in the Bible, we find the four short books of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. They are known as the Gospels, and are the first four books of what is known as the Christian Greek Scriptures, or the New Testament. They are four parallel accounts of the appearance of that Messiah promised in the Old Testament, giving the teachings Jesus came to provide us. The twenty-three books that follow Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John contain some additional prophecy, along with the accounts of the early followers of Christ Jesus as they tried to apply his teachings. What does all that mean for you? It means YOU can learn what Jesus taught, and understand the theme of the Bible, just by gaining a clear understanding of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. All four books together total only a little over 100 pages, or about 5 percent of the Bible. The forty or so pages of just one of the Gospels can gain you a good understanding of Jesus's teachings. That is our point, and that is what you need: your own personal understanding of what Christ Jesus taught! Please realize: No relationship or membership with any man or group can benefit you, except as they might be able to help you understand the Bible. If any group has led you to imagine a membership

in their crew is a sign you have attained your goal to become a Christian, they likely are not trying, or are not able, to help you!

Please use this Modern World Translation of the Bible Book of John to help you look in on Christ Jesus as he presents himself as the Messiah mankind has looked for since the Garden of Eden, [Joh 10:24-25; Joh 4:25-26] as the son of God, [Joh 1:34] and as the one sent by God to provide eternal life to all who will accept that gift. Men and women demonstrate they accept God's gift simply by having faith in Christ. [Joh 10:1-18] Jesus came to break up the works of the devil.9

As you consider John's account of Jesus's teachings, please take note of the thread of warning that runs throughout, the warning about false Christians and hypocritical religious leaders. That warning can help us understand and distinguish between "religion" and Christianity.

Modern day religion has utterly and completely failed mankind. God's personal name... The Almighty God of the Old Testament (or Hebrew Scriptures) was very careful to make his name known to his worshipers. [Ex 6:2-3; Ps 83:18]¹¹ God inspired the Jewish Tetragrammaton (JHVH or YHWH), which are the four Hebrew letters representing the Personal Name of God, to be used over 6000 times in the oldest available Hebrew Scripture text. The common English translation of that name is Jehovah. While it was removed from some Bible translations in the 18th and 19th centuries, ¹² many translations still retain it. Some of those include: *The American Standard Bible* by the American Revision Committee in 1885 CE; *The Darby Bible* in 1890 by John Nelson Darby; *The Literal Translation of the Holy Bible* in 1976 by Jay P. Green, Sr.; *The Modern King James Bible* by Jay P. Green, Sr., and *The Young's Literal Translation* done by J. N. Young in 1862. In the

Some similar disclosure is commonly [and it would seem wisely] made by other groups or individuals who made the choice to remove the Divine Name from their respective translation works. Again, it is used over 6000 times in the original Hebrew text.

Modern World Translation,© whenever Jesus quotes a Hebrew Scripture that contains the Divine Name, the MWT includes the English pronunciation of the Divine Name in Jesus's quote. It seems it could not have been otherwise. At least one translation has inserted the Divine Name throughout the New Testament, asserting it should be there. Their justification is they believe it was present in older manuscript copies of the original Greek and Aramaic language texts. Finding no copies of the Greek Scriptures that contain the name, the MWT has not taken that liberty.

Only when Jesus quotes a Hebrew Scripture that contains the Divine Name does the MWT of John include the English translation of that Name in Jesus's quote.

The Modern World Translation of John

Chapter 1

John 1:1-51 MWT

- (1) In the beginning was the one who is called the Word. The Word was with God and the Word was a God.¹
- (2) This one was in the beginning with God.
- (3) With this Word, God created all other things. Not even one thing was made without the Word.
- (4) What came into existence received its life from him, and his life gave light to everyone.
- (5) And the light keeps shining in the dark, and darkness has never put it out.
- (6) There was a man named John who was sent by God,
- (7) he came to tell about the light and to encourage people to have faith through that light.
- (8) John wasn't that light. He came only to announce his coming.

- (9) The true light that illuminates every person was about to come into the world.
- (10) The Word was in the world, the world which God made through him, but no one knew him.
- (11) He came to his own nation, but his own people did not welcome him.
- (12) But as many as did accept him, and put their faith in his name, to them he gave the right to be the children of God.
- (13) They were not God's children by birthright of blood, or because of any human desires. By God's own efforts they were made His children.
- (14) The Word became a human being and lived here with us. We saw his true glory, the glory of the only begotten Son of the Father. Through him all the kindness, and all the truth of God have come down to us.

Please note: This verse is conveying something which might be beyond our real present ability to fully understand. To harmonize with the rest of the Book, it seems to convey that the pre-human Jesus existed in the same spirit form as his Father, was God's son, was used to create all other things, and was the one sent to teach us about the Father.

¹ As translators tried to achieve an accurate English translation of John 1:1, its translation has become one of the most highly debated of any verse in the Bible. It is variously translated as: "the word was like God," "the word was God," the word was "the same essence as God," and "the word was a God." In seeking harmony with John 17:11, and with the theme of John, the MWT uses "the word was a God."

Chap. 1

- (15) John bore witness about him and cried out, "This is the one I told you would come! He is greater than I am, because he was alive before I was born."
- (16) Because of all that the Son is, we have received one blessing after another.
- (17) For the Law was given through Moses, but Jesus Christ brought us undeserved kindness and truth.
- (18) No person has ever seen God. The only begotten [or unique] Son, who is truly closest to the Father, has shown us what God is like.
- (19) This is the response of John, when the Jewish religious leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and temple helpers to ask him, "You, who are you?"
- (20) And he confessed and did not deny, but told them plainly, "I am not the Messiah [Hebrew word meaning "the Anointed One"]."
- (21) Then they questioned him and asked: "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "No, I am not!" And when they asked if he were the Prophet, he also said "No!"

- (22) Finally, they said, "Who are you then? We must give an answer to the ones who sent us. Tell us who you are!"
- (23) John answered, quoting the words of the prophet Isaiah, "I am only someone crying out in the wilderness, 'Get the road ready for Jehovah!'" [Isaiah 40:3²]
- (24) Those who had been sent to question John had come from the Pharisees.
- (25) They continued questioning him and said to him, "Why are you baptizing people, if you are not the Christ [Greek for "the Anointed One"] or Elijah or the Prophet?"
- (26) John answered them and said, "I use water to baptize people. But standing in your midst is someone you don't know.
- (27) Even though he came after me, still he existed before me, and I am not good enough to untie his sandals."³
- (28) These things took place in Bethany, east of the Jordan, where John was baptizing.
- (29) The next day, John saw Jesus coming toward him and said,

- (44) Philip was from Bethsaida, the hometown of Andrew and Peter.
- (45) Philip next found Nathanael and said, "We have found the one that Moses and the Prophets wrote about. He is Jesus, the son of Joseph who is from Nazareth."
- (46) Nathanael asked, "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Philip answered, "Come and see."
- (47) When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said, "Look! A true descendant of our ancestor Israel. And he is not at all deceitful."
- (48) "How do you know me?"
 Nathanael asked. Jesus
 answered, "Before Philip called
 you, I saw you under the fig
 tree."
- (49) Nathanael said, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God. You are King of Israel!"

John 2:1-25 MWT

- (4) Jesus replied, "What concern is that to me or you, woman. My time has not yet come!"
- (5) His mother then said to the servants, "Do whatever Jesus tells you to do."
- (6) At the feast there were standing six stone water jars, according to the purification rites of the Jews. Each jar held two or three measures [about twenty or thirty gallons].
- (7) Jesus said to the servants, "Fill them to the top with water." Then after the jars had been filled,
- (8) he said, "Now take some water and give it to the man in charge of the feast." The servants did as Jesus told them,
- (9) and the man in charge drank some of the water that had been made wine. He did not know where the wine had come from,

- but the servants did. He called the bridegroom over
- (10) and said, "Every person puts out the best wine first. Then after the guests have drunk freely, the other wine is served. But you have kept the best until last!"
- (11) This was the beginning of the signs Jesus did [his first miracle], and he did it in the village of Cana in Galilee. There Jesus revealed his glory, and his disciples put their faith in him.
- (12) After this, he went with his mother, his brothers, and his disciples to the town of Capernaum, where they stayed not many days.
- (13) The Jewish festival of the Passover was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.
- (14) There he found in the temple people selling cattle, sheep, and doves. He also saw moneychangers sitting there.
- (15) And having made a whip of ropes, he chased everyone out of the temple, together with their sheep and cattle. He turned over the tables of the moneychangers with their coins.
- (16) Jesus said to those selling doves, "Get those doves out of here! Don't make my Father's house a house of merchandise."

- (17) The disciples then remembered that the Scriptures say, "My love for your house will consume me." [Psalm 69:9]¹
- (18) The Jewish religious leaders asked Jesus, "What sign of authority do you have [what miracle will you work] to show us as to why you have done these things?"
- (19) Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up!"
- (20) The Jewish religious leaders replied, "This temple was built in forty-six years. What makes you think you can rebuild it in three days?"
- (21) But Jesus spoke concerning the temple of his body.
- (22) And when he was resurrected from death, his disciples remembered he told them these things. Then they believed the Scriptures and the words of Jesus.
- (23) In Jerusalem during Passover many people put their faith in Jesus, because they saw the miracles he performed.
- (24) Jesus, however, was wary of these new believers, because he knew what was in their hearts.

(25) No one had to tell him what humanity was like. He already knew.

John 3:1-36 MWT

- There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, who was a Jewish religious leader.
- (2) One night he went to Jesus and said, "Rabbi, we know that God has sent you to teach us. You could not work these miracles unless God were with you."
- (3) Jesus replied, "I tell you for certain, unless someone has a new birth, they cannot see God's kingdom!"
- (4) Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb, and be born?"
- (5) Jesus answered: I tell you positively, before you can get into God's kingdom, you must be born not only by water, but by the Spirit.
- (6) Humans give life to their children. But only God's Spirit can change you into a child of God. [visit justbibletruth.com/HowCanFaith Help.html]
- (7) Don't be surprised when I say it is necessary for you to have a second birth.

- (8) The wind goes where its pleasure takes it, and the sound of it comes to your ears, but you are unable to say where it comes from and where it goes: So it is with everyone whose birth is from the Spirit. Only God's Spirit gives birth to a new person.
- (9) "How are these things able to happen?" Nicodemus asked.
- (10) Jesus replied: "How can you be a teacher of Israel and not know these things?"
- (11) I tell you for certain that we know what we are talking about because we have seen it ourselves. But none of you will accept what we say.
- (12) If you don't accept it as truth when I talk to you about things on earth, how can you possibly believe if I talk to you about things in heaven?
- (13) No one has gone up to heaven except the Son of Man, who came down from heaven.
- (14) And the Son of humanity must be lifted up, just as the metal snake was lifted up by Moses in the desert, [Numbers 21:4-9¹]

- (15) so that everyone who has faith (20) Everyone practicing evil hates in the Son of Man will have eternal life.
- (16) God loved the people of this world so much that he gave his only begotten Son, so that everyone who manifests faith in him will have eternal life.
- (17) God did not send his Son into the world to judge its people. He sent him to save them! [John 12:46-50]
- (18) No one who has faith in God's Son will be condemned. But everyone who doesn't have faith in him has already been judged for not having faith in the teachings of God's only Son.
- (19) Now this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people who do evil things are judged guilty because they love the dark more than the light. [Because they love wickedness done in the dark, they refuse to put faith in the son of God.]

- the light and won't come to the light, because it clearly shows what they have done.
- (21) But everyone who lives by the truth (those who love others) will come to the light, because they want others to know that God is helping them into the light [helping them to become upright].
- (22) After these things, Jesus and his disciples went to Judea, where he stayed with them and they were baptizing people.
- (23) John was at Aenon near Salim, where there was a lot of water, and people were coming there for John to baptize them,
- (24) for John had not yet been put in iail.
- (25) John's followers got into an argument with a Jewish man about ceremonial washing (purification rites).
- (26) And they came to John and said, "Rabbi, the man you were
- brought us out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no bread, and there is no water: and our soul hates this light bread.
- (6) And Jehovah sent fiery serpents among the people; and they bit the people, and many people of Israel died.
- (7) And the people came in to Moses and said, We have sinned, for we have spoken against Jehovah, and against you. Pray to Jehovah, and He shall

- turn the serpent away from us. And Moses prayed on behalf of the people.
- (8) And Jehovah spoke to Moses, Make yourself a fiery serpent, and set it on a pole; and it shall be that when anyone is bitten, when he sees it, he shall live.
- (9) And Moses made a serpent of bronze and put it on a pole; and it happened, if a serpent had bitten any man, when he looked to the bronze serpent, he lived

- with east of the Jordan, and whom you said was the son of God, he is now baptizing people and everyone is going to him."
- (27) John answered and said: No one can receive anything that is not given him from God in heaven.
- (28) You surely remember how I told you I am not the Christ. I am the one sent ahead of him.
- (29) At a wedding, the one having the bride is the bridegroom. The best man is glad just to be there and to hear the groom's voice. That's why my joy is made full.
- (30) Jesus must become more important, while I become less.
- (31) God's Son comes down from heaven and is above all.

 Everyone who comes from the earth belongs to the earth and speaks about earthly things.

 The one who comes from heaven is above all others.
- (32) He testifies about what he has seen and heard, and yet no one believes his witness.
- (33) But everyone who does believe him has given witness that he believes God is truthful.
- (34) The Son was sent to bring God's message, and he has been given the full power of God's Spirit.
- (35) The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand.

(36) The one receiving [or putting faith in] the Son has eternal life. But no one who refuses to believe will ever share in that life, and God's wrath is on them forever.

John 4:1-54 MWT

- When, then, Jesus knew the Pharisees had heard he was winning and baptizing more followers than John was,
- (2) (Although Jesus' disciples were really the ones doing the baptizing, and not Jesus himself),
- (3) Jesus left Judea and started for Galilee again.
- (4) It was necessary for him to pass through Samaria,
- (5) and on his way he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar. It was near the field Jacob had long ago given to his son Joseph.
- (6) The well that Jacob had dug was still there, and Jesus sat down beside it because he was weary from the journey. It was noon,
- (7) and a Samaritan woman came to draw water from the well. Jesus asked her, "Would you please give me a drink of water?"
- (8) (For Jesus' disciples had gone into town to buy some food.)
- (9) "You are a Jew," she replied, "and I am a Samaritan woman. Why do you ask me for a drink when Jews and Samaritans won't have anything to do with each other?"

- (10) Jesus answered, "If you knew the free gift of God, and who it was asking you for a drink, you would ask me for the water that gives life."
- (11) "Sir," the woman said, "you don't even have a bucket to draw water, and the well is deep. From where then are you going to get this life-giving water?
- (12) You are not greater than our ancestor Jacob who dug this well for us, and his family and animals drank water from it, are you?"
- (13) Jesus answered and said, "Everyone drinking this water will get thirsty again.
- (14) But everyone who drinks the water I give will never get thirsty again. The water I give will become within them a flowing fountain that gives eternal life."
- (15) The woman replied, "Sir, please give me some of that water so I won't get thirsty and have to come to this well again."
- (16) Jesus told her, "Go and call your husband to this well."
- (17) The woman answered, "I don't have a husband." "That's right," Jesus replied, "you're telling the truth. You don't have a husband. You have already been married five times, and the man you now live with is not your husband."

- (18) (Included into 4:17)
- (19) The woman said, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet.
- (20) Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews say Jerusalem is the place where it is necessary to worship."
- (21) Jesus said to her: Believe me woman, the time is coming when you won't worship the Father either on this mountain or in Jerusalem.
- (22) You Samaritans don't really know the one you worship. But we Jews do know the God we worship, and by using us, God will provide salvation to both you and to the whole world.
- (23) But a time is coming, and it is already here, when the true worshipers are being led by the Spirit to worship the Father according to the truth. For the Father is seeking such ones to worship him.
- (24) God is a Spirit, and those who worship God must be led by the Spirit to worship him according to the truth.
- (25) The woman said, "I know that the Messiah will come. He is the one we call Christ. When he comes, he will explain everything to us."
- (26) "I am that one," Jesus told her, "and I am speaking to you now."

- (27) The disciples returned about this time and were surprised to find Jesus talking with the Samaritan woman. None of them, however, asked what he wanted or why he was talking with her.
- (28) The woman left her water jar, and ran back into town saying to the people,
- (29) "Come! See! A man who told me everything I have ever done! Could this be the Messiah?"
- (30) They came out of the town going to see Jesus.
- (31) In the meantime Jesus' disciples were saying to him, "Teacher, please eat something."
- (32) But Jesus told them, "I have food to eat that you don't know anything about."
- (33) His disciples started asking each other, "Has someone brought him something to eat?"
- (34) Jesus said: "My food is to be doing the will of the one who sent me! God is the one who sent me, and I must finish the work he gave me to do.
- (35) You may say it is still four months until harvest time. But I tell you to look, and you will see the fields are already ripe and ready to harvest.
- (36) Even now the harvest workers are receiving their reward by gathering a harvest that brings

- eternal life as payment. Then everyone who planted the seed and everyone who harvests the crop will celebrate together.¹
- (37) So the word proves true, 'Some plant the seed, and others harvest the crop.' [Judges 6:3-4²; Micah 6:15³]
- (38) I am sending you to harvest crops in fields where others have planted and labored."
- (39) Many Samaritans in that town put their faith in Jesus because the woman had said, "This man told me everything I have ever done."
- (40) The Samaritans came asking him to stay in their town, and he stayed for two days.
- (41) Many more Samaritans put their faith in Jesus because of what they heard him say.
- (42) So they said to the woman, "We no longer have faith in Jesus just because of what you told us. We have heard him ourselves, and we are certain that this truly is the Savior of the world!"

- (43) After two days, Jesus left there and went into Galilee.
- (44) For Jesus himself said that a prophet has no honor in his hometown.
- (45) When he went to Galilee, the people there welcomed him, because they had gone to the festival in Jerusalem and had seen everything he did there.
- (46) Jesus returned to Galilean village of Cana, where he had turned the water into wine. There was a certain ruler in Capernaum whose son was sick.
- (47) And when the man heard that Jesus had come from Judea into Galilee, he went and begged him to come down and keep his son from dying.
- (48) Jesus told the official, "You won't believe unless you see miracles and wonders!"
- (49) The man replied, "Lord, please come before my young child dies!"
- (50) Jesus said to him, "Your son will live. Go on home to him."

The man believed what Jesus told him and started back home.

- (51) Some of the official's servants met him along the road and told him, "Your child lives!"
- (52) He inquired when the boy got better, and they told him, "The fever left him yesterday at one o'clock."
- (53) The boy's father realized it was at that time Jesus had told him, "Your son will live!" So the man and everyone in his family put faith in Jesus.
- (54) This was the second miracle
 Jesus worked after he left Judea
 and went to Galilee.

John 5:1-47 MWT

- After these things, there was another Jewish religious festival, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.
- (2) Now in Jerusalem by the sheep gate there was a pool, being called in Hebrew Bethesda, having five covered porches.
- (3) Under these were lying a great multitude of ones being sick, blind, lame, and withered, waiting for the moving of the water.
- (4) For at a set time an angel would descend into the pool and would be stirring up the water, then the first person stepping in after the troubling of the water became well of whatever disease he suffering.
- (5) Now there was a certain man there having an infirmity for thirty eight years.
- (6) Jesus having seen this one lying and knowing that a long time he had already been there, he said to him, "Do you wish to become well?"
- (7) The sick man answered him, "Lord, I do not have a person that, whenever the water is stirred, he should put me into the pool, but while I am coming another descends before me."
- (8) Jesus told him, "Get up! Take up your cot and walk."

- (9) And immediately the man became well and took up his cot and began walking! But it was a Sabbath day.
- (10) Therefore the Jewish religious leaders were saying to the one having been healed, "It is a Sabbath! It is not lawful for you to take up your cot."
- (11) He answered them, "The one having healed me, that one said to me, 'Pick up your cot and be walking about."
- (12) So they questioned him, "Who said to you, 'Take up your cot and walk?'"
- (13) But the man did not know who it was that healed him, for Jesus left unnoticed, a crowd being in that place.
- (14) After these things, Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, "Look! You have become well! Go your way and don't be sinning anymore, lest something worse should happen to you."
- (15) The man went away and told the Jews that it is Jesus who made him well.
- (16) For this reason the Jews were persecuting Jesus, and were seeking to kill Him, because he was doing these things on a Sabbath.
- (17) But Jesus said, "My Father is working until now, and that is why I keep on working."

- (18) Therefore, for this reason, all the more the Jews were seeking to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he also called God his own Father, making himself equal to God.¹
- (19) So Jesus told the people,
 "Most certainly I say to you, the
 son is not able to do anything
 himself, unless he sees the
 Father doing it, for whatever he
 sees the Father doing, these
 things the son likewise does.
- (20) "For the Father dearly loves the son, and shows him all the things which He Himself does, and greater works than these He will show to him, so that you will marvel.
- (21) "For even as the Father raises dead ones and makes them alive, so also the son makes alive whom he wills.
- (22) "The Father doesn't judge anyone, but He has given all judgment to the son,
- (23) so that everyone will honor the son just as they honor the Father. The one not honoring

- the son does not honor the Father who sent him.
- (24) "Most surely I tell you, the one hearing my word and believing [or having faith] in the One having sent me, has eternal life and does not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life!
- (25) "Most positively, I say to you, an hour is coming and now is, when dead persons will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those having heard will live. [Joh 11:43-44]
- (26) "For even as the Father has life in Himself, so He has also given to the son to have life in himself.
- (27) "And He also gave the son the right to judge everyone, because he is the "son of man."²
- (28) "Don't be surprised at this, because an hour is coming when all those in the tombs will hear his voice,
- (29) and they will come out of the graves: the ones having done good things to a resurrection of life, but the ones having

As a man, Jesus could fully comprehend what it was like to be a man, and could thus judge fairly. That is not to say his Father Jehovah could not do so, but Jesus also provides the second witness to the righteousness of God's rule. [Joh 8:17-18]

¹ Jesus did not say he was equal to God. He said he was God's son. The Jews heard what they wanted to hear, so as to have something to charge against Jesus. Jesus responded to their accusation in verse 19.

² It is just and fitting that God gave judgment into the hands of Christ Jesus.

- practiced wicked things to a resurrection of judgment.
- (30) "I am not able to do anything of myself. Just as I hear I judge, and my judgment is righteous, because I do not seek my will but the will of my Father who sent me.
- (31) "If I speak for myself, there is no way to prove I am telling the truth.
- (32) "There is another who is testifying concerning me, and I know that the testimony is true which He testifies concerning me. [Joh 1:32-34]
- (33) "You have sent messengers to John, and he has told you the truth.
- (34) "I am not dependent on what people say about me, but I say these things so that you may have faith and be saved.
- (35) "John was the burning and shining lamp, but you were pleased to be very glad for an hour [or a brief while] in his light.
- (36) "But I have a testimony greater than John's, for the works which the Father gave me to do, the works themselves that I am doing testify concerning me that the Father sent me.
- (37) "And the Father having sent me, He Himself has testified concerning me. Neither have you heard His voice at any time nor have you seen His form.

- (38) And you do not have His word remaining in you, because the one whom the Father sent, this one you do not believe.
- (39) "You search the Scriptures, because you think by means of them you will have eternal life, and these are the ones which testify concerning me.
- (40) "And so you are not willing to come to me so that you may have life.
- (41) "I do not receive glory from people.
- (42) "But I do know that none of you love God.
- (43) "I have come in the Name of My Father, and you do not receive me. If another comes in his own authority, that one you will receive.
- (44) "How are you able to believe, while you seek the praise of one another, and you don't care about praise from God?
- (45) "Stop thinking that I will be the one to accuse you before the Father; the one accusing you is Moses, in whom you have hoped [or, have trusted in].
- (46) "For if you believed Moses, you would have believed me, for that one wrote concerning me.
- (47) "But if the writings of that one you do not believe, how will you believe my sayings?"

John 6:1-71 MWT

- After these things Jesus crossed the Sea of Galilee (also known as Lake Tiberias).
- (2) And a large crowd was following him, because they had seen him work miracles to heal the sick.
- (3) But Jesus went up into the mountain, and was sitting there with his disciples.
- (4) It was almost time for the Jewish religious festival of Passover.
- (5) Then Jesus, lifting up his eyes and seeing the large crowd coming to him, said to Philip, "From where shall we buy loaves of bread, so that all these shall eat?"
- (6) He said this to test Phillip, for he already knew what he was about to do.
- (7) Philip answered, "Two hundred denarii [i.e., 200 days' wages] worth of loaves of bread are not sufficient for them that each of them shall receive some little piece."
- (8) One of His disciples, Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, spoke up and said,
- (9) "There is a little boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish, but these—what are they among so many?"

- (10) But Jesus said, "Have everyone sit down." Now it was a grassy place. So they reclined (the men numbered about five thousand).
- (11) Then Jesus took the loaves of bread, and having thanked God, he distributed to his disciples, and the disciples to the ones reclining, likewise also of the fish, as much as they wanted!
- (12) And when all were satisfied, he said to his disciples, "Gather together the broken pieces of bread which are leftover, so that nothing will be lost."
- (13) The disciples gathered them and filled twelve large baskets with broken pieces of bread, from the five barley loaves which were left over by the ones having been fed.
- (14) Therefore, the people having seen the miracle Jesus performed, said, "This is truly the prophet, the one coming into the world!"
- (15) Then Jesus, knowing they were about to come and try to force him to be their king, withdrew into the mountain where he could be alone.
- (16) But when evening came, his disciples went down to the sea.
- (17) And having stepped into the boat, they started across the sea to Capernaum. Now it was

- already dark, and Jesus had not (26) Jesus answered them and joined them. said, "I tell you for certain, you
- (18) And the sea waves were being stirred up by a strong blowing wind.
- (19) When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat. And they were afraid.
- (20) But He said to them, "I am Jesus! Stop being afraid!"
- (21) So they were willing to take him into their boat, and immediately the boat came to be on the land to which they were going.
- (22) The people who had stayed on the east side of the sea knew that only one boat had been there. They also knew that Jesus had not left in it with his disciples. But the next day
- (23) some other small boats came from Tiberias, near the place where they ate the bread after the Lord had given thanks.
- (24) So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor his disciples, they themselves stepped into the boats and came to Capernaum seeking Jesus.
- (25) And finding him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?"

- (26) Jesus answered them and said, "I tell you for certain, you seek me not because you saw signs, but because you ate of the loaves of bread and were satisfied.
- (27) "Stop working for food that perishes by itself, but work for the food that gives eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you, for God the Father has set his seal on His son's right to do so."
- (28) Therefore, they asked him, "What exactly does God want us to do?"
- (29) Jesus answered and said to them, "God wants you to have faith in the one he sent."
- (30) So they said to him, "What miracle will you work so that we can see and know we can believe you? What will you do?
- (31) For example, when our fathers were in the wilderness, He gave them manna to eat. It happened just as it has been written, 'He gave to them bread out of

- heaven to eat." [Exod 16:41; Neh 9:152; Ps 78:243]
- (32) So Jesus said to them, "Most positively, I say to you, Moses did not give you bread out of heaven, but my Father gives to you the true bread out of heaven.
- (33) "For the bread of God is the one coming down out of heaven and giving life to the world."
- (34) Then they said to him, "Lord, always give to us this bread."
- (35) But Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life! The one coming to me shall by no means hunger, and the one having faith in me will by no means get thirsty at any time!
- (36) But it is just as I said to you: you have seen me and still you have no faith.
- (37) All those whom the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not send away anyone coming to me.
- (38) Because I have come down from heaven, not to be doing my

- will, but to be doing the will of the One who sent me.
- (39) And this is the will of the Father who sent me, that out of all He has given me I will not lose any, but I will raise them up in the last day.
- (40) "And this is the will of the One who sent me, that everyone seeing the Son and having faith in him will have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day."
- (41) Therefore, the Jews were grumbling about him, because Jesus said, "I am the bread coming down out of heaven."
- (42) And they said, "Is this not Jesus, the Son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How is it he says, "I have come down out of heaven?"
- (43) So Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop grumbling about me with one to another.
- (44) "No one is able to come to me unless the Father who sent me

forth water for them out of the rock for their thirst. And You promised them that they should go in to possess the land which You had sworn to give them.

- draws [or, drags] him, and I will raise him up in the last day.4
- (45) "It is written in the prophets, 'And they will all be taught by Jehovah.' Therefore, every [one] hearing from the Father through the prophets, and having learned, comes to me. [Isaiah *54:131*⁵
- (46) "Not that anyone has seen the Father, except the one coming down from God, he has seen the Father.
- (47) "Most positively, I say to you, the one who puts faith in me has eternal life.
- (48) "I am the bread that gives life!
- (49) "Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and yet died.
- (50) "This is the bread which has come down out of heaven, so that anyone who eats from it shall not die.
- (51) "I am the living bread, the one coming down out of heaven. If anyone eats from this bread he

- will live into the age [fig., forever], and indeed the bread which I will give is my flesh, which I will give on behalf of the life of the world."
- (52) Therefore, the Jews began disputing with one another, saying, "How is this man able to give to us his flesh to eat?"
- (53) So Jesus said to them, "Most surely I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Humanity and drink his blood, you do not have life in vourselves.
- (54) "The one eating my flesh and drinking my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up in the last day.
- (55) "For my flesh truly is food, and my blood truly is drink.
- (56) "The one eating my flesh and drinking my blood remains in

delivered to me by my Father, and no one fully knows the son but the Father, neither does anyone fully know the Father but the son, and anyone to whom the son is willing to reveal Him.) Jesus is the one appointed and sent by his Father to teach us what God is like.

⁴ Please note: Christ here explains the process by which we come to know our Father, and his son Jesus. [Joh 20:17] I. God first takes note of those individuals who are righteously inclined. (2 Chron 16:9 – For, as regards Jehovah, his eyes are roving about through all the earth to show his strength in behalf of those whose heart is complete toward him.) II. God then drags those who are seeking Him to the teachings of his son. [Joh 6:44]

III. Jesus, in turn, teaches us about his Father. (Mat 11:27 - All things have been

- union with me, and I in union with him.⁶
- (57) "Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, also the one feeding on me, that one will also live because of me.
- (58) "This is the bread having come down out of heaven, not as your fathers ate the manna and died. The one eating this bread will live into the age [fig., forever]!"
- (59) These things Jesus said in a Jewish place of worship [a synagogue] while teaching in Capernaum.
- (60) Therefore, many of Jesus' disciples having heard, said, "This word is too harsh. Who is able to be hearing it?"
- (61) But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, said to them, "Does this cause you to stumble [fig, offend you]?
- (62) "What if you should see the Son of Man go up to heaven where he came from?
- (63) "The Spirit is the One giving life; the flesh [or, human strength] does not accomplish [or, benefit] anything. The words

- which I have spoken to you are spirit and are life!
- (64) "But there are some of you who refuse to have faith in me." For Jesus knew from the beginning who they are, the ones not believing, and who was the one who would betray Him.
- (65) And he said, "For this reason I have said to you, 'No one is able to come to me unless he has been drawn by my Father."
- (66) Because of what Jesus said, about eating his flesh and drinking his blood, many of his disciples went away to the things behind and were no more walking about with him. They didn't care to understand.
- (67) So Jesus said to the twelve, "You do not also want to go away, do you?"
- (68) Then Simon Peter answered and said, "Lord, to whom will we go away to? You have the words of eternal life."
- (69) "And we have come to believe and have come to know that you are the Christ, the Son of the living God!"
- (70) Jesus answered them, "I chose you twelve, did I not? And

^{4:34]} Their food is doing what Jesus taught them, just as Jesus's food is to do his Father's will. We eat Jesus's flesh and drink his blood, by making what he taught us the most important thing in our life.

one of you is a son of the evil one!"

(71) Now He spoke of Judas Iscariot, son of Simon Iscariot, for this one was about to betray Him, being one of the twelve.

John 7:1-53 MWT

- Jesus left Judea and started going through Galilee, because the Jewish religious leaders wanted to kill him.
- (2) But the festival of the Jews was near, the Feast of Tabernacles [or Booths].
- (3) So Jesus' brothers said to him, "Why don't you go into Judea, so that your disciples can see the miracles you are doing.
- (4) "For no one does anything in secret if they want the world to know what they are doing. If you do these things, show yourself to the world."
- (5) For even Jesus' own brothers were not putting faith in Him.
- (6) So Jesus said to them, "My time hasn't yet come; but your time is always here [their time to be putting faith in him as the Christ].
- (7) "It is not possible for you to be hated by the world; but I am hated by it, because I them what they do is evil.
- (8) "You go on up to this festival; I am not yet going up to this feast because my time has not yet been fulfilled."
- (9) And after saying these things to them, Jesus remained in Galilee.
- (10) But after his brothers had gone up, then he also himself

- went up, not openly, but in secret.
- (11) So the Jewish religious leaders were seeking him at the festival and said, "Where is that one?"
- (12) And there was much subdued excitement about him among the crowds. Some indeed said, "He is a good man." Others said, "No, but he is misleading the crowd [deceiving the crowd]."
- (13) No one, though, was speaking freely about him on account of the fear of the Jewish religious leaders.
- (14) In the middle of the feast, Jesus went into the temple and began teaching.
- (15) And the Jews were amazed, saying, "How does this one know so much, not having been educated in our religious schools?"
- (16) Therefore, Jesus answered them and said, "My teaching is not mine, but comes from the One having sent me.
- (17) "If anyone really wants to obey God and do his will, they will know concerning my teaching, whether it is from God or whether I speak from my own originality.
- (18) "The man whose words come from himself is seeking glory for himself, but he who is looking

- for the glory of the One who sent him--that man is true and there is no evil in him..
- (19) "Did not Moses give you the Law? And not one of you keeps the Law. Why are you seeking to kill me?"
- (20) The crowd answered and said, "You have a demon! Who is seeking to kill you?"
- (21) Jesus answered and said to them, "One work I did, and you all marveled and were amazed!
- (22) "Moses commanded you to circumcise your sons—not that it is from Moses, but from your forefathers—and even on a Sabbath Day you circumcise your sons.
- (23) "If a man receives circumcision on a Sabbath so that the Law of Moses is not broken, why are you bitterly angry with me because I made a man entirely well on a Sabbath?
- (24) "Stop judging according to appearance, judge what is right."
- (25) So some among the people of Jerusalem said, "This is the one whom they are seeking to kill, is it not?
- (26) "And look! He speaks freely, and they say nothing to Him. Perhaps the rulers have come to know that this one is truly the Christ?

- (27) "But how could that be? No one knows where the Messiah will come from, but we know where this man comes from."
- (28) Then, as Jesus was teaching in the temple he cried out saying, "Do you think you both know me and where I am from? I have not come on my own, but the One who sent me is true, whom you do not know.
- (29) "But I know the One who sent me, because I came from Him"
- (30) So the religious leaders were seeking to arrest him, but no one laid a hand on him because his hour had not yet come.
- (31) But many out of the crowd put faith in him and said, "When the Christ comes, he will not do more signs than this one did, will he?"
- (32) When the Pharisees heard the crowd muttering these things concerning him, then the Pharisees and the chief priests sent attendants so that they should take him.
- (33) Therefore Jesus said, "Yet a little while I am with you, and then I am going away to the One who sent me.
- (34) "You will look for me and will not find me. You are not able to go where I am going."
- (35) Then the Jewish leaders said among themselves, "Where is this one about to go that we will

- not find him? He is not about to go to the dispersed ones [i.e. the Jews scattered among the Greeks] and to be teaching the Greeks, is he?
- (36) "What is this word which he said, 'You will seek me and will not find me, and where I am, you are not able to come?'"
- (37) But on the last and most important day of the festival, Jesus had stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone is thirsting, let him come to me and drink.
- (38) "The one putting faith in me, just as the Scripture said, 'Out of his belly [or, innermost being] will flow rivers of water of life."
 [No direct OT reference. See Isaiah 55:11; 58:112;]
- (39) But this he said in reference to the Spirit, which the ones believing in him were about to be receive, for the Holy Spirit had not yet been given because the glory of Jesus was yet to come.
- (40) Therefore, having heard what Jesus was saying, many among the crowd said "This one is truly the prophet."

- (41) Others were saying, "This is the Christ." Others were saying, "But the Christ is not coming out of Galilee, is he?
- (42) "The Scripture said the Christ is coming from the seed of David and from Bethlehem, the village where David was, did it

- not?" [Ps 132:11 ³; Jer 23:5 ⁴; 1Sam 16:1,13 ⁵; Micah 5:2 ⁶]
- (43) So there arose a division among the crowd because of him.
- (44) And some of them were wanting to seize him, but no one laid his hands on him.
- (45) Then the attendants came back to the chief priests and Pharisees. And those religious rulers said to them, "Why did you not bring him?"
- (46) The attendants answered, "Never has any man spoken like this person!"
- (47) Therefore, the Pharisees answered to them, "You have not also been deceived, have you?

- (48) "No one from the rulers or from the Pharisees have believed in him, have they?
- (49) "But this crowd who has no knowledge of the Law, is accursed."
- (50) Nicodemus, the one who had come to Jesus previously by night, said to them, he being one of them,
- (51) "Our Law does not judge any person unless it hears from him first and knows what he does, does it?"
- (52) They answered and said to him, "You are not also out of Galilee, are you? Search and see that no prophet has been raised out of Galilee."
- (53) And each one went to his house.

- (11) Jehovah has sworn to David in truth; He will not turn from it; I will set one of the fruit of your body on the throne for you.
- ⁴ Jeremiah 23:5 LITV
- (5) Behold, the days come, says Jehovah, that I will raise to David a righteous Branch, and a King shall reign and act wisely, and He shall do justice and righteousness in the earth.
- 5 1 Samuel 16:1 LITV
- (1) And Jehovah said to Samuel, Until when will you mourn for Saul, for I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go. I will send you to Jesse the

- Bethlehemite, for I have seen a king for Me among his sons.
- 1 Samuel 16:13 LITV
- (13) And Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers. And the Spirit of Jehovah came upon David from that day and onward. And Samuel rose up and went to Ramah.
- ⁶ Micah 5:2 BBE
- (2) And you, Beth-lehem Ephrathah, the least among the families of Judah, out of you one will come to me who is to be ruler in Israel; whose going out has been purposed from time past, from the eternal days.

John 8:1-59 MWT

- (1) But Jesus departed to the Mount of Olives.
- (2) Then at dawn he returned to the temple, and all the people were coming to him. And sitting down, he began teaching them.
- (3) But the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman to him who had been caught in adultery. And sitting her in the middle of them,
- (4) they said to him, testing him, "Teacher, we found this woman in the very act of committing adultery!
- (5) Now in our Law, Moses commanded those guilty of adultery are to be stoned to death. Therefore, you, what do you say?"
- (6) But this they said, testing him, trying to find something to accuse him of. But Jesus, having stooped down, began writing on the ground with his finger, not acknowledging them.
- (7) But when they continued asking him, he straightened back up, and said to them, "The one among you who is without sin, let him cast the first stone at her."
- (8) And again having stooped down, He was writing on the ground.

- (9) But having been convicted in their conscience by what he said, they began going out one by one, starting from the older to the last ones. And Jesus was left alone, and the woman still standing in what had been their midst.
- (10) Now Jesus having straightened himself back up and having seen no one but the woman, said to her, "Woman, where are your accusers? Did no one condemn you?"
- (11) And she said, "No one, Lord." So Jesus said to her, "Neither do I condemn you. Be going your way, and stop sinning."
- (12) Then again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world! The one following me shall by no means walk in the darkness, but shall have the light of life!
- (13) So the Pharisees said to Him, "You are testifying concerning yourself! Your testimony is not true!" [John 7:17-18]
- (14) Jesus answered and said to them, "Even if I am testifying concerning myself, my testimony is true, because I know where I came from and where I am going. But you do not know where I am from and where I am going.
- (15) "You judge in a human way; I am not judging anyone.

- (16) "But even if I do judge, my judgment is fair, because I am not alone, but my Father who sent me is with me.
- (17) "Even so in your Law it has been written, that the testimony of two persons is true. [Deut 19:15]
- (18) "I am one testifying concerning myself, and the Father who sent me is testifying about me." [John 1:32-34]
- (19) Therefore, they were saying to him, "Where is your father?" Jesus answered, "You neither know me nor my Father. If you knew me, you would also know my Father."
- (20) These sayings Jesus spoke in the treasury, teaching in the temple, and no one seized him, because his hour had not yet come.
- (21) Then Jesus said again to them, "I am going away, and you will seek me, and you will die in your sin; where I am going, you are not able to come."
- (22) So the Jews were saying, "Surely he will not kill himself, will he?—because he says, 'Where I am going, you are not able to come?'"

- (23) And Jesus said to them, "You are from below; I am from above. You are from this world; I am not from this world.
- (24) "Therefore, I said to you, 'you will die in your sins,' for unless you believe that I am who I say I am, you will die in your sins."
- (25) So they were saying to him, "You then, who are you?" And Jesus said to them, "Just who I have been telling you even from the beginning:
- (26) "Many things I have to tell you and to be judging; but the One having sent me is true, and what I heard from Him, these things I say to the world."
- (27) They did not understand that he was speaking to them about his Father.
- (28) Then Jesus said to them,
 "When you have lifted up the
 Son of Man, then you will know
 that I am he, and that from my
 own self I do nothing, but just as
 my Father taught me, these
 things I speak.
- (29) "And the One having sent me is with me; the Father did not leave me alone, because I always do the things pleasing to Him."

- (30) While speaking these things, many put their faith in him.
- (31) So Jesus said to the Jews having believed in him, "If you remain in my word, you are truly my disciples.
- (32) "And you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free!"
- (33) They answered him, "We are the seed [fig., descendents] of Abraham, and to no one have we at any time been slaves. How can you say, 'You will become free?'"
- (34) Jesus answered them, "Most positively, I say to you, every one committing [or, practicing] sin is a slave of sin.
- (35) "But the slave does not remain in the house forever: the son remains forever.
- (36) "Therefore, if the son makes you free, you will actually be free!
- (37) "I know that you are the seed of Abraham, but you seek to kill me, because my word does not find a place in you.
- (38) "I am speaking what I have learned from my Father, and you are doing what you have seen from your father."
- (39) They answered and said to him, "Our father is Abraham."
 Jesus said to them, "If you were children of Abraham, you would be doing the works of Abraham.

- (40) "But now, you seek to kill me—a man who has spoken to you the truth which I heard from God—this Abraham did not do.
- (41) "You do the works of your father." Then they said, "We have not been born out of fornication; we have one Father—God!"
- (42) So Jesus said to them, "If God were your father, you would love me, because I have come from God. For I have not come from myself, but that One sent me.
- (43) "Why do you not understand my speech? Because you are not able to be hearing my word.
- (44) "You are from your father the Devil, and the desires of your father you want to do. That one was a murderer from the beginning, and he did not stand fast in the truth, because truth is not in him. When he is speaking a lie, out of his own inner being he speaks, [or it is a natural thing for him] because he is a liar, and the father of the lie.
- (45) "But because I speak the truth, you do not believe me.
- (46) "Who among you convicts me concerning sin? But if I am speaking truth, why are you not believing me?
- (47) "The one coming from God, the words of God he hears and pays attention to, for this reason

- you do not hear, because you are not from God."
- (48) Then the Jews answered and said to him, "Do we not rightly say you are a Samaritan a have a demon?"
- (49) Jesus answered, "I have no demon, but I am honoring my Father, and you are dishonoring me.
- (50) "But I do not seek my own glory; there is One seeking and judging.
- (51) "Most positively, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he shall by no means see death forever!"
- (52) Then the Jews said to him, "Now we do know you have a demon. Abraham died, and the prophets, and you say, 'If anyone keeps My word, he shall by no means taste of death forever!'
- (53) "You are not greater than our father Abraham, who died, are you? And the prophets died. Whom are you making yourself out to be?"
- (54) Jesus answered, "If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing; My Father is the One glorifying me, of whom you say, 'He is our God."

- (55) "And you have not known Him, but I do know Him; and if I should say that I do not know Him, I would be like you—a liar. But I do know Him, and I am keeping His word.
- (56) "Abraham, your father was very glad that he should see my day, and he saw and rejoiced."
- (57) So the Jews said to Him, "You are not yet fifty years, and yet you say you have seen Abraham?"
- (58) Jesus said to them, "Most positively, I say to you, before Abraham came to be, I have been!"
- (59) Therefore, they took up stones that they should kill him. But Jesus hid from them. And he went out of the temple, passing through the midst of them, and so he passed by. [cp. Luke 24:16²; Joh 12:36]

John 9:1-41 MWT

- (1) And passing by, he saw a man who had been blind from birth.
- (2) And his disciples asked him, saying, "Rabbi, who sinned, this one or his parents, that he should be born blind?"
- (3) Jesus answered, "Neither this man sinned nor his parents, but this happened so that the works of God should be revealed in him.
- (4) "It is necessary for me to be doing the works of the One who sent me while it is day; night is coming when no one is able to be working. [2 Thes 2:31]
- (5) "As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." [2 Thes 2:4-12]
- (6) Having said these things, Jesus spit on the ground and made mud from the saliva and rubbed the mud on the eyes of the blind man.
- (7) And he said to him, "Go; be washing in the pool of Siloam." So he went away and washed, and he came back able to see!
- (8) Therefore, the neighbors and those seeing previously that he was blind, were saying, "This is

- the one sitting and begging, is it not?"
- (9) Others were saying, "This is he." But others, "He is like him." That one kept saying, "I am he."
- (10) So they were asking him, "How were your eyes opened?"
- (11) That one answered and said, "A man called Jesus made mud and rubbed my eyes and said to me, 'Go to the pool of Siloam and wash.' And having gone away and washed, I received sight!"
- (12) So they said to him, "Where is that one?" He said, "I do not know."
- (13) Next, they brought the one who was formerly blind to the Pharisees.
- (14) Now it was on a Sabbath when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes.
- (15) So again the Pharisees were also asking him how he received sight. And the once blind man said to them, "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see!"
- (16) Then some of the Pharisees were saying, "This is not a man from God because he does not keep the Sabbath." Others were

- saying, "How is a sinful man able to be doing such miracles?" And a division arose among them.
- (17) They said to the blind man once again, "You, what do you say concerning him, because he opened your eyes?" So he said, "He is a prophet."
- (18) Then the Jews did not believe concerning him that he was blind and received sight, so they called the parents of the one having received sight.
- (19) And they asked them, saying,
 "Is this your son, whom you say
 that he was born blind? How
 then does he now see?"
- (20) So his parents answered them and said, "We know that this is our son and that he was born blind.
- (21) "But how he now sees, we do not know, or who opened his eyes, we do not know. He is of age, ask him. He will speak concerning himself."
- (22) These things his parents said because they were afraid of the Jews, for the Jews had already agreed together that anyone who confessed Jesus as the Christ should be expelled from the synagogue.
- (23) It was for this reason his parents said, "He is of age, ask him."

- (24) So a second time they called the man who was blind. And they said to him, "Be giving glory to God; we know that this man is a sinner!"
- (25) That one then answered and said, "Whether he is a sinner, I do not know; one thing I do know, that I was born blind and now I see!"
- (26) But they said to him again, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"
- (27) He answered them, "I told you already and you did not believe; why do you want to hear again? You do not want to become his disciples also, do you?"
- (28) They reviled him and said, "You are that man's disciple, but we are Moses' disciples!
- (29) "We know that God gave his word to Moses, but this one—we do not know from where he is."
- (30) The man answered and said to them, "Why, this certainly is a marvel, that you do not know from where he is from—and yet he opened my eyes!
- (31) "We know that God does not hear sinners, but if anyone is God-fearing and is doing God's will, this one God hears.
- (32) "Since the beginning it was not heard that anyone opened the eyes of one having been born blind.

- (33) "If this one were not from God, he would not be able to be doing such miracles."
- (34) They answered and said to him, "You were totally born in sins, and are you now teaching us!" And they cast him outside.
- (35) Jesus heard that they cast him out of the Synagogue. And having found him, he said to him, "Do you have faith in the Son of God?"
- (36) That one answered and said, "And who is he, Lord, so that I should believe in him?"
- (37) And Jesus said to him, "You have both seen him and the one speaking with you—that one is he."
- (38) And he said, "I believe, Lord!" And he prostrated himself in worship before him.
- (39) And Jesus said, "For this judgment I came into the world, so that the ones not seeing shall see, and the ones seeing shall become blind."
- (40) And those of the Pharisees who were with him heard these things, and they said to him, "We are not also blind, are we?"
- (41) Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no

sin, but now you say, 'We see.' Therefore, your sin remains."²

² They claimed to "see" by their choosing for themselves to reject Jesus as the promised Messiah

John 10:1-42 MWT

- (1) "Most surely I say to you, the one not entering through the gate into the fold of the sheep, but climbing in some other way, that one is a thief and a harmful person.
- (2) "But the one entering through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep.
- (3) "To this one the gatekeeper opens. And the sheep hear his voice, and his own sheep he calls by name, and he leads them out.
- (4) "And whenever he brings his own sheep out, he goes before them, and his sheep follow him, because they know his voice.
- (5) "But a stranger they will by no means follow, but they will flee from him, because they do not

- recognize the voice of strangers."
- (6) This illustration Jesus spoke to them, but they did not understand what the things meant which he was speaking to them.
- (7) Therefore, Jesus said again to them, "Most truly I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep!
- (8) "All who came before as the messiah¹ are thieves and hurtful ones, but the sheep did not hear them.
- (9) "I am the gate. All who come to God through me will be saved, and he will come in and go out and will find pasture.
- (10) "The thief does not come into the fold except to steal and kill and destroy. I came so that they can have life, and they will have it in abundance!

- (36) You remember that Theudas appeared some time ago, claiming to be somebody great, and about four hundred men joined him. But he was killed, all his followers were scattered, and his movement died out.
- (37) After that, Judas the Galilean appeared during the time of the census; he drew a crowd after him, but he also was killed, and all his followers were scattered.
- (38) And so in this case, I tell you, do not take any action against these men. Leave them alone! If what they have planned and done is of human origin, it will disappear,
- (39) but if it comes from God, you cannot possibly defeat them. You could find yourselves fighting against God!" The Council followed Gamaliel's advice.
- (40) They called the apostles in, had them whipped, and ordered them never again to speak in the name of Jesus; and then they set them free.

⁽³⁵⁾ and then he said to the Council, "Fellow Israelites, be careful what you do to these men.

- (11) "I am the good shepherd! The good shepherd lays down his life in behalf of the sheep.
- (12) "But the hired worker, not being also a shepherd, who is not the owner of the sheep, watches the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf seizes them and scatters the sheep.
- (13) "Now the hired worker flees because he is a hired worker and is not concerned about the sheep.
- (14) "I am the good shepherd, and I know my own sheep, and my own sheep know me.
- (15) "Just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father, and I lay down my life in behalf of the sheep.
- (16) "And other sheep I have which are not from this fold. These also it is necessary for me to bring, and my voice they will hear. And they will become one flock, one shepherd.
- (17) "For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life, so that I may receive it back again.
- (18) "No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of myself; I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to receive it back again. These orders I have received from my Father."

- (19) So again, there came to be a division among the Jews because of these words.
- (20) But many of them were saying, "He has a demon and is raving mad; why do you pay attention to him?"
- (21) Others were saying, "These are not the sayings of one being demon-possessed. A demon is not able to open the eyes of blind people, is it?"
- (22) Now the Feast of Dedication [i.e. Hanukkah] took place in Jerusalem, and it was winter.
- (23) And Jesus was walking about in the temple, in the Porch of Solomon.
- (24) Then the Jews surrounded him and said to Him, "How long do you hold our soul in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly."
- (25) Jesus answered them, "I told you already and yet you do not believe; the works which I do in the Name of my Father, these prove who I am.
- (26) "But you do not believe, because you are not of my sheep, just as I have said to you.
- (27) "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me.
- (28) "And I give them eternal life, and they shall by no means

- perish forever! And no one can pluck them out of my hand.
- (29) "My Father who has given them to me is greater than all, and no one is able to be plucking them out of the hand of My Father. [John 6:44]
- (30) "I and the Father are one!" [John 17:20-22]
- (31) Therefore, the Jews again took up stones so that they could kill him.
- (32) Jesus answered them, "Many fine works I showed you from my Father. On account of which good work do you stone me?"
- (33) The Jews answered him, saying, "Concerning a good work we do not stone you, but for blasphemy, and because you, being a human being, are trying to make yourself God."
- (34) Jesus answered them, "Has it not been written in your Law, 'I said, you are gods?' [Ps 82:6²]
- (35) "If He called "gods," the ones to whom the word of God came (and the Scripture is not able to be nullified),
- (36) Why do you say of me; of the one whom the Father sanctified and sent into the world, 'You blaspheme,' because I said, 'I am God's Son?'

- (37) "If I am not doing the works of my Father, do not believe me.
- (38) "But if I am doing His works, even if you do not believe me, believe in the works, so that you shall know and believe that the Father is with me, and I am with the Father."
- (39) Therefore, they were seeking again to seize him, and he slipped out from their hand.
- (40) And he went again beyond the Jordan to the place where John was first baptizing, and he remained there.
- (41) And many came to him and were saying, "John indeed did no sign. But all the things, as many as John said concerning this one were true."
- (42) And many in that place put their faith in him.

² **(Psalm 82:6)** "I myself have said, 'You are gods, And all of you are sons of the Most High.

John 11:1-57 MWT

- (1) Now there was a certain man who was sick, Lazarus from Bethany, from the village of Mary and her sister Martha.
- (2) And this was the Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped his feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick. [Joh 12:3-8]
- (3) So the sisters sent to Jesus, saying, "Lord, please hear! The one whom you affectionately love is sick."
- (4) But Jesus, after hearing said, "This sickness is not to death, but is to bring glory to God, and also the Son of God will be glorified through it!"
- (5) Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus.
- (6) So after hearing Lazarus was sick, then indeed he remained in the place in which he was two more days.
- (7) Then after this, Jesus said to the disciples, "We are going again to Judea."
- (8) The disciples say to Him, "Rabbi, right now the Jews were seeking to stone you, and you are going there again?"
- (9) Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in the day? If anyone walks about in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of the sun.

- (10) "But if anyone walks about in the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him."
- (11) These things he said, and after he said to them, "Lazarus our friend has fallen asleep, but I am going so as to wake him up."
- (12) Then his disciples said, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will get well."
- (13) But Jesus had spoken concerning his death, while his disciples thought he was speaking about him resting in sleep.
- (14) So Jesus then said to them plainly, "Lazarus has died."
- (15) "And I rejoice for your sake that I was not there, so that you shall believe, but let us be going to him."
- (16) Therefore, Thomas, the one being called Twin, said to his fellow-disciples, "Let us also go so that we shall die with him."
- (17) So Jesus having come, found he had already been four days in the tomb.
- (18) Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, about fifteen stadia away [about 1.7 miles or 2.75 kilometers].
- (19) And many of the Jews had come for the sake of Martha and Mary, so as to comfort them concerning their brother.

- that Jesus was coming, met him. But Mary was sitting in the house.
- (21) So Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died.
- (22) "But even now I know that whatever you ask God for, God will give you."
- (23) Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."
- (24) Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again, in the resurrection in the last day."
- (25) Jesus said to her. "I am the resurrection and the life! The one who puts faith in me, even if he dies, he will come to life!
- (26) "And every one who is living and putting faith in me will never die,1 forever! Do you believe what I say?"

¹ Jesus draws a distinction here, between

- (20) Then Martha, when she heard (27) She said to him, "Yes, Lord, I am convinced that you are the Christ, the son of God, the one coming into the world."
 - (28) And after saying these things, she went away and called Mary her sister privately, saving, "The teacher is present and is calling vou."
 - (29) Then that one, when she heard, rose up quickly and came to him.
 - (30) Now Jesus had not yet come into the village, but he was in the place where Martha met him.
 - (31) Therefore, the Jews, the ones being with her in the house and comforting her, seeing that Mary rose up quickly and went out, followed her, saying, "She is going off to the tomb so she can weep there."
- one group who would need to be resurrected by him, [verse 24 & 25] and another group who would have no need of a resurrection, but would live on forever. [verse 26] Mary was talking to him about the "last day" - the day of Jesus's second coming. Jesus was saying those alive when he came back would never die at all, but simply continue to live. That understanding is consistent with Job's prophecy:
- Job 33:24-30 MWT
- (24) In mercy the angel will say, "Release them! They are not to go down to the world of the dead. Here is the ransom to set them free."

- (25) Their bodies will grow young and strong again;
- (26) when they pray, God will answer; they will worship God with joy; God will set things right for them again.
- (27) Each one will say in public, "I have sinned. I have not done right, but God spared me.
- (28) He kept me from going to the world of the dead, and I am still alive."
- (29) God gives chance after chance;
- (30) to be saved from death and brought into the light that gives life.

- (32) So Mary, when she came to where Jesus was, seeing him, fell at his feet, saying to him, "Lord, if you had been here my brother would not have died."
- (33) Then Jesus, when he saw her weeping, and the Jews having come with her weeping, was deeply moved in his spirit and he groaned within himself.
- (34) And he said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see."
- (35) Jesus wept!
- (36) So the Jews said, "Look, how much affection he had for him!"
- (37) But some of them said, "This one, the one having opened the eyes of the blind man, was he not able to do something so that also this one should not have died?"
- (38) So Jesus, again being deeply moved in his spirit, came to the tomb. Now it was a cave, and a stone was lying on its entrance.
- (39) Jesus said, "Take the stone away." Martha, the sister of Lazarus, said to him, "Lord, already he stinks, for it is the fourth day since he died."
- (40) Jesus said to her, "I told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God, did I not?"
- (41) Then they took away the stone from where the one having died was lying. And Jesus lifted his eyes upward

- and said, "Father, I give thanks to You because You hear me.
- (42) "True, I know that You always hear me, but because of the crowd standing around I said it, so they will be convinced that You sent me."
- (43) And having said these things, with a loud voice he cried out, "Lazarus, come on out!"
- (44) And the one having died came out, his feet and hands having been bound with grave-clothes, and his face had been wrapped with a facecloth. Jesus said to them, "Loose him, and let him go."
- (45) Therefore, many of the Jews, the ones having come to Mary and having seen what Jesus did, put faith in him.
- (46) But some of them went away to the Pharisees and reported to them what Jesus had done.
- (47) Therefore, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered together a High Council [or, Sanhedrin] and said, "What are we going to do? For this person is performing many miracles!
- (48) "If we leave him alone this way, all will put faith in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation."
- (49) But a certain one of them, Caiaphas, being high priest that

- year, said to them, "You do not know anything,
- (50) neither do you take into account that it is advantageous for us that one person should die in behalf of the people, and the whole nation should not perish."
- (51) But this he said not from himself, but because he was high priest that year, he was used by God to prophesy that Jesus was about to die in behalf of the nation.
- (52) And not on behalf of their nation only, but so he could also gather together into one all the children of God, the ones scattered through the earth.
- (53) So from that day they plotted among themselves how they could kill Jesus.
- (54) Therefore, Jesus could no longer walk about freely among the Jews, but he went away from there to the countryside near the wilderness, to a city called Ephraim. And there he stayed with his disciples.
- (55) But the Passover of the Jews was near. And many went up to Jerusalem from out of the countryside, before the Passover, so that they could purify themselves.
- (56) So they were seeking Jesus and were speaking one with another, standing in the temple

- and saying, "What do you think, will he at all come up to the festival?"
- (57) Now both the chief priests and the Pharisees had given a command that if anyone knew where he was, he should report it, so they could seize him.

John 12:1-50 MWT

- (1) So six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany where Lazarus was. Lazarus was the one who had died, but whom Jesus raised from the dead.
- (2) So they made him dinner there, and Martha was serving. But Lazarus was one of those reclining to eat with Jesus.
- (3) Then Mary, having taken a [12 oz.] bottle of very valuable perfumed oil, pure spikenard ointment, anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the ointment.
- (4) Therefore one of his disciples (Judas Iscariot, son of Simon Iscariot, the one who was about to betray him) said
- (5) "Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii [i.e., about 300 days' wages] and given to poor?"
- (6) Now he said this, not because he was concerned for the poor, but because he was a thief and was holding the money-bag and was stealing from the things being put in.

- (7) Then Jesus said, "Leave her alone, she has kept this perfume for the day of my burial preparation.
- (8) "For the poor you always have with you, but me you do not always have."
- (9) So a large crowd of the Jews knew that he was there. And they came, not because of Jesus only, but so they could also see Lazarus, whom Jesus raised from the dead.
- (10) Now the chief priests plotted to kill Lazarus also,
- (11) because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and were putting faith in Jesus.
- (12) The next day a large crowd, having come to the festival and having heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,
- (13) took the branches of the palm trees and went out to meet him and began crying out, "We praise you! 'Blessed is the one coming in the name of the Jehovah'—the King of Israel!"

 [Psalm 118:261]
- (14) Now Jesus having found a young donkey, sat on it, just as it has been written,

(26) Blessed be he that cometh in the name of Jehovah. We have blessed you out of the house of Jehovah.

¹ Psalms 118:26 - 1890 Darby

- Zion. Look! Your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt." [Zech $9:9^21$
- (16) But these things his disciples did not understand at first, but when Jesus had been given his glory, [Php 2:9-113] then they remembered that these things had been written about him, and these things they did to him.
- (17) Then the crowd, the ones having been with him, were giving witness that he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead.
- (18) For this reason also the crowd met him, because they heard he had performed this miracle.
- (19) Therefore, the Pharisees said among themselves, "You see that we are getting nowhere. Look! The whole world is following him!"
- (20) Now there were some Greeks among the ones going up to prostrate themselves in worship at the feast.

- (15) "Stop being afraid, daughter of (21) Then these Greeks came to Philip, the one from Bethsaida of Galilee, and were asking him, saying, "Sir, we desire to see Jesus."
 - (22) Philip came and told Andrew, and then Andrew and Philip told Jesus.
 - (23) But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come for the son of man to be glorified.
 - (24) "Most positively, I say to you, unless the grain of wheat, having fallen to the earth, dies, it remains alone. But if it dies, it brings forth much fruit.
 - (25) "The one whose great love is for his own life will lose it, but the one hating his life in this world will keep it in eternal life.
 - (26) "If anyone wants to serve me, let him follow me, and where I am, my servant will be. And if anyone will be my follower, the Father will honor him.
 - (27) "Now my soul has been very much disturbed, and what shall I say—Father, save me from this

- (29) Then the crowd, having been there and heard, were saying it had thundered. Others were saying, "An angel has spoken to him."
- (30) Jesus answered and said, "Not for my sake has this voice come, but for your sakes.
- (31) "Now is the judgment of this world; [Joh 12:48-50] now the ruler of this world will be cast out.⁴
- (32) "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw all people to myself."
- (33) But he was saying this to explain what sort of death he was about to die.
- (34) The crowd answered him, "We heard out of the Law that the Christ remains forever, so how do you say, 'It is necessary for the son of man to be lifted up? Who is this—the son of man?"
- (35) So Jesus said to them, "For yet a little time the light is with you. Be walking about as long

- as you have the light, so that darkness does not overpower you. [John 11:9-10] And the one walking about in the darkness does not know where he is going.
- (36) "As long as you have the light, be believing and trusting in the light, so that you shall become children of light." [Joh 8:12] These things Jesus spoke, and having gone away, he hid from them.
- (37) But even though he had done so many signs for them to see, they were still not believing in him.
- (38) so that the words of Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled, when he said, "Lord, who believed our report? And to whom is the arm of Jehovah revealed?" [Isaiah 53:1]⁵
- (39) On account of this they were not able to be convinced because Isaiah again said,
- (40) "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart [fig., made them stubborn in their inner self] so that they should not see with their eyes and understand with the heart and

- be changed, and I should heal them." [Isaiah 6:10]⁶
- (41) These things Isaiah said when he saw Jehovah's glory and spoke about him. [Isaiah 6:1-8 7 see also Pro 30:4 8]
- (42) Nevertheless, even many among the rulers believed [or, trusted] in him, but because of the Pharisees [religious leaders] they would not confess him publicly, for fear of being expelled from the synagogue.
- (43) For they loved the glory of men more than the glory of God.
- (44) But Jesus cried out and said, "The one putting faith in me does not believe in me alone,

- but also in the One having sent me!
- (45) "And the one who beholds me beholds also the One who sent me.
- (46) "I have come as a light to the world, so that everyone who puts faith in me will not remain in the darkness.
- (47) "And if anyone hears my sayings and does not accept them as truth, I do not judge him, for I did not come to judge the world, but to save the world.
- (48) "The one rejecting me and not putting faith in my teachings has one to judge him—the word

John 13:1-38 MWT

- (7) Jesus answered and said to him, "What I am doing you do not know now, but you will understand after these things."1
- (8) Peter said to him, "By no means will you ever wash my feet?" Jesus answered him, "Unless I wash you, you have no part with me."
- (9) Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also the hands and my head!"
- (10) Jesus said to him, "The one having been bathed does not have need except to have his feet washed, but he is altogether clean. And you men are clean, but not all."
- (11) For he knew the one about to betray him; on account of this he said, "You are not all clean."
- (12) So when he washed their feet and put on his garments, and had reclined with them again, he said, "Do you understand what I have done to you?
- (13) "You call me, 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for I am such.
- (14) "If then I washed your feet as your Lord and Teacher—you

knew it would take time for Peter to understand. Becoming a Christian is a-life long likely an eternal project! If you have faith in Christ Jesus, that is a *good* thing!!! Continue to meditate on his teachings! See verse 38 also.

¹ This verse conveys an attitude toward his listeners which Jesus displayed over and over. He was kind and considerate of the fact that even his disciples did not understand what he was teaching them. In this case, it was not complicated. Still, he

- (16) "Most surely I say to you, a slave is not greater than his lord, nor a messenger [or, an apostle] greater than the one who sent him.
- (17) "If you know these things, happy [or, blessed] are you if you will do them.
- (18) "I do not speak concerning all of you. I know who I chose for myself, but so the Scripture might be fulfilled, 'The one eating bread with me lifted up his heel against me.' [Psalm 41:9]
- (19) "I am telling you before it happens, so that when it does happen you will believe [or, will be convinced] who I am.
- (20) "Most truly I say to you, the one receiving whomever I send, receives me also, and whoever receives me, receives also the One who sent me."
- (21) After saying these things, Jesus became troubled in his spirit and said, "Most surely I say to you that one of you will betray me."

- (22) Therefore, the disciples began looking one at another, being perplexed about who he was speaking.
- (23) Now there was reclining at the meal, against his chest, one of his disciples, the one Jesus loved.
- (24) So Simon Peter motioned to this one to inquire who Jesus was talking about.
- (25) Then that one, having leaned back, said to Jesus, "Lord, who is it?"
- (26) Jesus answered, "That one to whom I, having dipped a piece of bread, will give it." And having dipped the piece of bread, he gave it to Judas Iscariot, son of Simon.
- (27) And after the piece of bread, then Satan entered into that one. Then Jesus said to him, "What you are doing—do it quickly!"

John 14:1-31 MWT

- (1) "Stop letting your hearts be troubled! You believe and trust in God, trust also in me.
- (2) "In the house of my Father are rooms enough, if were not so, I would have told you, because I am going to prepare a place for you.
- (3) "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I am coming again and will receive you to be with me, so that where I am, you also shall be.
- (4) "And you know the way to where I am going."
- (5) Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. And how are we able to know the way?"
- (6) Jesus explained, "I am the way and the truth and the life! No one comes to the Father except through [or, by means of] me!
- (7) "If you had known me, you also would have known my Father, and from now on you know Him and have seen Him."
- (8) Philip says to him, "Lord, show to us the Father, and it is sufficient for us."
- (9) Jesus said to him, "For so long a time have I been with you, and you have not known me, Philip? The one having seen me has seen my Father also, so how do

- you say, 'Show to us the Father?'
- (10) "Do you not believe [or, Are you not convinced] that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The sayings which I speak to you, I do not speak from myself, but the Father who remains in me, does his own works.
- (11) "Have faith in me when I say [I am in union with the Father,] the Father is one with me and I am one with the Father. Even if you have problems believing in my words, believe in me because of the works I do.
- (12) "I tell you for certain, the one trusting in me, will also do the works I do, and greater works than these he will do, because I am going to my Father. [Jesus was leaving the preaching work in the hands of his followers.]
- (13) "And whatever you ask in my name, this I will do. In this way the son brings honor and glory to the Father.
- (14) "I will do whatever you ask in my name.
- (15) "If you love me, keep my commandments.
- (16) "And I will ask the Father, and another Counselor [or, Helper] will be sent to you, so that he will be with you forever.
- (17) "The Spirit of the truth [or knowledge] will help you

- understand. The people of this world cannot receive the spirit of truth, because they don't watch for it or have any interest in it. But you know that spirit, who is with you and will keep on living in you.
- (18) "I will not leave you like orphans; I will come back to you.
- (19) "In a little while the world will no longer be able to see me, but you will see me.¹ And because I live, you will live!
- (20) "In that day you will know that I am one with my Father, and you are one with me and I am one with you.
- (21) "If you love me, you will do what I have said, and you will be loved by my Father. I will also love you and will show you what I am like.²
- (22) Judas said to him (not Iscariot), "Lord, what has

- changed that you are about to be seen by us and not by the world?"
- (23) Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves me, he will obey my word. And my Father will love him, and We will come to him and will dwell with him.3
- (24) "The one who fails to keep my words does not love me. What they have heard me say doesn't really come from me, but from my Father who sent me.
- (25) "These things I have spoken to you while I was dwelling with you.
- (26) "But the Counselor [or, Helper], the Holy Spirit, which the Father will send in my name, that One will teach you all things, and will cause you to remember all the things I said to you.⁴
- (27) "I leave to you peace. My peace I give to you. I give you

¹ The people of the world would soon consider Jesus to be dead. His followers, however, would continue to see him through eyes of faith. (The disciples could actually see Jesus, when he appeared to them after his resurrection. For us today, however, we see Jesus through our faith in his words.) That faint, in turn, grants everlasting life.

² Jesus promised he would show his followers what he is like by means of the "spirit of truth" he would send. That spirit helps his followers understand his Bible teachings as contained in Matthew, Mark,

because he or she first became a friend of Christ Jesus. [John 6:44; John 6:37-38] The Father and Son then apply their spirit to look after and care for their friend!!!

The "spirit of truth" helped John remember, understand, and then to write down what you and I are able to read today. That same spirit can help you understand what Jesus taught us in the four gospel accounts. Isn't that a wonder!!!

- peace the world does not know and cannot give. Stop letting your heart be troubled, and stop being afraid.
- (28) "You remember that I said to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming back to you.' If you truly love me, you would rejoice because I said 'I am going to the Father,' because my Father is greater than I am.
- (29) "And now I have told you before it happens, so that when it does happen, you can believe and have confidence in me. [Jesus was explaining he was about to die.]
- (30) "I will no longer talk much with you, because the ruler of the world is coming, but he has no power over me.⁵
- (31) "Because it is my Father that I obey, so the world will know that I love the Father, and just as the Father commanded me, so I am doing. Get up now, it is time for us to be going from here.

asserted Herod tried to free Jesus because Satan realized, as Jesus was about to die, it was bad for Satan if Christ died. That is, of course, total speculation. We can't know if Herod's actions were initiated because he was a righteous man, or because he was being influenced by Satan. We can have faith in Christ Jesus as God's son and our savior!

⁵ Some might ask: Satan put Jesus to death, didn't that indicate he had power over him? Jesus allowed himself to be put to death, for our benefit. [Joh 6:51 & 7:30 & 10:17-18] Satan would not have been able to do harm to the son of God if it had not been allowed. Jesus Christ, including his sacrificial death, was all part of God's perfect plan announced back in the Garden of Eden. (Gen 3:15) Some have

John 15:1-27 MWT

- I am the true grapevine, and my Father is the keeper of the vineyard.
- (2) "Every branch in me which does not bear fruit, He takes it away; and every branch bearing fruit, He prunes clean, so that it will bear more fruit.
- (3) "Already you have been pruned clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.
- (4) "Abide in [or stay joined to] me, and I in you. Just as the branch is not able bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you, unless you abide in me.1
- (5) "I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who abides in me and me in him, this one bears much fruit, because apart from me you are not able to do anything.
- (6) "If anyone does not stay joined to me, he will be thrown away. Such ones are like dry branches that are gathered up and thrown in a fire.
- (7) "Stay joined to me and let my teachings become part of you. Then you can pray for whatever

- you want and it will happen to you.
- (8) "When you become fruitful disciples of mine, my Father will be honored.
- (9) "Just as the Father has loved me, I also have loved you; remain in my love.
- (10) "If you obey my teachings, you will remain in my love; just as I have obeyed my Father, and thus remain in His love.
- (11) "I have told you these things so my joy in you may continue, and so your joy may be made full.
- (12) "This, then, is my commandment: That you love one another, just as I loved you.
- (13) "Greater love has no man than this; that he should lay down his life on behalf of his friends.
- (14) "You are my friends, if you are doing what I command you.
- (15) "No longer do I call you slaves, because the slave does not know what his lord does. But I have called you friends because all I have heard from my Father, I made known to you.
- (16) "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you,

- "These things I have told you, so that you will not be offended, so as to cause you to stumble.
- (2) "They will expel you from their religious meeting places, and an hour is coming when everyone who kills you will imagine he is offering a sacred service to God.
- (3) "They will do these things because they did not know the Father nor me.
- (4) "But these things I have told you so that when the hour comes, you will remember them, and that I told them to you. But I didn't say these things to you from the beginning because I was with you.
- (5) "But now I am going away to the One who sent me, and none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?'
- (6) "But because of the things I have said, sorrow has filled your heart.

- (27) "For the Father Himself affectionately loves you, because you have affectionately loved me, and you have accepted as true that I came forth from God.
- (28) "I came forth from the Father and have come into the world. Again I am leaving the world and am going to the Father."
- (29) His disciples said to Him, "Listen! Now you are speaking plainly, and you are not talking to us in figures of speech.
- (30) "At last we know that you understand everything, and we don't have any more questions. By this we believe [or, have become convinced] that you came forth from God."
- (31) Jesus answered them, "And so now are you *really* believing?
- (32) "Listen! An hour is coming, and now has come, that you will be scattered, each to his own, and you will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone, because the Father is with me.
- (33) "These things I have spoken to you, so that in me you can have peace [or, freedom from anxiety]. In the world you are having tribulation, but take courage, I have conquered the world!"

John 17:1-26 MWT

- (1) After Jesus had finished speaking to his disciples, he looked up toward heaven and prayed: Father, the hour has come for you to bring glory to your son, so that your son may also bring glory to you.
- (2) You have given him authority over all people, so he can give eternal life to everyone you have given to him. [Joh 6:44 & 6:37-38]
- (3) And this means everlasting life, for them to take in knowledge of you, the only true God, and to know Jesus Christ, the one you sent forth.¹
- (4) I have brought glory to you here on earth by doing everything you gave me to do.
- (5) Now, Father, let me have back the glory that I had with you before the world was created.
- (6) You have given me some followers from this world, and I have given them your name and showed them what you are like. [Mat 11:27 ~ Joh 6:44] They

- were yours, but you gave them to me, and they have joined me in obeying you.
- (7) It is clear to them that you gave me everything I have.
- (8) I told my followers what you told me, and they have taken it to heart. They know that I came from you, and they believe that you are the one who sent me.
- (9) My prayer is for them, but not for those who belong to this world. My followers belong to you, and I am praying for them.
- (10) All that I have is yours, and all that you have is mine, and my followers will bring glory to me.
- (11) Holy Father, I am no longer in the world. I am coming to you, but my followers are still in the world. So keep them safe by the power of your great name. Then they will be one with each other, just as you and I are one.
- (12) While I was with them, I kept them safe by the power you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost, except the one who had to be lost. [Joh 6:64-71] This

that many today claim to know Christ Jesus, while refusing to recognize his Father Jehovah? If so, in light of John 17:3, can they really say they know his Father? [(Matthew 7:23) ²³ And yet then I will confess to them: I never knew you! Get away from me, you workers of lawlessness.]

¹ There is an important point being made here by Jesus. Remember, many of his early followers were Jewish converts. The Jews claimed to know Jehovah, as they were students of the Old Testament, [John 8:38-41] but they refused to recognize his son Christ Jesus. That meant they really didn't know Jehovah either. Is it possible

- happened so that what the Scriptures say, would come true.
- (13) I am coming to you. But I say these things while I am still in the world, so that my followers will have the same joy that I do.
- (14) I have told them your message. But the people of this world hate them, because they don't belong to this world, just as I don't.
- (15) Father, I don't ask you to take my followers out of the world, but to protect them from the evil one.
- (16) They don't belong to this world any more than I do.
- (17) Your word is the truth. So let this truth I give them make them completely yours.
- (18) I am sending them into the world, just as you sent me.
- (19) I have given myself completely for their sake, so that they can belong completely to [or build their lives around] the truth.
- (20) I am not praying just for these followers. I am also praying for everyone else who will have faith because of what my followers will teach them about me.
- (21) I want all of them to be one with each other, just as I am one with you and you are one with me. I also want them to be one

- with us. Then the people of this world will believe and know that you sent me.
- (22) I have given honor to my followers in the same way that you honored me, in order that they may be one with each other, just as we are one.
- (23) I am magnified in them, and you are magnified in me, so that they may become completely one. Then this world's people will know that you sent me. They will also know that you love my followers as much as you love me.
- (24) Father, I want everyone you have given me to be with me, wherever I am. Then they will see the glory that you have given me, because you loved me before the world was created.
- (25) Good Father, the people of this world don't know you. But I know you, and my followers know that you sent me.
- (26) I told them what you are like, and I will tell them even more. Then the love that you have for me will become part of them, and I will be one with them.

John 18:1-40 MWT

- (1) When Jesus finished praying, he went out with his disciples and crossed the valley of Kidron, where he entered into a garden.
- (2) Jesus frequently gathered there with his disciples, so Judas knew where the place was.
- (3) Judas had promised to betray Jesus, so he went there and took some Roman soldiers and attendants from the chief priests and Pharisees. They came there with lanterns and torches and weapons.
- (4) So Jesus, knowing the things that were going to happen, went out and said to them, "Whom are you seeking?"
- (5) They answered him, "Jesus the Nazarene." Jesus said to them, "I am he!" Now also Judas, the one having betrayed him, was standing there with them.
- (6) So when Jesus said to them, "I am he," they stepped backward and fell to the ground.
- (7) Therefore, he again questioned them, "Whom are you seeking?" And they said, "Jesus the Nazarene."
- (8) Jesus answered, "I said to you, 'I am he.' If then you are seeking me, allow these men to be going their way,"

- (9) so that the word should be fulfilled which he had spoken, "Those you have given to me, I did not lose even one of them." [John 17:12]
- (10) Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's slave and cut off his right ear. Now the name of the slave was Malchus.
- (11) So Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword away! I must drink from the cup which the Father has given me."
- (12) Then the detachment of soldiers with their commanding officer, and the attendants of the Jews, arrested Jesus and bound Him.
- (13) And they led him away first to Annas, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year.
- (14) Now Caiaphas was the one who advised the Jews that it was advantageous for one person to perish on behalf of the people. [John 11:49,50]
- (15) And Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. Now that disciple was known to the high priest and he entered with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest.
- (16) But Peter had stayed at the gate outside. Therefore, the other disciple who was known to the high priest came back and

- spoke to the female doorkeeper, and he brought Peter in.
- (17) Then the slave-girl, the doorkeeper, said to Peter, "You are not also one of the disciples of this man, are you?" He said, "I am not."
- (18) Now the slaves and the courtyard attendants who were standing there, made a charcoal fire, because it was cold, and they were warming themselves. Now Peter was standing there with them, also warming himself.
- (19) Then the priest questioned Jesus concerning his disciples and concerning his teaching or doctrine.
- (20) Jesus answered him, "I have spoken in public and in front of the whole world; I always taught in a synagogue and in the temple, where the Jews are always coming together, and I spoke nothing in secret.
- (21) "Why are you questioning me? Why aren't you asking the ones who heard me? Listen! They know what I said."
- (22) So when Jesus had said these things, one of the attendants standing by gave him a blow, saying, "That's no way to answer the priest."
- (23) Jesus answered him, "If I spoke so as to do something

- wrong, say what wrong I did, but if not, why do you strike me?"
- (24) Annas then sent him, still being bound, to Caiaphas the high priest.
- (25) Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. So they said to him, "You are not also one of his disciples, are you?" Then Peter denied it and said, "I am not."
- (26) One of the slaves of the high priest, being a relative the man whose ear Peter cut off, said, "I saw you in the garden with him, did I not?"
- (27) Once more Peter denied him. And immediately a rooster crowed. [cp. John 13:38]
- (28) Then they lead Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium [Fortified Palace] where the Roman Governor stayed. By now it was early morning. The crowd waited outside, because any Jew who entered would become defiled, and so would not be able to eat the Passover.
- (29) Therefore, Pilate went out to them and said, "What accusation are you bringing against this man?"
- (30) They answered and said to him, "If this man were not an evil doer and a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you."

- (31) So Pilate said to them, "You take him yourselves and judge him according to your own law." Then the Jews said to him, "We are not allowed [by Roman law] to put anyone to death,"
- (32) (so that what Jesus had said about his death would soon come true that he would be lifted up according to Roman practice). [see John 12:32,33]
- (33) Therefore, Pilate entered into the Fortified Palace again and called Jesus and said to Him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"
- (34) Jesus answered him, "Do you say this from yourself, or did others tell you about me?"
- (35) Pilate answered, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your nation and the chief priests handed you over to me. What did you do?"
- (36) Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my attendants would fight, so I would not be handed over to the Jews, but now my kingdom is not from this world."
- (37) Then Pilate said to him, "So then, are you a king?" Jesus answered, "You yourself say that I am a king. For this purpose I have been born, and for this purpose I have come into the world, so that I should bear witness to the truth.

- Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice."
- (38) Pilate said to Him, "What is truth?" And having said this, he again went out to the Jews and said to them, "I find no grounds for accusation or any fault in this man. [Joh 19:6]
- (39) "But there is a custom that I release to you one person at the Passover. Do you want me to release to you the King of the Jews?"
- (40) Therefore, they all cried out again, and said, "Not this one, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a terrorist.

John 19:1-42 MWT

- (1) So Pilate then gave orders for Jesus to be beaten with a whip.
- (2) The soldiers made a crown out of thorn branches and put it on Jesus. And they put a purple robe on him.
- (3) They kept saying to him, "Hail, the king of the Jews!" They also hit him with their fists.
- (4) Once again Pilate went out to the Jews. This time he said, "I bring Jesus out to you again, so you can see and know for yourselves that I have not found him guilty of anything."
- (5) Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said, "See, here is the man!"
- (6) When the chief priests and their attendants saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "You take him and crucify him! I don't find him guilty of anything."
- (7) The Jews replied, "He claimed to be the Son of God! Our Jewish Law says he must be put to death."
- (8) When Pilate heard this, he was terrified.

- (9) He went back inside and asked Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus did not answer.
- (10) "Why don't you answer my question?" Pilate asked. "Don't you know that I have the power to let you go free or to crucify you?"
- (11) Jesus replied, "If God did not allow you the power, you couldn't do anything at all to me. But the one who handed me over to you did the worse thing."
- (12) Then Pilate even more so wanted to set Jesus free. But the crowd again cried out, "If you set this man free, you are no friend of Caesar! Anyone who claims to be a king makes himself an enemy of the Emperor."
- (13) When Pilate heard this, he brought Jesus out. Then he sat down on the judge's bench at the place known as "The Stone Pavement." In Hebrew this pavement is called "Gabbatha."
- (14) It was about noon on the day before Passover, and Pilate said to the crowd, "Look, your king!"
- (15) "Kill him! Kill him!" they yelled. "Crucify him!" "So you want me to crucify your king?" Pilate asked. The chief priests replied, "We have no king but Caesar!"

¹ Jehovah God, of course, gave the Jews no such law!

- (16) Then Pilate handed Jesus over to be crucified. Jesus was taken away,
- (17) and he carried his stauros² to a place known as "The Skull." In Hebrew this place is called "Golgotha."
- (18) There Jesus was crucified, and on each side of him a man was also crucified.
- (19) Pilate ordered the charge brought against Jesus by the Jews be written on a board and

- put on the stauros. (see footnote 2 above) It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews."
- (20) The words were written in Hebrew, and Latin, and Greek. Now the place where Jesus was taken wasn't far from the city, and many of the Jewish people read the charge against him.
- (21) So the chief priests went to Pilate and said, "Why did you write that he is King of the Jews? You should have written

² Stauros: The Modern World Translation uses the original Greek word which translates to either stake or cross in English. We do this to make an important point. (First, however, the definition of stauros: "In Homerian and classical Greek, until the 4th century BC, stauros always meant an upright stake, [or] pole... upon which anything could be hung... It never means two pieces of timber placed across each other at any angle, but always one piece alone." (Wickipedia) Vines', Thayer's, and Strong's Bible study reference materials all concur, defining stauros as stake.) That said, there is some debate (a debate which is very serious to many people) over precisely what the Greek Word stauros means. Many actually build their faith around using "cross" as "the only acceptable" English meaning. This translation, therefore, simply uses the original Greek word "stauros" in these verses rather than either of the English translations: Stake or cross. The important point we make in doing so? Be careful not to allow your study of God's word, and your building faith in it, to be derailed in worrying about (and certainly in arguing

about) details that have little or no impact on faith: In this case, being overly concerned with the definition of a single word, and with precisely what the implement of our Lord's death looked like. The Bible makes clear, Christ died to buy us life, and he was killed by the sadistic practice of crucifixion. There is danger in taking a stand in any of such arguments, if you are not absolutely sure the Bible takes your same stand! [(1 Corinthians 4:6) ⁶ Now, brothers, because of your pride in one of us over another. I have taken Apollos and myself an example of these things, because you must learn the rule: Do not go beyond what is contained in the Holy Writings," in order that you may not get puffed up individually in favor of the one against the other, thinking some are better than the others.] You must learn what your Bible really teaches, while being careful not to learn what people say it teaches. [(Acts 17:11) Now the latter were more noble-minded than those in Thessalonica, for they received the word with the greatest eagerness of mind, carefully examining the Scriptures daily as to whether these things were true.]

- that, 'He *claimed* to be King of the Jews.' "
- (22) But Pilate told them, "What I have written will not be changed!"
- (23) After the soldiers had nailed Jesus to the stauros, (see footnote 2 above) they divided his clothes into four parts, one for each of them. But his outer garment was made from a single piece of cloth, and it was seamless.
- (24) The soldiers said to each other, "Let's not rip it apart. Let us cast lots to see who gets it." This happened so that the Scriptures would come true, which say, "They divided up my clothes and gambled for my garments." The soldiers then did this.
- (25) Jesus' mother stood beside his stauros, (see footnote 2 above) with her sister and Mary the wife of Clopas. Mary Magdalene was standing there also.
- (26) When Jesus saw his mother and his favorite disciple with her, he said to his mother, "This man is now your son."

- (27) Then he said to the disciple, "She is now your mother." From then on, that disciple took her into his own home.
- (28) Jesus knew that he had now finished all the work his Father had given him. And in order to fulfill the Scriptures, he said, "I am thirsty!"
- (29) A jar of wine vinegar was there. Someone then soaked a sponge with the vinegar and held it up to Jesus' mouth on the stem of a hyssop plant.
- (30) After Jesus drank the vinegar, he said, "Everything is done!" He bowed his head and died.
- (31) The next day would be a great Sabbath, meaning both the Sabbath and the Passover fell on the same day. The Jewish people did not want the bodies to stay on the stauros (see footnote 2 above) during the Sabbath. So they asked Pilate to break the men's legs (which would speed their death) and take their bodies down.
- (32) The soldiers first broke the legs of the other two men who were nailed there.

- (33) When they came to Jesus, however, they saw that he was already dead, and they did not break his legs.
- (34) One of the soldiers stuck his spear into Jesus' side, and blood and water came out.
- (35) We know this is true, because it was reported by someone who was an eye witness. He gives witness so you can have faith too.
- (36) All this happened so that the Scriptures would come true, which say, "No bone of his body will be broken"⁴
- (37) and another scripture says, "They will look upon the one in whose side they stuck a spear."5
- (38) Joseph of Arimathea was one of Jesus' disciples. He had kept it secret though, because he was afraid of the Jewish

- leaders. He asked Pilate to let him have Jesus' body. Pilate gave him permission, and Joseph took it down.
- (39) Nicodemus also came with about seventy-five pounds of spices of myrrh and aloes. This was the same Nicodemus who had visited Jesus by night.
- (40) The two men wrapped the body in a linen cloth, together with the spices, which was how the Jews buried their dead.
- (41) In the place where Jesus had been crucified, there was a garden with a tomb that had never been used.
- (42) The tomb was nearby, and since it was the time to prepare for the Sabbath, they hurried to put Jesus' body there.

- ⁴ Exodus 12:43-46 LITV
- (43) And Jehovah said to Moses and Aaron, This *is* the ordinance of the Passover [lamb]. No stranger may eat of it.
- (44) And every man's slave, a purchase of silver, you shall circumcise him, then he may eat of it.
- (45) A foreigner and a hired servant may not eat of it.
- (46) It shall be eaten in one house. You shall not carry any of the flesh outside from the house. <u>And you shall not</u> break a bone in it.

- (19) Many are the adversities of the righteous, but Jehovah delivereth him out of them all:
- (20) <u>He keepeth all his bones; not one of them is broken.</u>

- (10) And I will send down on the family of David and on the people of Jerusalem the spirit of grace and of prayer; and their eyes will be turned to the one who was pierced by their own hands: and they will be weeping for him as for an only begotten son, and their grief for him will be bitter, like the grief of one sorrowing for his firstborn son.

John 20:1-31 MWT

- (1) Three days later, on the first day of the week [Sunday] while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance.
- (2) She ran to Simon Peter and to Jesus' favorite disciple and said, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb! We don't know where they have put him."
- (3) Peter and the other disciple went out, and started for the tomb.
- (4) They ran side by side, until the other disciple outran Peter and got there first.
- (5) He bent over and saw the strips of linen cloth lying inside the tomb, but he did not go in.
- (6) When Simon Peter got there, he went into the tomb and saw the strips of cloth.
- (7) He also saw the piece of cloth that had been used to cover Jesus' face. It was rolled up and laid by itself.
- (8) The disciple who got there first also went into the tomb, and when he saw it, he believed.
- (9) At that time Peter and the other disciple did not yet know that the Scriptures said Jesus would have to be raised from the dead.

- (10) So the two of them went back to the other disciples.
- (11) Mary Magdalene stood crying outside the tomb. While she was still weeping, she stooped down
- (12) and saw two angels inside. They were dressed in white and were sitting where Jesus' body had been. One was seated at the head and the other was at the foot.
- (13) The angels asked Mary, "Why are you crying?" She answered, "They have taken my Lord's body away! I don't know where they have put him."
- (14) As soon as Mary said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there. But she did not know who he was.
- (15) Jesus asked her, "Woman, why are you crying? Who are you looking for?" She thought he was the gardener and said, "Sir, if you have taken his body away, please tell me, so I can go and get him."
- (16) Then Jesus said to her,
 "Mary!" She turned and said to
 him, "Rabboni." The Hebrew
 word "Rabboni" means
 "Teacher."
- (17) Jesus told her, "Don't be clinging to me! I have not yet gone to my Father. But tell my disciples that I am going to the one who is my Father and my

- God, as well as your Father and your God."¹
- (18) Mary Magdalene then went and told the disciples she had seen the Lord. She also told them what he said to her.
- (19) The disciples were afraid of the Jewish leaders, and so on the evening of that same Sunday, they locked themselves in a room. Suddenly, Jesus appeared in the middle of the group saying peace to you
- (20) and he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they rejoiced.
- (21) After Jesus had greeted them again, he said, "I am sending you, just as the Father has sent me."²

- (22) Having said this, he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit.³ [John 14:15-17]
- (23) If you forgive anyone's sins, they will be forgiven. But if you don't forgive their sins, they will not be forgiven."
- (24) Thomas the Twin was one of the twelve disciples, but he wasn't with the others when Jesus appeared to them.
- (25) So they told him, "We have seen the Lord!" But Thomas said, "First, I must see the nail scars in his hands and touch them with my finger. I must put my hand where the spear went into his side. I won't believe unless I do this!"
- (26) A week later the disciples were together again. This time, Thomas was with them. Jesus

¹ This is one of several verses where Jesus explained to his disciples they would have a new relationship with God after his resurrection. They would be able to approach Jehovah directly, on the basis of their faith in Jesus as God's son. [Joh 16:23-27]

² If you are a true lover and follower of Christ Jesus, that is the command he left you: That you display love for others by telling them about his Father, just as Jesus told us about Him.

- came in while the doors were still locked and stood in the middle of the group. He greeted his disciples
- (27) and said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and look at my hands! Put your hand into my side. Stop doubting and have faith!"
- (28) Thomas replied, "You are my Lord and my God!"
- (29) Jesus said, "Thomas, do you have faith because you have seen me? Blessed are those people who have faith in me without seeing me!"
- (30) Jesus worked many other miracles for his disciples. Not all of them are written in this book.
- (31) But these are written so that you will put your faith in Jesus as the Messiah and as the Son of God. If you have faith in him, you will have everlasting life.

John 21:1-25 MWT

- Jesus later appeared to his disciples along the shore of Lake Tiberias.
- (2) Simon Peter, Thomas the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, and the brothers James and John were there, together with two other disciples.
- (3) Simon Peter said, "I'm going fishing!" The others said, "We are going with you." They went out in their boat. But they didn't catch a thing all night.
- (4) Early the next morning Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not recognize who he was.
- (5) Jesus called to them, "My dear children, have you caught anything?" "No!" they answered.
- (6) So he told them, "Let your net down on the right side of your boat, and you will catch some." They did, and the net was so full of fish that they could not drag it into the boat.
- (7) Jesus' favorite disciple told Peter, "It's the Lord!" When Simon heard that it was the Lord, he girded his outer garment about himself, for he had taken off his clothes while he was working. Then he jumped into the sea.
- (8) The boat was only about a hundred yards from shore. So

- the other disciples stayed in the boat and dragged the net full of fish to shore.
- (9) When the disciples got out of the boat, they saw some bread and a charcoal fire with fish on it.
- (10) Jesus told his disciples, "Bring some of the fish you just caught."
- (11) Simon Peter got back into the boat and dragged the net to shore. In it were one hundred fifty-three large fish, but still their net had not ripped.
- (12) Jesus said to them, "Come and eat!" But none of the disciples dared ask who he was. They knew he was the Lord.
- (13) Jesus took the bread in his hands and gave some of it to his disciples. He did the same with the fish.
- (14) This was the third time that Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from death.
- (15) When Jesus and his disciples had finished eating, he asked, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?" Simon Peter answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I do!" "Feed my lambs," Jesus said.
- (16) Jesus asked a second time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter answered, "Yes, Lord, you know I love you!"

- "Then take care of my sheep," Jesus told him.
- (17) Jesus asked a third time,
 "Simon son of John, do you love
 me?" Peter was hurt because
 Jesus had asked him three
 times if he loved him. So he told
 Jesus, "Lord, you know
 everything. You know I love
 you." Jesus replied, "Feed my
 sheep.
- (18) I tell you for certain that when you were a young man, you dressed yourself and went wherever you wanted to go. But when you are old, you will hold out your hands so others will wrap your belt around you and lead you where you don't want to go."
- (19) Jesus said this to tell how Peter would die in bringing honor to God. Then he said to Peter, "Follow me!"
- (20) Peter turned and saw Jesus' favorite disciple following them. He was the same one who had sat next to Jesus at the meal and had asked, "Lord, who is going to betray you?"
- (21) When Peter saw that disciple, he asked Jesus, "Lord, what about him?"
- (22) Jesus answered, "What is that to you, if I want him to live until I return? You must follow me."
- (23) So the rumor spread among the disciples that the disciple

- whom Jesus most loved would not die. But Jesus did not say he would not die. He simply said, "What is it to you, if I want him to live until I return?"
- (24) This disciple is the one who told all of this. He wrote it, and we know he is telling the truth.
- (25) Jesus did many other things, such that if they were all written in books, I don't suppose there would be room enough in the whole world to hold them all.

If you have read the Bible book of John, and re-read it enough to become familiar with Jesus's teachings (and that is something you certainly should do *for yourself*), then you have become aware Jesus came to make disciples. He seeks disciples who will follow him in obedience to his Father. [Joh 14:23-24 & 5:19 & 5:30 & 6:44-47 & 12:49] He came to make disciples who would also, in turn, make new disciples. [Joh 20:21 & 15:1-2] This book, with footnotes, is written to help awaken all people to that simple truth. The attempt is to direct them to the Bible as the one and only source of hope and faith. Do **you know** Christ Jesus?

Be aware! This is not overly simple material. (Heb 5:11-14)



Luke 17:30&37

Our guess is everyone will answer yes to that question, or will try. Would

you consider, however, something Jesus said that should make us all, every single one of us, seriously evaluate our answer to that question? Jesus said of "the last day," or "judgment day": (Matthew 7:22, 23) 22 Many will say to me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and expel demons in your name, and perform many powerful works in your name?' 23 And yet then I will confess to them: I never knew you! Get away from me, you workers of lawlessness. Jesus also said: (Luke 13:24-28) 24 "Exert yourselves vigorously to get in through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will seek to get in but will not be able, 25 when once the householder has got up and locked the door, and you start to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Sir, open to us.' But in answer he will say to you, 'I do not know where you are from.' 26 Then you will start saying, 'We ate and drank in front of you, and you taught in our broad ways.' 27 But he will speak and say to you, 'I do not know where you are from. Get away from me, all you workers of unrighteousness! 28 There is where your weeping and the gnashing of your teeth will be, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, but yourselves thrown outside."

Is a consideration of those scriptures a little unsettling for you? If they don't make you reflect on who you are in your inner person, the person Christ Jesus sees you to be, it might not speak well of you! (Jas 1:22-25) Jesus is talking in Mat. 7, and Luke 13 about men and women who would feel justified in approaching him, actually thinking (or maybe just wishing) they were about to receive help. The fact they were rejected by him should lead us all to ask ourselves the very same question: Do I really know Christ Jesus?

In reflecting on any scriptural matter, it often helps to consider excerpts [or stories] from the Hebrew Scriptures [or Old testament - OT]. The Bible says the Jewish Law Code is a tutor leading to the Christ. (Gal 3:23-25) The Law made clear our need for the Messiah, and the OT's many prophecies gave information to help identify him when he arrived. The OT also provides the ancestry of the Messiah. We can really think of the whole of the Hebrew Scriptures, then, as a tutor leading to the Christ. In Genesis 3:15, after our first parents joined Satan in giving birth to rebellion and sin, God promised He would raise up a seed from the woman (Joh 5:25-27; please note verse 27) who would crush Satan's head. After the OT concludes, in the first four Bible Books of the Christian Greek Scriptures (or New Testament - NT), Jesus appeared, presenting himself in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John as that promised Jewish Messiah.

In evaluating our own relationship with Christ, one of the stories from the Old Testament we'll do well to consider is one about a man who thought he knew King David of old. The ancient nation of Israel was prominently used by God in the lineage leading to the

Messiah. For a period of time, God used men to govern Israel who would sit representatively on God's throne, ruling His nation of people. David was the second of those earthly kings. Although David committed some grave and serious sins, he was known as a man of outstanding faithfulness during most all of his life. To one of the forefathers of King David, God had expanded on and clarified the Messianic promise He gave us at Genesis 3:15. He pledged to faithful Abraham that all the nations of the earth would be blessed by means of Abraham's seed. (Gen 22:18) The primary seed of Abraham, the individual who would bless all the peoples of the earth, was Christ Jesus. (Gal 3:8) Christ was born of Abraham through the line of King David. King David's rule proved a blessing to God's nation, and by helping people from other nations know Jehovah, David blessed those nations as well. On a smaller scale than what Christ would do, and for a few years, the prophecy to Abraham was fulfilled in King David. Because of David's great loyalty to God, God promised the appearance of the one who some scholars refer to as the Greater David, as God said He would appoint one to sit on David's throne forever. (Isa 9:7) Again, it is Christ Jesus who is the one appointed to sit forever on David's throne. (Lu 1:32-33) King David loved the truth. That is to say, he loved God's Word. (Ps 119:97-112) Our king Christ Jesus also loves the truth. (Luke 4:16-21) A reasonable question is, do you love the truth? (Joh 10:29) Can you really say you know Jesus if you don't? Do you recognize, and are you able to share, the same wondrous joy Jesus had in his expression at John 10:29: His soul stirring expression that what his Father had given him is "greater than all

other things"? (Joh 6:38-40; Joh 17:17; Joh 17:6-8) Jesus said everything his Father had was his. (Joh 16:15a) What could be the thing given Jesus, then, that was greater than all other things? It was the wondrous opportunity to glorify his Father's name! (Joh 12:27-28; Joh 7:18) Jesus said he came to make his Father's name known. (Joh 17:25-26) He said it was his purpose in life. (Joh 18:37; Joh 17:3-5) He said his food (or what sustained him) was to do his Father's will. (Joh 4:34) Long ago, Satan told all creation God was a liar and that He was bad. Satan said God was withholding good things from his children. (Gen 3:1-5) The knowledge and opportunity for Jesus to clear his Father's name of that reproach, then, is the gift that is "greater than all other things." (Joh 17:26) Jesus, in turn, gives us you the opportunity to share in that work of exposing the lies Satan attached to our Father's name. (Joh 17:7-8) That you can personally know and have a relationship with our heavenly Father through your faith in his son (Joh 16:26-27), that is available to you through Jesus's teachings. (Mat 11:27) Share it by simply talking with others about what you learn from the Bible.

David was a good king, and the nation prospered under his forty year rule. Him being an outstanding king over <u>Jehovah's</u> nation of people makes it easy to understand why God would use him as a prefigure of our king, <u>Christ Jesus</u>. That <u>knowledge helps us understand</u> why we can wisely look to the following example in David's life, so as to help us understand these people whom Jesus condemned. It can help us understand how these people could think they knew Jesus when they didn't.

To really comprehend and benefit from this drama taken from David's life [which story God had recorded for us in the Bible (2 Pet 1:21)] we also need to know King Saul. Saul ruled before David as the first king of Israel. Both kings were specifically chosen and anointed by Jehovah as kings over his nation. (1 Sam 9:16-17 & 10:1; 1 Sam 16:11-13) Saul started out as an excellent king, but later became arrogant and disrespectful of God. Finally, he used his moral freedom to become bad, and he was rejected by Jehovah. (1 Sam 15:26) Very different from Saul, David became more and more faithful to Jehovah all through his life.

David first appears on the Bible scene during Saul's rule, during a war with the Philistines. David, as a young man, was sent by his father to where the armies were drawn up in battle, to carry supplies to his brothers serving in the army. It was at that time the Philistine giant, Goliath, came out to taunt the battle lines of Israel, asking what champion they would bring forth to do battle with him. David was shocked that no one replied. David viewed this spiritual enemy of the God he worshipped, and the God whom had already come to know, as a mere dog. (Remember: David served Jehovah as a Jew, and God had clearly identified that Jewish nation as his servants. God helped his people fight against the enemies of His arrangement for their day. Christianity is very different. Christians do not kill God's enemies, or even judge who they are. Learn what Jesus taught!) David said he would strike Goliath down. David's killing of Goliath put him in good stead with Saul and he became Saul's attendant. (1 Samuel 17:1-18:5)

Over the years that followed, as Saul turned away from Jehovah and chose badness, his love for David turned first to jealousy and then to hatred. For years after that, Saul hunted David like an animal trying to kill him. On two different occasions during the years Saul hunted David, David had opportunity to kill Saul. Although David was having to flee from Saul, and David had publicly cried out in front of the armies of both of them that Jehovah would strike Saul down for seeking David's life, David would not personally do him harm. "How could I thrust out my hand against the anointed of Jehovah," David asked, "and come away unharmed?" (1 Samuel 24:2-15) David loved Jehovah, and trusted in God to deal with wicked Saul. David did not hide Saul's sin. He told everyone Jehovah would strike Saul down for his wickedness, but David would not personally do him harm! David loved Saul and likely hoped Saul would heed David's warning and turn back from his bad way. (1 Samuel 26:1-25) (David thus manifest the Christian spirit toward Saul, before he had benefit of Christ's teachings.)

Finally, though, Saul went up in battle against the Philistines and an archer's arrow found him. Fatally wounded, and in fear his enemies would find him alive and abuse him, Saul asked his armor bearer to put him to death. When the man refused, Saul fell upon his own sword and killed himself. (1 Samuel 31:1-6)

Now we come to the import of this scriptural consideration, and to the Bible example we encourage you to consider. Three days after Saul's death, a young man came to King David to report. Possibly hearing about, or even having witnessed what happened to King Saul, and knowing how Saul had hunted David for years seeking to

kill him, this young man thought he knew David. He emboldened himself to tell David Saul had been wounded, and had asked him to put him to death. It was apparently not true, but he no doubt imagined his skewed or embellished view of events would bring him favor with David. The young Amalekite man told David he had heeded Saul's request, and had killed him. David then asked the man who he was. This might have been an opportunity for the young man to plead ignorance for what he had done. Still not knowing David, however, the young man proudly volunteered he was an alien resident of Israel. As a resident, he should have known the Law Code and how important it was when a man was anointed as king directly by Jehovah God. David then ordered one of his attendants to strike the young man down, because he had testified out of his own mouth he had put the anointed of Jehovah to death. (2 Samuel 1:1-16)

This young man thought he knew David, but he learned, at the cost of his very life, that he didn't know David at all! He had heard the things people had told him about David. He imagined that meant he knew David. The man should not have made the leap to think he knew David intimately, because of what he had heard people say about him. If he was going to put himself in a relationship with David that required he know him intimately, he should have been very serious about being sure he really did know him. Before we were even born, we were all put in such a relationship with our king Christ Jesus. It is a relationship that requires we know him intimately. Like the young Amalekite man, we are responsible to be

sure we aren't just claiming to know Jesus based on what others have told us about him. They may be well meaning but wrong!

Do you consider, then, the importance of evaluation whether you really and truly know our king, Christ Jesus? Do you understand what it requires on your part to be certain you do know him? Those individuals Jesus talked about, those who would approach him saying they had cast out demons in his name, they thought they knew him, but they really didn't.

How could they have deceived themselves so? That's an easy answer: they didn't know what the Bible teaches. (Mark 12:24) They hadn't listened to what Jesus really taught. That is what modern day religion is stealing away from their members. They find young any people who are sincerely interested in learning about God, and then steer them aside to being concerned with membership in their group. Membership in any of such varied groups is useless! You must personally seat yourself at Jesus's feet and listen to what he taught. Don't waste your time seating yourself at the feet of men, by heeding their teachings, or at our feet for that matter. Please prove that what we say comes from the Bible. (Acts 17:11) What Jesus actually taught is contained in the four short books by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and the Apostle John. Read them! Sit at Jesus's feet by reading those books over and over; until you are familiar with what he taught. Then, YOU will know Christ Jesus; And you will know you know him. When someone claims Jesus said some thing or the other, you will be able to say "Amen!" or to ignore ignorant speech when there is no Bible support. (Gal 1:8-9)

Bible knowledge sets any person in possession of it free of the malicious and deceitful intentions of others, as well as helping them overcome their own weaknesses and sinful inclinations. Knowledge of truth sets us all free, if we will simply listen to what Jesus taught, and then do our best to live accordingly. Don't imagine you know what Jesus taught if you haven't personally taken the effort to read his teachings for your-own-self!

It ain't rocket science! It's a simple and beautiful solution to all problems. It is the Bible truth!

A related point we are well served to understand: Organizations don't worship God. It is individuals who worship God! (Some will, of course, then assert all followers of Christ *do indeed* comprise an organization. That is true only in the sense they make themselves part of, or join themselves to, God's organization in heaven.) Our point is this: no memberships among men represent those loved by God. Approved membership judgments rendered by men are the supreme manifestation of class distinction. In the mind of those who render such judgments, memberships judge between those who are loved by God (or at least those who are approved by him) and those who are not. It is the opposite of the teaching by Christ Jesus to "let him who is without sin cast the first stone." (John 8:1-11)

Remember, if you give your assertion that others of some "group" are righteous, you take responsibility for what they are doing.

Organizational worship was exemplified in Judaism, and when one

did wrong under their group worship, they were all responsible. (Joshua 7:4-26) But it is individuals who worship God acceptably in our day! Among other things Jesus came to do, he came to help us understand that simple truth. In trying to scripturally verify that is true (Acts 17:11), we review another Bible example, this time from the book of John. In John, chapter 4, we find Jesus talking with a Samaritan woman at a well. Jews and Samaritans had different religious beliefs. Born a Jew, Jesus grew up studying the Jewish Law Code and teachings. (Luk 2:41-49) He well knew Jehovah, the God of Israel, and he was familiar with their Jewish form of worship. When the woman at the well perceived Jesus had miraculous power, she asked him about "religion," about his versus hers. At John 4:20 she said to him: "Our forefathers worshipped in this mountain, but you people say that in Jerusalem is the place where persons ought to worship." To let the woman know his Jewish form of worship was the one that had previously been acceptable to God, Jesus said to her: "You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, because salvation originates with the Jews." (Joh 4:22) Jesus then went on to explain group worship was coming to an end, as he said to her: "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming and is now, when neither in this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you people worship the Father... the hour is coming, and it is now, when the true worshipers will worship the Father with spirit and truth, for, indeed, the Father is looking for suchlike ones to worship him. God is a spirit, and those worshiping him must worship with spirit and truth." (Joh 4:21 & 23-24) The formalized group worship of his forefathers, and her forefathers, was being brought to an end and replaced by a form of worship carried on by each individual

through his or her own personal faith in Christ. (Mat 23:38) In John 17:11-21, Jesus said something in a prayer to his Father that sheds more light on what was about to happen after he went away: explaining his worshipers would worship the Father directly, as individuals, through their personal faith in him as God's son. They would no longer approach God through any group of men. That Christian arrangement, established by Jesus, remains to this day! (Joh 15:8-15 & 15:16) Jesus also said he would leave his followers a helper, the spirit of truth, to help them remember and understand what he had taught them. (Joh 14:15-17 & 26)

The Bible tells us that mere oppression makes even a wise person behave like a crazy person. It also says a bribe destroys the person. (Ecc 7:7) Ignorance amounts to spiritual darkness, and darkness is the worst form of oppression. Is it any surprise there are so many people acting like crazy persons in our day? If you can keep someone in total darkness, they will accept anything that gives a glimmer of light, even if it is a projector giving off light that depicts what is not real. That is what people do when they promote their own teachings, claiming what they teach comes from Jesus. They project lies and false hopes! The greatest bribe, then, that can be offered to any person is to make them believe they are wise in joining some group of men, while all the lesser and unwise nonmembers remain in darkness. The bribe is the wisdom that the group asserts its members manifest by joining. That is what modern day religions are doing to their sheep! They shine a false light based on their own teachings, and then bribe members by assuring them

they manifest wisdom in joining their group. Satan doesn't care which group he can keep you joined to, while their leaders whisper "Jesus, sweet Jesus," in your ear (2 Tim 4:3-4) and promise you are among those being saved. Their approved membership is the important thing for them! They want it to be what is important to you. These groups are all holding up broken illuminators of teachings dreamt up by them, while they cry out, "Follow us, we have the sayings that lead you to the door into daylight and life." Jesus is the only door to light and life! (Joh 1:6-13; Joh 10:1-5) The only group we can join is the very old one Jesus started about 2000 years ago. Joining is a personal choice made in your own heart to follow Christ Jesus. Modern groups (and the individuals who comprise them) who rely on memberships, seem to be failing to evaluate themselves by Jesus teachings to see if they really do know him. Most are just telling each other how great and how favored they are (Joh 5:44) to be Christian members of their group, but are not bothering to sit at Jesus's feet. As you read John, ask yourself: Are groups of men who have actually come to imagine salvation is tied to membership in their sect, are they listening to what Jesus said at all? Do they really know him? If they knew Christ, they would realize their membership rolls among groups of men have no value. What does have value is personal faith in Christ, based on knowledge of what he taught.

Modern research tools along with deteriorating world conditions have resulted in a brilliant revelation of the teachings of Jesus for our day. The bright light of Bible truth is painful for those men and women who have misapplied the scriptures to convince their

"sheep" they are dependent upon them for salvation. (2 Pet 2:1-9) They don't want those they have subjugated to hear the truth. It is also painful for those who like it that way. Some like having religious leaders who will tickle their ears by assuring them they are saved and everything is fine, as long as they remain approved members of the group. They don't want to be told they need to learn what Jesus taught and to live accordingly. (2 Tim 4:3-4) For those who do love truth, however, our day is a wonderful time to be alive. All the peoples of the earth are today being divided into two groups by their response to the words of Christ Jesus. (Joh 12:48; Mat 25:31-33; Mat 10:34-38) Knowing what Jesus taught makes that clear through eyes of faith. (Mat 24:23-25; Rom 1:17) The truth Jesus taught will set us you free of being ensnared by even well-intentioned men and women who remain ignorant of truth.

Another common failing among groups of men lies in their convincing members they must suffer now and then be happy later. Jesus said his followers would be happy now. His teachings would make them happy! (Joh 15:11; Joh 14:25-31) He did not say bad things wouldn't happen to those who do know him, mind you, but they would be happy. If you know and follow Jesus's teachings, you will be happy. (Joh 13:15-17) If you can greet someone, anyone, and realize you can help them because you have the truth (not that you know everything, but you understand Christ's teachings are the source of knowledge) and you can thereby know you don't have to fear being misled by them; how can it not make you happy? When we *truly believe* the sufferings we witness around us, for us or for

others, are temporary and are being done away with by Christ Jesus, (<u>Isa 11:1-12</u>) how could we not be happy? Your eternal life is directly linked to your happiness! [Please visit: justbibletruth.com/Observations/HowCanFaithHelp.html]

So then, don't be deceived or misguided. Realize how very simple it is to protect yourself: Become familiar with what Jesus taught in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. In doing so, you will know by means of your own Bible based faith that you know Christ Jesus intimately. Knowing Jesus is also to know the theme of the Bible! The Hebrew Scriptures exist in large measure to announce the Messiah. The books after the Gospels are the accounts of the early Christian men and women who tried to apply Christ's teachings in their lives. To know Christ, then, is to know the theme of the Bible! That all comes from sitting at Jesus's feet, doing so by reading the Gospel accounts of his teachings, over and over and...

Best to all who will love life and see good days. (1 Peter 3:10-12) 10 For, "he that would love life and see good days, let him restrain his tongue from what is bad and [his] lips from speaking deception, 11 but let him turn away from what is bad and do what is good; let him seek peace and pursue it. 12 For [the] eyes of Jehovah are upon the righteous ones, and his ears are toward their supplication; but [the] face of Jehovah is against those doing bad things." The above words of Peter were a reference to Psalms 34:12-16 LITV: (12) Who is the man who desires life, who loves days in order to see good? (13) Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking guile; (14) depart from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it. (15) The eyes of Jehovah are on the righteous; and

His ears are open to their cry. (16) The face of Jehovah is against those who do evil, to cut off their memory from the earth.

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
