As you consider your answer to that question, would you take time to deliberate on something Jesus said? What he said should make us

all, every single one of us, seriously evaluate our answer? Jesus said concerning "the last day," or "judgment day": (Matthew 7:22, 23) 22 Many will say to me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name, and expel demons in your name, and perform many powerful works in your name?' 23 And yet then I will confess to them: I never knew you! Get away from me, you workers of lawlessness. Jesus also said: (Luke 13:24-28) 24 "Exert yourselves vigorously to get in through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will seek to get in but will not be able, 25 when once the householder has got up and locked the door, and you start to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Sir, open to us.' But in answer he will say to you, 'I do not know where you are from.' 26 Then you will start saying, 'We ate and drank in front of you, and you taught in our broad ways.' 27 But he will speak and say to you, 'I do not know where you are from. Get away from me, all you workers of unrighteousness!' 28 There is where your weeping and the

gnashing of your teeth will be, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, but yourselves thrown outside."

In both those scriptures, Jesus referred to the people who approached him as being "workers of lawlessness" or "workers of unrighteousness." They spoke to him as persons who knew him and were expecting his favor. They no doubt believed they were upright. Instead of receiving his blessing, they were condemned. If these scriptures don't make you reflect on who you are in your inner person, the person Christ Jesus sees you to be, it might not speak well of you! Jesus is talking in Mat. 7 and Luke 13, pout men and women who felt justified in approaching him, actually thinking (or maybe just wishing) they were about to receive his help. The fact they were rejected by Jesus, and told he didn't know them at all, should lead us all to reflectively answer the question: Does Christ know me?

Jesus made it clear what it means to know him: John 8:31-32 CEV Jesus told the people who had faith in him, "If you keep on obeying what I have said, you truly are my disciples. (32) You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." One translation renders verse 31 as "if you remain in my word, you are really my diciples." Jesus made clear our knowing the truth, and thus "being set

free," was based on our remaining in (or abiding by) what he taught. That same responsibility falls to me, and to you as well!

In seeking Christian maturity, it often helps to consider excerpts from the Hebrew Scriptures (or Old Testament – OT). The Bible says the Jewish Law Code (given as a part of that OT) serves as a tutor leading to the Christ.<sup>3</sup> The Law helped mankind recognize our need for the Messiah (since no imperfect man could follow the Law completely), and the OT prophecies helped identify him when he arrived. The OT also provides a record of the ancestry of the Messiah. We can actually think of the whole of the Hebrew Scriptures, then, as a tutor leading to the Christ. In Genesis 3:15, after our first parents joined Satan in giving birth to rebellion and sin, God promised He would raise up a seed from the woman<sup>4</sup> who would crush Satan's head.<sup>5</sup> At the conclusion of the OT, in the first four Bible Books of the Christian Greek Scriptures (or New Testament - NT), Jesus appeared and presented himself (in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) as that promised Jewish Messiah; the one promised to crush Satan's head.<sup>6</sup>

In evaluating our relationship with Christ, and whether we really know him, one of the enlightening stories from the Old Testament is about a man who thought he knew King David of old. To understand this Bible example, we must first know a little about who David was. The ancient nation of Israel was prominently used by God as the ancestors of the coming Messiah. (Jn 4:20 on pg 32) For a period of time, God selected men to govern Israel who sat representatively on his throne. God anointed those kings to rule his nation of people (and thereby the whole earth). David was the second of those earthly kings. Although David committed some grave and serious sins, he was known as a man of outstanding faithfulness during most all of his life. Fourteen generations<sup>7</sup> before King David, to one of his forefathers, God had expanded and clarified the Messianic promise He gave at Genesis 3:15. (5) He pledged to faithful Abraham that all the nations of the earth would be blessed by means of Abraham's seed. The primary seed of Abraham, the individual who would bless all the peoples of the earth was, of course, Christ Jesus.<sup>9</sup> Christ was born through Eve and Abraham and through the line of King David twenty eight generations<sup>(7)</sup> after David. The rule of King David proved a blessing to God's nation. By helping people from other nations come to know Jehovah, 10 David blessed all those nations as well. On a

Jehovah is the self-given divine name of God. It was recorded over 6000 times in the Old Testament record covering the 4000 years

smaller scale, then, than what Jesus Christ would do, the prophecy to Abraham was fulfilled in King David. It was because of David's great loyalty that God promised the coming Messiah would be through his seed. Some scholars refer to Jesus as the Greater David, since God had said He would appoint one to sit on David's throne forever. Luke made clear it is Christ Jesus who is the one appointed to sit forever on David's throne. Ring David loved the truth. That is to say, he loved God's

before Christ was born. Some translators have omitted the name of God from their work, often replacing it with "LORD" in all caps. If you see LORD in the Bible text, it indicates it should read Jehovah. You should know God's name!

Word.<sup>13</sup> Our king Christ Jesus also loves the truth.<sup>14</sup> A reasonable question for us to ask ourselves is this, do we love the truth?<sup>15</sup> Can you

really say you know Jesus Christ if you don't? Do you recognize, and are you able to share, the same wondrous joy Jesus had in his expression at John 10:29:<sup>16</sup> His soul stirring expression that what his Father had given him is "greater than all other things"? Jesus said his Father gave him an assignment, and that everything his Father had was his.<sup>17</sup> What was

Jesus talking about, then, when he said what the Father had given him was "greater than all other things"? The very *most-great* thing given Jesus was the opportunity to glorify his Father's name!<sup>18</sup> Jesus said he came to make his Father's name known.<sup>19</sup> He said it was his purpose in life.<sup>20</sup> He said his food (or what sustained him) was to do his Father's will.<sup>21</sup> Long ago, Satan told all creation God was a liar and that He was

bad. Satan said God was withholding good things from his children.<sup>22</sup> We have all been groaning and suffering under the consequences of those lies ever since.<sup>23</sup> The opportunity for Jesus to clear his Father's name of the reproach the liar brought on it, then, is the gift that is "greater than all other things."<sup>(16-Jn 17:29)</sup> Jesus, in turn, gives you (us all) the opportunity to share in that work of exposing the lies Satan used to attack our Father and to smear his great name.<sup>24</sup> The opportunity to personally know and have a relationship with our heavenly Father<sup>25</sup> through your faith in his firstborn son,<sup>26</sup> that is what is available to you

through Jesus's teachings.<sup>27</sup> Share it by simply talking with others about what you learn from the Bible.

Back to using David's example so as to be certain we know Jesus Christ. David was a good king and the nation prospered under his forty year rule. Him being an outstanding king over Jehovah's<sup>(10)</sup> nation of people makes it easy to understand why God would use him as a prefigure of our king Christ Jesus. That knowledge also helps us understand why we can wisely look to the example we herein consider in David's life, to help us understand how some people will approach Jesus only to be condemned. It can help us understand how those people could imagine they knew Jesus, when by his own words, they clearly did not.

To really comprehend and benefit from this Bible drama surrounding David, we also need to know King Saul. Saul ruled before David as the first king of Israel. Both kings were specifically chosen and anointed by Jehovah as kings over his nation.<sup>28</sup> Saul started out as an excellent king,

but later became arrogant and disrespectful of God. Finally, he used his moral freedom to make himself bad and he was rejected by Jehovah.<sup>29</sup> Proving himself the opposite of Saul, David became more and more faithful to Jehovah throughout his entire life.

David first appears on the Bible scene while Saul was still ruling. It was during a war between Israel and the Philistine Nation (who worshipped false God's and tried to destroy Israel). As a young man, David was sent by his father to carry supplies to his brothers serving in the army. They were drawn up for battle and it was while David was present the Philistine giant, Goliath, came out to taunt the battle lines of Israel. Goliath asked what champion Israel would bring forth to do battle with him. David was shocked that no one replied. David viewed this spiritual enemy of the God he had come to know and worship as a mere dog. (Remember: David served Jehovah as a Jew, and God had clearly identified that Jewish nation to be his servants. God helped his people fight against the enemies of that arrangement, because it was his method to produce the Messiah and thereby bless all of humanity. Those days of physical war against God's enemies by his servants are past. Christianity has been established and it is very different. Christians do not kill God's enemies, or even judge who they are. You will understand that if you make effort to learn what Jesus taught – if you really do know him!) David said he would strike Goliath down. David's killing of Goliath put him in good stead with King Saul, and he became Saul's attendant.30

I'm the best soldier in our army, and all of you are in Saul's army. Choose your best soldier to come out and fight me! (9) If he can kill me, our people will be your slaves. But if I kill him, your people will be our slaves. (10) Here and now I challenge Israel's whole army! Choose someone to fight me! (11) Saul and his men heard what Goliath said, but they were so frightened of Goliath that they couldn't do a thing. (12) David's father Jesse was an old man, who belonged to the Ephrath clan and lived in Bethlehem in Judah. Jesse had eight sons: (13) the oldest was Eliab, the next was Abinadab, and Shammah was the third. The three of them had gone off to fight in Saul's army. David was Jesse's youngest son. (14) (SEE 17:13) (15) He took care of his father's sheep, and he went back and forth between Bethlehem and Saul's camp. (16) Goliath came out and gave his challenge every morning and every evening for forty days. (17) One day, Jesse told David, "Hurry and take this sack of roasted grain and these ten loaves of bread to your brothers at the army camp. (18) And here are ten large chunks of cheese to take to their commanding officer. Find out how your brothers are doing and bring back something that shows that they're all right. (19) They're with Saul's army, fighting the Philistines in Elah Valley." (20) David obeyed his father. He got up early the next morning and left someone else in charge of the sheep; then he loaded the supplies and started off. He reached the army camp just as the soldiers were taking their places and shouting the battle cry. (21) The army of Israel and the Philistine army stood there facing each other. (22) David left his things with the man in charge of supplies and ran up to the battle line to ask his brothers if they were well. (23) While David was talking with them, Goliath came out from the line of Philistines and started boasting as usual. David heard him. (24) When the Israelite soldiers saw Goliath, they were scared and ran off. (25) They said to each other, "Look how he keeps coming out to insult us. The king is offering a big reward to the man who kills Goliath. That man will even get to marry the king's daughter, and no one in his family will ever have to pay taxes again." (26) David asked some soldiers standing nearby, "What will a man get for killing this

Philistine and stopping him from insulting our people? Who does that worthless Philistine think he is? He's making fun of the army of the living God!" (27) The soldiers told David what the king would give the man who killed Goliath. (28) David's oldest brother Eliab heard him talking with the soldiers. Eliab was angry at him and said, "What are you doing here, anyway? Who's taking care of that little flock of sheep out in the desert? You spoiled brat! You came here just to watch the fighting, didn't you?" (29) "Now what have I done?" David answered. "Can't I even ask a question?" (30) Then he turned and asked another soldier the same thing he had asked the others, and he got the same answer. (31) Some soldiers overheard David talking, so they told Saul what David had said. Saul sent for David, and David came. (32) "Your Majesty," he said, "this Philistine shouldn't turn us into cowards. I'll go out and fight him myself!" (33) "You don't have a chance against him," Saul replied. "You're only a boy, and he's been a soldier all his life." (34) But David told him: Your Majesty, I take care of my father's sheep. And when one of them is dragged off by a lion or a bear, (35) I go after it and beat the wild animal until it lets the sheep go. If the wild animal turns and attacks me, I grab it by the throat and kill it. (36) Sir, I have killed lions and bears that way, and I can kill this worthless Philistine. He shouldn't have made fun of the army of the living God! (37) The LORD [Jehovah] has rescued me from the claws of lions and bears, and he will keep me safe from the hands of this Philistine. "All right," Saul answered, "go ahead and fight him. And I hope the LORD [Jehovah] will help you." (38) Saul had his own military clothes and armor put on David, and he gave David a bronze helmet to wear. (39) David strapped on a sword and tried to walk around, but he was not used to wearing those things. "I can't move with all this stuff on," David said. "I'm just not used to it." David took off the armor (40) and picked up his shepherd's stick. He went out to a stream and picked up five smooth rocks and put them in his leather bag. Then with his sling in his hand, he went straight toward Goliath. (41) Goliath came toward David, walking behind the soldier who was carrying his shield. (42) When Goliath saw that David was just a healthy, good-looking boy, he made fun of him. (43) "Do you think I'm a dog?" Goliath asked. "Is that why you've come after me with a stick?" He cursed David in the name of the Philistine gods (44) and shouted, "Come on! When I'm finished with you, I'll feed you to the birds and wild animals!" (45) David answered: You've come out to fight me with a sword and a spear and a dagger. But

I've come out to fight you in the name of the LORD [Jehovah] All-Powerful. He is the God of Israel's army, and you have insulted him too! (46) Today the LORD [Jehovah] will help me defeat you. I'll knock you down and cut off your head, and I'll feed the bodies of the other Philistine soldiers to the birds and wild animals. Then the whole world will know that Israel has a real God. (47) Everybody here will see that the LORD [Jehovah] doesn't need swords or spears to save his people. The LORD [Jehovah] always wins his battles, and he will help us defeat you. (48) When Goliath started forward, David ran toward him. (49) He put a rock in his sling and swung the sling around by its straps. When he let go of one strap, the rock flew out and hit Goliath on the forehead. It cracked his skull, and he fell facedown on the ground. (50) David defeated Goliath with a sling and a rock. He killed him without even using a sword. (51) David ran over and pulled out Goliath's sword. Then he used it to cut off Goliath's head. When the Philistines saw what had happened to their hero, they started running away. (52) But the soldiers of Israel and Judah let out a battle cry and went after them as far as Gath and Ekron. The bodies of the Philistines were scattered all along the road from Shaaraim to Gath and Ekron. (53) When the Israelite army returned from chasing the Philistines, they took what they wanted from the enemy camp. (54) David took Goliath's head to Jerusalem, but he kept Goliath's weapons in his own tent. (55) After King Saul had watched David go out to fight Goliath, Saul turned to the commander of his army and said, "Abner, who is that young man?" "Your Majesty," Abner answered, "I swear by your life that I don't know." (56) "Then find out!" Saul told him. (57) When David came back from fighting Goliath, he was still carrying Goliath's head. Abner took David to Saul, (58) and Saul asked, "Who are you?" "I am David the son of Jesse, a loyal Israelite from Bethlehem."

1 Samuel 18:1-5 CEV David and Saul finished talking, and soon David and Jonathan [Saul's son] became best friends. Jonathan thought as much of David as he did of himself. (2) From that time on, Saul kept David in his service and would not let David go back to his own family. (3) Jonathan liked David so much that they promised to always be loyal friends. (4) Jonathan took off the robe that he was wearing and gave it to David. He also gave him his military clothes, his sword, his bow and arrows, and his belt. (5) David was a success in everything that Saul sent him to do,

Over the years that followed, Saul chose to make himself bad by turning away from Jehovah. During that time, Saul's love for David turned first to jealousy and then to hatred. For years after that, Saul hunted David like an animal trying to kill him. On two different occasions, during those years of being hunted, David had opportunity to kill Saul. Although David was having to flee from Saul, and David had publicly cried out in front of the armies of both he and Saul that Jehovah would strike Saul down for seeking David's life, David would not personally do him harm.

David asked, "and come away unharmed" (or "remain innocent")?<sup>[(32)-note 1\_Sam\_26:9]</sup> David loved Jehovah, and he trusted in God to deal with wicked Saul. That does not mean David hid or ignored Saul's sin, however. David did not pretend Saul was not wicked in his actions. David told everyone Jehovah would strike Saul down for his wickedness, but again, David would not personally do him harm! This was likely because David still loved Saul and hoped he would heed David's warning and turn back from his bad way.<sup>32</sup> (David thus manifest the Christian

when I cut off the skirt of your sleeveless coat I did not kill you. death. When the man refused, Saul fell upon his own sword and killed himself.<sup>35</sup>

Now we get to the purpose of considering this drama, and to the actions by the man we want to consider. Three days after Saul's death, a young man came to King David to report. Possibly hearing about, or even having witnessed what happened to King Saul, and knowing how Saul had hunted David for many years seeking to kill him, this young man thought his knowledge of those facts also meant he knew David. He emboldened himself to tell David a lie, no doubt believing it would gain him David's favor. He said Saul had been mortally wounded, and had asked the young man to put him to death. The young Amalekite then told David he had heeded Saul's request and killed him. Before acting against him. David asked the man who he was. This might have been an opportunity for the young man to plead ignorance for what he had done. Still imagining (wrongly) he knew King David, however, the young man proudly volunteered he was an alien resident of Israel. As a resident, he should have known the Law Code and how important it was when a man was anointed as king of Israel directly by Jehovah God. David then ordered one of his attendants to strike the young man down; because he had testified out of his own mouth he had definitely put the anointed of Jehovah<sup>(10)</sup> to death.<sup>36</sup>

had heard other people say about him. If he was going to thrust himself into a personal relationship with powerful King David, he should have been serious about being certain he really did know him. Before we were even born, we were all propelled into such a relationship with our king Christ Jesus. It is a relationship that requires we know him intimately in order to live. Like the young Amalekite man, we are responsible to be sure we aren't just thinking we know Jesus based on what others have told us about him. Such self-proclaimed educators may be well intentioned, and completely wrong!<sup>(71)</sup>

Do you consider, then, the importance of evaluation whether you really and truly know our king? Do you understand what it requires on your part to be certain you *do* know him? Those individuals Jesus talked about, those who would approach him saying they had cast out demons in his name and ate and drank in front of him while he taught in their broad ways, they thought they knew him. They didn't!!! (Luke 13:26-27-pg-1)

How could they have deceived themselves so? That's an easy answer. They didn't know what the Bible teaches<sup>37</sup> and they weren't obedient to it. They hadn't really given attention to what Jesus taught. They were only involved in all the turmoil surrounding his teachings. That is what modern day religion is doing to their members. They find young—any people who are sincerely interested in learning about God, and then steer them aside to being concerned with membership in one of their sectarian groups. Membership in any of such groups is useless at best! You must personally seat yourself at Jesus's feet and listen to what he taught.<sup>38</sup> Don't waste your time with the teachings of men. You should,

of course, evaluate us by that same standard. Please prove that what we say comes directly from the Bible.<sup>39</sup> What Jesus actually taught is contained in the four short Bible books by Matthew, Mark, Luke and the Apostle John. Read them! Sit at Jesus's feet by reading those books over and over; until you are really familiar with what he taught. Then, YOU will know Christ Jesus; and you will know you know him. When someone claims Jesus said some thing or the other, you will be able to say "Amen!" Or, be able to ignore ignorant speech when there is no Bible support.<sup>40</sup>

Bible knowledge sets any person who possesses it free of the malicious and deceitful intentions of others, as well as helping them overcome their own weaknesses and sinful inclinations. Knowledge of truth sets us all free, if we will simply listen to what Jesus taught and then do our best to live accordingly. (Jn 8:31-32 on page 2) Don't imagine you know what Jesus taught if you haven't personally put forth the effort to read his teachings for your-own-self! The poet Maya Angelou asked why the caged bird sings. "It doesn't sing because it has the answer. It sings because it has a song" she said. This was no doubt her beautiful expression to help understand or explain some of the pain surrounding us. The teachings by Jesus provide us *all* a song *which is the answer*, the perfect and everlasting answer.

It is not a war in the human sense, as there was never any doubt as to the outcome.<sup>42</sup> The only thing in question is your (our) personal allegiance. You are deciding you are a person who loves righteousness to see good days, (Ps 34:12-16 pg 42) a person of loving kindness toward others; or, you are deciding you are worthless. examine what he said is one decision to make. That is a very bad choice. Choose wisely!<sup>44</sup> His message is a simple and beautiful solution to all our problems. It is the Bible truth!

An intertwined fact we are well served to understand: Organizations don't worship God. It is individuals who worship God! (Some will, of course, then assert all followers of Christ *do indeed* comprise an organization. That is true only in the sense they make themselves part of, or join themselves to, God's organization in heaven. Or, put another way, they have joined the organization Jesus started 2000 years ago, Christians.) Our point is this: No memberships among groups of men represent those loved by God. Approved membership judgments rendered by men are the supreme manifestation of class distinction (sectarianism). In the mind of those who render such judgments, their memberships judge between those who are loved by God (or at least those who are approved by him) and those who are not. It is the opposite of the teaching by Christ Jesus to "let him who is without sin cast the first stone."

While are considering David and Saul, there is another wicked example set by a man who lived at the same time they did. Doeg was a man in the court of King Saul, during the period Saul was trying to kill David. Depraved King Saul accused his servants with conspiring to help David. (David, however, meant no harm to Saul.) Doeg volunteered to Saul that he had seen High Priest Ahimelech help David. Though Ahimelech was innocent of any wrong, helping David only because he knew him to be the servant of Saul, Saul killed him. To curry favor with Saul, Doeg put to death not only Ahimelech and his family, but all the priests of the priestly city of Nob. 46 Note that while the other servants of Saul feared

people came to him, and he sat down and started teaching them. (3) The Pharisees and the teachers of the Law of Moses brought in a woman who had been caught in bed with a man who wasn't her husband. They made her stand in the middle of the crowd. (4) Then they said, "Teacher, this woman was caught sleeping with a man who isn't her husband. (5) The Law of Moses teaches that a woman like this should be stoned to death! What do you say?" (6) They asked Jesus this question, because they wanted to test him and bring some charge against him. But Jesus simply bent over and started writing on the ground with his finger. (7) They kept on asking Jesus about the woman. His only concern was in being a man-pleaser. He wanted the approval of Saul and Saul's organization. Doeg had (or should have) studied the Bible (the part of the OT they had at that time) just like the other servants of Saul; those upright men who refused Saul's command. Doeg, however, wanted to please Saul's organization with no regard for pleasing God. Even though Saul was Jehovah's anointed King, Doeg was wicked to follow in his unholy course. We must avoid being led along by sectarian groups of men in the same way Doeg chose to be. If such groups actually do mean well, but are ignorant of truth, their good intentions can make them harder to recognize. An intimate and personal knowledge of what Jesus taught is your only protection in identifying false prophets. He

Remember, if you give your assertion that members of some "group" are righteous, you do take responsibility for what they are doing. Saul and David lived under the Jewish arrangement with its one set of laws for their whole nation of people. That was replaced by Christianity. In these Christian days, it is not organizations who worship God. Individuals worship God!<sup>49</sup> Organizational worship was exemplified in

Samaritans don't really know the one you worship. But we Jews do know the God we worship, and by using us, God will save the world. (23) But a time is coming, and it is already here! Even now the true worshipers are being led by the Spirit to worship the Father according to the truth. These are the ones the Father is seeking to worship him. in our day! If you involve yourself in group worship, you make yourself responsible for other group members. Among other things Jesus came to teach and do, he came to help us understand that simple truth. In trying to scripturally verify whether that is true,<sup>51</sup> we review another Bible example, this time from the book of John. In John, chapter 4, we find Jesus talking with a Samaritan woman at a well. Jews and Samaritans had different religious beliefs. Born a Jew, Jesus grew up studying the Jewish Law Code and teachings.<sup>52</sup> He well knew Jehovah,<sup>53</sup> the God of Israel, and he was familiar with the Jewish form of worship.

When the woman at the well perceived Jesus had miraculous power, she asked him about *religion*: about his versus hers. At John 4:20 she said to him: "Our forefathers worshipped in this mountain, but you people say that in Jerusalem is the place where persons ought to worship." To let the woman know his Jewish form of worship was the one that had previously been acceptable to God, Jesus said to her: "You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, because salvation originates with the Jews." (John 4:22) Jesus then went on to explain group worship was coming to an end, as he said to her: "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming and is now, when neither in this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you people worship the Father... the hour is coming, and it is now, when the true worshipers will worship the Father with spirit and truth, for, indeed, the Father is looking for suchlike ones to worship him. God is a spirit, and those worshiping him must worship with spirit and truth." (John 4:21 & 23-24) The formalized group worship practiced by his forefathers (and by her forefathers) was being brought to an end. In connection with the Jewish religious leaders killing Jesus, their group worship was ended.<sup>54</sup> It was replaced with a new form of worship carried on by each individual through his or her own personal faith in Jesus. In John 17:11-21,55 Jesus said something in

understanding what he taught them.<sup>57</sup> If you make the effort to study and apply what Jesus taught, that "spirit of truth" will help you. You don't have to understand what that "spirit of truth" is. You just have to do what Jesus told you to do.<sup>(1\_Pet\_3:10-12 pg 42)</sup>

The Bible tells us that mere oppression makes even a wise person behave like a crazy person. It also says a bribe destroys the person.<sup>58</sup> Ignorance amounts to spiritual darkness. Keeping people in darkness is the worst form of oppression. Is it any surprise there are so many people acting like crazy persons in our day? If you can keep someone in total darkness, they will accept anything that gives a glimmer of light, even if it is a projector giving off light that depicts what is not real. That is what religions do when they promote their own teachings and claim what they teach comes from Jesus (that their teachings are spiritual food). They project lies and false hopes! The greatest bribe, then, that can be offered to any person is to convince them they make themselves wise before God by joining with some group of men. Such groups usually assert all the lesser and unwise "nonmembers" remain in darkness. The bribe offered is the wisdom which the group asserts its members gain or manifest by joining their sect. That is what modern religions are doing to their sheep! They shine a false light based on their own teachings, and then bribe members by assuring them they manifest godly wisdom by going along with those teachings. Satan doesn't care which group he can keep you joined to, while their leaders whisper

By doing so, they fail to warn individuals they must "sit at Jesus's feet"<sup>(38)</sup> and actually learn what he taught. Read the book of John.<sup>64</sup> As *you do so,* ask yourself: Are these groups of men who imagine salvation is tied to membership in their sect, are they listening to what Jesus said *at all*? Do they really know him? If they knew Christ, they would realize their name on a membership list kept by a sect of men has no value. What *does have value* is a new creation: a creature [person] made new by choosing to be guided by their personal faith in Christ, that based on their own knowledge of what they know he taught.<sup>65</sup>

if we live and if we die, we are the Lord's. (9) Because for this [reason] Christ also died and rose and lives, so that He should exercise lordship over both dead [ones – when resurrected] and living [ones]. (10) But why do you judge your brother? Or also, why do you despise [or, look down on] your brother? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. (11) For it has been written, "[As] I live, says [the] LORD [Jehovah(10)], every knee will bow to Me, and every tongue will confess to God." [Isaiah 45:23; cp. Phil 2:10,11] (12) So, consequently, each of us will give an account concerning himself to God. (13) Therefore, let us no longer be judging one another, but rather, judge [or, determine] this, not to be putting a stumbling-stone before your brother [by judging him], or an offence [or, occasion for sin].

Modern research tools along with deteriorating world conditions have combined to produce and focus attention on a brilliant revelation of the teachings of Jesus for our day. The bright light of Bible truth is painful for those men and women who have misapplied the scriptures to mislead their "sheep," tricking them to imagine they are dependent on cult approval for salvation. 66 Most don't want those whom they have subjugated to hear the truth. It is also painful for subjects of such groups, those who like it the way it is (or imagine they do). Some like having religious leaders who will tickle their ears 67 by assuring them they are saved and everything is fine, as long, that is, as they remain approved members of the group. They don't want to be told the simple truth: They need to learn what Jesus taught and to live accordingly. (59)

Another common failing among groups of men lies in their convincing members they must suffer now and then be happy later. Jesus said his followers would be happy - now. His teachings would make them happy! He did not say bad things wouldn't happen to those who do know him, mind you, but they would be happy. If you learn and follow Jesus's teachings, you will be happy. If you can greet someone (anyone) and realize you can help them because you have the truth (not that you know everything, mind you, but you do understand Christ's teachings are the source of life), how can you not be happy? If you can know you don't have to fear being misled by them, because you personally know what Jesus taught, how can it not make you happy? When we truly believe the sufferings we witness around us (whether happening to us personally, or to others) are temporary, and are being done away with by Christ Jesus, How Could we not be happy? So then, don't allow yourself to be deceived or misguided. Realize how very simple it is to protect yourself. Become familiar with what Jesus taught in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. (Please note: Each of those little books is only about fifty pages.) In becoming familiar with the Gospels, you will know by means of your own *Bible based* faith that you know Christ Jesus intimately. Knowing Jesus is also to know the theme of the Bible. That is so because Jesus is the theme of the Bible! The Hebrew Scriptures exist in large measure to announce the coming Messiah. The books after the Gospels are the accounts of the early Christian men and women who tried to apply Christ's teachings in their lives. To know Christ, then, is to know the theme of the Bible! Knowing him can come only from sitting at his feet; <sup>(38)</sup> doing so by reading the Gospel accounts of his teachings, over and over and...

(12) For [the] eyes of Jehovah<sup>(10)</sup> are upon the righteous ones,<sup>75</sup> and his ears are toward their supplication; but [the] face of Jehovah is against those doing bad things." The above words of Peter are his expression of Psalms 34:12-16 LITV: (12) Who is the man who desires life, who loves days in order to see good? (13) Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from speaking guile; (14) depart from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it. (15) The eyes of Jehovah<sup>(10)</sup> are on the righteous; and His ears are open to their cry. (16) The face of Jehovah is against those who do evil, to cut off their memory from the earth.

This, then, is what the Bible teaches. We close by quoting Christ Jesus as he said: "Be repentant you people, and have faith in the good news."
