Is God consistent? Is He always fair and impartial? Can He sometimes be harsh and demanding? If He is good and fair, why does He sometimes severely punish what might seem a small offence, while

other times appearing to

overlook

more

what is serious?

Let us begin by stating what we consider some simple truths about God. We will then attempt to provide scriptural support for those statements. God is always both fair and consistent. If ever we feel that is not the case, what is missing is our own understanding of the circumstances. The one thing we must accept that none of us can ever understand, and that we must also realize God fully does understand, is the matter of personal accountability to him. God doesn't hold people accountable for sins when they are ignorant of the gravity of what they do.<sup>(MM)</sup> That is why He sometimes treats one person differently than another. It does not reflect a harsh attitude, nor is it inconsistent. It simply reflects what that individual is personally accountable for. (LL) If you don't understand how and why that is true, it might be an indication you should more deeply consider what Jesus Christ came to teach (by reading and rereading what he said, as recorded in the Gospels). Only Jesus has provided the knowledge that can set you free.<sup>(Z)</sup>

As an example of what some people consider to be harsh, unfair, or inconsistent on God's part: There is a Bible account where a man and his wife are struck dead for telling a lie about what they chose to do with something that actually belonged to them.<sup>(H)</sup> What is your opinion? If it does seem like God was too harsh, or if you would like to better understand what happened to Ananias and Sapphira, please consider the enclosed letter. The letter (with the names removed) is a correspondence that was part of a discussion between two old friends about the Bible and about Ananias and Sapphira, and whether God was harsh in dealing with them. Each of the two people involved in the original full conversation express faith in Christ Jesus as their Lord.

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My dear old friend,

How are you? It was nice to get your call yesterday. (Believe it or not, this letter started out as a brief note... When I started reading the scriptures you directed me to, however, and following the cross links to other Bible verses, it sort of took on a life of its own. Short responses to scriptural points of consideration are often not possible: Brief answers can be difficult because even though what Jesus came to teach is easy to understand,<sup>(G)</sup> it can be hard to grasp the necessary overview of his teaching if we are not able to detach ourselves from trying to view it using our current short (70 or 80 year) view onto the Bible's timeline.<sup>A</sup> While Jesus's teachings are easy to understand,<sup>(G)</sup> they can be hard to grasp as a whole because what he explained is God's solution to all mankind's problems. That solution has been 6000 years in its unfolding and revelation. While it is simple to understand, if there were a one sentence explanation, Jesus wouldn't have spent the time teaching all that is recorded he taught us in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Also, while the letter is longer than first intended, about 2/3's of the material is scriptures as footnotes. We agree it is never anything but a benefit to read the Bible.) Anyway... I always love to talk about the Bible. It is even better when it is with one of my oldest friends, and one who was my best friend for several of my "formative" years. We've come a long way since we were huddled around your old car in your parent's underground garage, trying to figure out how to tune-up the engine. The focus of our attention, however, has become far more important. Getting older isn't all bad.

I'm trying to remember the details of our last conversation, so I can address what I understood you to say. Communication skills have always proved a problem for me. I sometimes draw implications and understand people to have said things they didn't mean at all. It always does me good to review.

So... We talked previously about Ananias and Sapphira, the couple God struck dead for trying to lie to (trying to deceive) the Christian men and women God was obviously using; as evidenced by his pouring out his spirit on them.<sup>(J)</sup> My knee-jerk reaction is to want to proclaim I can't imagine what they did, or understand how they could think to do such a thing. But I must confess, in the secret person of my heart, *I am able to understand* how they could make such an error; because I recognize my own similar weaknesses.<sup>(see</sup> "A Confession" on page <sup>38</sup>) My desire to please other people, or my desire for what I imagine will be some personal gain, can sometimes lead me to do things I wouldn't otherwise do. I want to learn better, however, and I believe what Jesus taught provides my only hope.

It seemed when we talked you were concerned about how to comfort and deal with people who believe it was unloving of God to strike the couple dead for what some might consider a small sin: They told a lie about what they did with something they owned. To some people it seems unfair, or at least inconsistent, that God would kill that couple for telling a lie, while He appears to take no action against a modern day man who cuts off another man's head on television (on the internet) for all the world to see. (They do tell us, by the way, that religious fanatic and murderer is now dead. Because God does not always take immediate action against a wicked act does not mean he lets the wicked go unpunished.) You also asked if I had researched the account of Ananias and Sapphira - to get a better understanding of God's fairness I believe. At your prodding, then, I have reviewed the material. The only research I almost ever do, however, is in reading the Bible itself. Everyone's always "encouraging" me to read what this or that person wrote about some scripture under consideration. Such religious affiliations and attention to written materials that are not a part of the Bible have, over the course of my life, infected me with many teachings I now realize are not Bible teachings at all. What a waste! (The reason I believe this letter is different from all those religious writings, is that I encourage you to first read my letter [and the scriptural footnotes], and then to read one of the Gospels. In that way verify for yourself this is precisely what Jesus was

teaching.<sup>B</sup> As I say to everyone I talk with about the Bible, please don't ever put faith in me.<sup>C</sup> Please do put faith in what Christ Jesus said.) I guess do hope I was gaining some maturity and knowledge of what the Bible actually *does* teach over the course of those many years in churches, as I exposed myself to sectarian religious teachings. (Please realize and understand: Religious teachings of men [doctrines] are very different from Christianity. True Christianity can only be gained from a personal knowledge and application of what Jesus Christ actually taught.)<sup>D</sup> Jesus did warn us many people would be confused and/or teaching religious lies disguised as Christianity.<sup>(SS)</sup> Anyway... I hope I've learned my lesson and I am trying to do better in guarding my heart from the ideas (doctrines) of men. So then, the reason I tell you all that is so you will understand: If you have something to show me from the Bible, I am most pleased to read it. But, I don't really put much stock in people who want to tell me what the Bible means by what it says. My faith is God sent his son to teach me what he wanted me to know.<sup>(M)</sup> There is no reason for me to listen to what men teach. What Jesus taught is still recorded for me in the Gospels. God fully intended me to be able to understand it when He had Jesus teach it. Additionally, Jesus said he would leave us his spirit (the spirit of truth) to help us understand what his Father wanted us

to know.<sup>E</sup> The Bible, outside the Gospel accounts of Jesus's teachings, says within its own pages it is support material (a tutor) to help me have absolute faith in the teachings of the son of God.<sup>F</sup> After I gain an understanding of that simple process by which God is teaching me (all of us),<sup>(ZZ)</sup> my need is humbly to read the

Gospels – a lot.<sup>G</sup>

Based on my simple notion, then, of relying solely on the Bible with an emphasis on Christ, here is what I can know about Ananias and Sapphira.<sup>H</sup> {*That scriptural footnote recording the sin and death of Ananias and Sapphira (the Bible's only mention of them) is from the Contemporary English Version (CEV) of the Bible. That's a translation easy for me to understand as it is written in modern English. (I do dislike that the CEV translators removed*

God's (יהוה' s) personal name from their translation. They did, at least, replace the divine name with "LORD" in all capital letters so readers could know where they had removed God's name. In the *CEV of the Bible, then, just understand "LORD" in all capital* letters to have been the Hebrew name יהוה [attempted English] translations: Jehovah or Yahweh – Hebrew pronunciation "sounds like" in English: YeaºVah, Yea as in "yea-go-team" followed by the first two letters of "vault."]).<sup>1</sup> There is a free Bible study program called e-Sword available at www.e-Sword.net. It has several excellent translations of the Bible available with it, the *Contemporary English Version included. If you send the owner* (Rick Meyers) \$30, he will send you a disk so you don't have to download it. I don't know him or what he personally believes at all. Doesn't really matter... His simple Bible study software is excellent. That does not speak to several other study tools included with e-Sword. If we all stick solely with the Bible, in this and all other Bible discussions or study, we will always be safe. Comparing several Bible translations of any verse that seems hard to understand can give a better feel for the original language meaning. e-Sword is an excellent tool for doing that.} So then, I can know from reading the Bible verses leading to its reference of them,<sup>(H)</sup> that Ananias and Sapphira were probably Jews or at least Jewish proselytes (Gentiles who had accepted Judaism).<sup>J</sup> At a bare

minimum, living in ancient Jerusalem, the couple would have been familiar with Jewish laws and practices. They would have known the Jewish "religious leaders" were fighting against this new "Christian" movement to which they had *joined themselves*. They would thus have been educated about, and probably part of, the Jewish arrangement that had served God for 1500 years from Moses [or 2000 years counting from Abraham] down to Christ.<sup>(A)</sup> Peter [there in Acts]<sup>(J)</sup> applied the Prophet Joel's words<sup>K</sup> to what he saw happening to he and his Christian brothers and sisters. Peter also called what he saw the "last days." He said God was pouring

other apostles, "Friends, what shall we do?" (38) Peter said, "Turn back to God! Be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, so that your sins will be forgiven. Then you will be given the Holy Spirit. (39) This promise is for you and your children. It is for everyone our Lord God will choose, no matter where they live." (40) Peter told them many other things as well. out his spirit, in the last days, on those he anointed to become his people: His "Christian" people. The "last days" Joel<sup>(K)</sup> and Peter<sup>(J)</sup> were speaking about, then, were the "last days" of the Jewish religious system. It was the end of the days when God had dealt with and helped mankind using the Jewish nation. From Peter's day forward, God has been dealing with mankind, not as a nation (or group) of people like He did with the Jews, but with each individual (from among both Jews and Gentiles) through their personal expression of faith in the teachings of his son and Messiah.<sup>(JJ)</sup>

There have been several "special times" or "special days" over the course of Bible history. In each of those periods, God used signs and miracles to prove He was with the people He was using. He always made it clear who those who looked to him for guidance should follow when He was asking them to do things that required great faith. To leave Egypt and walk into the Red Sea, with the might of Egypt marching down on them from the rear, took great courage and faith. God thus provided miracles through Moses to show the people should follow Moses as his own servant.<sup>L</sup> In

"those last days" of the Jewish nation's slavery to Egypt, God killed some of the people who spoke out against Moses. He killed them because they were knowingly fighting against what He was doing. God had a work He was accomplishing in Moses's day. He was using the Jewish nation to produce the Messiah. Jesus would be born a Jew. God could not allow those who lacked faith and appreciation undermine his efforts to help all those among mankind who would accept his blessings. Those rebellious individuals who spoke against the miracle performing Moses actually forced God to act against them. Remember always: It is what God is doing that is important above all. So then... Ananias and Sapphira were favored to be alive in the midst of this new and great work our God was doing in their day in time (and which Joel had spoken about in prophecy). As Jews, Ananias and Sapphira should have known Bible history, including Joel's writings. They definitely saw all the miracles being performed among the Christians surrounding them;<sup>(J)</sup> as witness God was now blessing his new Christian Congregation. All that knowledge possessed by Ananias and Sapphira, then, made them "accountable" to God. And that leads to something we must each realize and understand none of us will never have: Knowledge of someone else's accountability before our Creator. He is the lone judge of that. (God has, in matter of fact, given that judgment responsibility to Christ;<sup>(CC)</sup> knowing his son will always do what is right. Jesus will always do the same, in principle, as his Father would have done.)<sup>M</sup> As the basis of our relationship with God, we must have

Egyptians. (26) And Jehovah said to Moses, Stretch out your hand over the sea, and let the waters return on the Egyptians, on their chariots, and on their horsemen. faith He is good.<sup>N</sup> That means we must also believe his son is good. Believing God is good must include having faith He knows how to deal with individuals in all circumstances. That can seem harder. Only God can know what a person's responsibility is, and what punishment they justly deserve. We have lots of Bible examples to show God is kind and loving and patient.<sup>0</sup> One such example is the account of the ancient Assyrian capital city of Nineveh. The Ninevites were barbarous people. If they had to lay siege to a city to overthrow it, they left survivors who had been treated so horribly that other cities, on hearing about the treatment of those survivors, would just open their gates to the Ninevites. While the Ninevites were wicked in their actions, they were also ignorant of truth. So... God sent Jonah to tell them he was going to destroy their city because of their badness. When Jonah warned the Ninevites, however, they repented. In loving kindness, God then spared their city. (See the Bible book of Jonah – only 4 chapters, or 48 verses, long.) Many years later, however, after repentant Assyrian King Sennacherib had been murdered by his own people, the Ninevites forgot or ignored God's warning to them and went back to their old ways. God then carried out his judgment on their no longer ignorant behavior as He destroyed Nineveh without further warning. Historians record that 200 years after Jonah's visit, there was no trace of the great city of Nineveh.<sup>P</sup> God is always consistent and fair. If it seems otherwise to us, we just need to remember and understand what God is doing always reflects his perfect understanding of what every single person is knowingly responsible for (and thus accountable for). God was not overly harsh with Ananias and Sapphira: He had blessed them with knowledge of what He was doing in their day in time, and had

made them part of something wonderful (as they were witness to the birth of Christianity). And yet, they deemed some money and/or peer approval as more valuable than their relationship with God Almighty. They wanted *people* to think how righteous they were to give *all* their money to charity, while they secretly held part of it back. They thus demonstrated they had no concern for what God thought about them. Their choice to place the adoration of men above God, made with awareness and understanding, also made them bad people! You mentioned Achan, along with all his household. They were all killed for stealing a gold bar, some silver, and a garment from among things God had devoted to destruction. Achan's day was another time of special activity: God was using his spirit to help his nation of people (Achan included) destroy the surrounding nations, because those nations had chosen to make themselves enemies of truth and true worship. (God was using the Jewish nation to produce the Messiah He had promised for the blessing of all mankind. The Jews had to be protected.) Achan and his household's knowledge, as they all saw and understood what God was doing to help mankind, along with his family's choice to join Achan in hiding the sin he had committed, made them all accountable before God for their disobedience.<sup>Q</sup> And this is the

(9) Everyone will think you weren't strong enough to protect your people. Now the Canaanites and everyone else who lives in the land will surround us and wipe us out. (10) The LORD answered: Stop lying there on the ground! Get up! (11) I said everything in Jericho belonged to me and had to be destroyed. But the Israelites have kept some of the things for themselves. They stole from me and hid what they took. Then they lied about it. (12) What they stole was supposed to be destroyed, and now Israel itself must be destroyed. I cannot help you anymore until you do exactly what I have said. That's why Israel turns and runs from its enemies instead of standing up to them. (13) Tell the people of Israel, "Tomorrow you will meet with the LORD your God, so make yourselves acceptable to worship him. The LORD says that you have taken things that should have been destroyed. You won't be able to stand up to your enemies until you get rid of those things. (14) "Tomorrow morning everyone must gather near the place of worship. You will come forward tribe by tribe, and the LORD will show which tribe is guilty. Next, the clans in that tribe must come forward, and the LORD will show which clan is guilty. The families in that clan must come, and the LORD will point out the guilty family. Finally, the men in that family must come, (15) and the LORD will show who stole what should have been destroyed. That man must be put to death, his body burned, and his possessions thrown into the fire. He has done a terrible thing by breaking the sacred agreement that the LORD made with Israel." (16) Joshua got up early the next morning and brought each tribe to the place of worship, where the LORD showed that the Judah tribe was guilty. (17) Then Joshua brought the clans of Judah to the LORD, and the LORD showed that the Zerah clan was guilty. One by one he brought the leader of each family in the Zerah clan to the LORD, and the LORD showed that Zabdi's family was guilty. (18) Finally, Joshua brought each man in Zabdi's family to the LORD, and the LORD showed that Achan was the guilty one. (19) "Achan," Joshua said, "the LORD God of Israel has decided that you are guilty. Is this true? Tell me what you did, and don't try to hide anything." (20) "It's true," Achan answered. "I sinned and disobeved the LORD God of Israel. (21) While we were in Jericho, I saw a beautiful Babylonian robe, two hundred pieces of silver, and a gold bar that weighed the same as fifty pieces of gold. I wanted them for myself, so I took them. I dug a hole under my tent point we want to take from the whole of this discussion: What we are learning from Jesus is making each one of us accountable to our Creator. That is a good thing because it's how we gain faith in what is true, and can then choose to become friends of God.<sup>R</sup> It is impossible for ignorant people to be friends of our Creator. That is because ignorant people can't really even know him. How could they think to be his friends? As we trade away our ignorance for what Jesus taught,<sup>(G)</sup> we also make ourselves accountable.<sup>(MM)</sup> While that is a very good thing, it does mean we must be careful to realize we are also becoming responsible for our actions. Remember too: If we publicly assert our membership in some sect of men, we likely make ourselves

and hid the silver, the gold, and the robe." Joshua had some people run to Achan's tent, where they found the silver, the gold, and the robe. (22) (SEE 7:21) (23) They brought them back and put them in front of the sacred chest, so Joshua and the rest of the Israelites could see them. (24) Then everyone took Achan and the things he had stolen to Trouble Valley. They also took along his sons and daughters, his cattle, donkeys, and sheep, his tent, and everything else that belonged to him. (25) Joshua said, "Achan, you caused us a lot of trouble. Now the LORD is paying you back with the same kind of trouble." The people of Israel then stoned to death Achan and his family. They made a fire and burned the bodies, together with what Achan had stolen, and all his possessions. (26) They covered the remains with a big pile of rocks, which is still there. Then the LORD stopped being angry with Israel. That's how the place came to be called Trouble Valley. accountable for their actions as well. Religions hiding pedophiles are not forgiven for their other, "good," works. Be careful... Christians are not followers of men, they are the individuals who follow Christ!

There is a terrible danger for all who search for truth, and there is a simple self-test. You must surely realize in your own heart that all these religious sects, each with their own doctrine and judgmental attitude toward all the others, *they can't all be right*. Jesus actually warned us to watch out for them.<sup>(SS)</sup> People who have absolute faith they are the chosen sect of God are very dangerous. Their group judgmental attitude drives them to prefer to see you suffer emotional harm, or even see you killed, than to be forced to listen to any scriptural objection you might raise to expose their blind faith. They imagine your expressions of faith in Bible truth to be an assault on their group: The group they also imagine to be God's only true servants. Once they blindly accept the doctrine of men, they will shut up their ears to those who oppose that doctrine.<sup>S</sup>

Their group leaders have to make them feel that way, because refusing to even listen to nonmembers is the only way they can maintain their control through the group's blind faith in their lies.<sup>(MM)</sup> You should recognize, real faith that is built on what is not true does not lower the danger posed by those who believe. What makes them dangerous is whether they are convinced they are God's only true servants. The test and protection against being deceived yourself is simple: If any group you are involved with is helping you see your personal responsibility before our heavenly Father, by helping you actually learn what God sent his son to teach you<sup>(G)</sup> (by actually studying the Gospels), you are safe and are being helped to become or remain a Christian. The reason that is true is really simple: Jesus's teachings bring his followers humility and love for others. Religion, identified simply by being based on the doctrine of men, brings arrogance and hatred and judgment of others.<sup>T</sup> If you are part of a group who is seeking your worship, doing so by deceiving you to believe you must be approved by their sect to be pleasing to God, you have been misled. Religionists will have a whole set of rules for you to follow, rather than simply teaching you to study what Jesus taught.<sup>U</sup> Just ask yourself: Are the people you associate with really

what our ancestors taught us to do? They don't even wash their

their eyes they have closed, lest they should see with their eyes and hear with their ears and understand with their heart and turn, and I would heal them.' You let them say that what they have has been offered (dedicated) to God. (6) Is this any way to show respect to your parents? You ignore God's commands in order to follow your own teaching. written materials for approval.<sup>V</sup> Some of them are actually so bold as to proclaim the written materials they produce are spiritual food (as only the Bible is).<sup>(V)</sup> In that way they try to put what they say equal with the Bible in your mind. They will, each sect of them of course, stress they are your one true path to God. What they really demand, however, is for you to respect their judgment over you.<sup>(FF) & (T)</sup> They want you to believe when they approve or disapprove you, you are approved or disapproved by God. They

want to decide for you what the scriptures mean, and thus derail you from personally seeking an understanding of what Jesus actually taught. They require that you read and accept their literature and have an approved standing in their sect.<sup>(TT)</sup> Just think for a second about what that really means! Once you allow yourself to be dragged along in such thinking, you can no longer know if what you believe is truly based on the Bible. You may no longer be following Christ! Check yourself: Do you believe in the Bible, or in your organizations written materials? It is not the same thing! Every organization that follows their own doctrine while professing faith in the Bible, believes their doctrine is scriptural. They are not all right!<sup>(SS)</sup> This really isn't difficult to understand. You simply have to remain faithful to Christ, by always relying on your personal knowledge of what our Lord actually did teach (without concern for what other men think).<sup>(FF)</sup> You must not expect or accept the approval and adoration of other men and women.<sup>W</sup> Some people will love you because you manifest Christian traits,<sup>X</sup> but, you can't ever pick and choose who will love





My hope is, that hope is what is also becoming my reality.)<sup>GG</sup> What I hope is in complete harmony with all I know of the Bible and Jesus's teachings. There is no other definition of truth I know, and I know of no scripture that contradicts my faith. If you do, please show me!

Ananias and Sapphira were people who had been instructed by God under the pre-Christian Jewish arrangement.<sup>HH</sup> Then, they were blessed to be witness as God transferred his spirit from that Jewish nation of people<sup>II</sup> to all the individual persons (both Jews and Gentiles) who expressed faith in Christ.<sup>JJ</sup> (Their group form of worship had brought the Jews both group blessings and group responsibility. Because of that group responsibility, the whole nation suffered when Achan sinned.<sup>(Q)</sup> I believe part of what God was teaching us by means of them, was not to desire to be part of the crowd, or of any sect of men.) What an honor Ananias and Sapphira had! I really feel the fact God struck them down quickly was an act of kindness toward them. (God is teaching us how to be happy. Those who refuse his counsel can never be happy. The death of those who are truly enemies of God [Ananias and

Sapphira] probably only amounts to putting them out of their misery. Of course, part of the point of this letter is realizing and acknowledging that what I *think*, or what other men and women think, doesn't really matter at all. The only thing that matters is what the Bible clearly teaches.) Peter told us (as recounted by Paul in Acts)<sup>KK</sup> that Judas fell down and his bowels burst out. I don't know if that scriptural account means he was dead already, or if he died painfully over a long time in the midst of his own "blood and guts;" dying while he was left to reflect on the pain he helped cause the Christ. It doesn't really concern me much, one way or the other, because I am certain God dealt with him in precisely the way he should have been. It may be that even God doesn't care which way he died! He's dead, and he likely won't be resurrected...

Thus, we should all take accountability to be very serious.<sup>LL</sup> Jesus

KK Acts 1:16-18 GNB "My friends," he said, "the scripture had to come true in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, made a prediction about Judas, who was the guide for those who arrested Jesus. (17) Judas was a member of our group, for he had been chosen to have a part in our work." said he came to give us accountability.<sup>MM</sup> He said he came to speak the truth to us, and that we are judging ourselves by our response to his teachings.<sup>NN</sup> Judgment is a process of life that leads to exoneration *our receiving blessings*, or to the execution of adverse judgment against us. Ananias and Sapphira sat before the judgment seat of Christ by their life course, and by their act of deceit. Then, they received the execution of the judgment of their life. We are each sitting before the judgment seat of Christ in the same sense. It does not require a literal sitting before Christ. We judge ourselves based on our life decisions.<sup>(NN)</sup> It might be a little redundant and/or

a waste of Jesus's time to have us literally sit before him while he recaps what bad things we did. In the days of Noah, Noah received the judgment of his life of obedience to God as he floated away alive. At that same time, those who rejected truth died in their sins. As in the days of Noah, so the coming of man will be.<sup>(QQ)</sup> We will survive based on our faith in Christ, or we will continue to die as a result of our lack of faith.<sup>(RR)</sup> *That* is our judgment. The wicked really don't deserve some formal trial process. We will simply note they no longer exist.<sup>OO</sup>

As we live through our own generations set of "last days," it is God's purpose to now create the kingdom of Christ to reestablish paradise. This is the final set of "last days" (as far as I can see the Bible teaches), and it is "these last days" that the whole of the Bible has been about. These last days, our last days, are what mankind has been looking forward to since God said at Genesis  $3:15^{PP}$  that He would raise up a seed of the woman who would crush Satan's head! What a wondrous time to be alive. It is the "last days" of this wicked old world system, and the revelation of God's grand purpose to help mankind. And, I believe, it brings another period of high accountability. Failure to show appreciation for what our Grand Creator is doing will likely be viewed with less

and less patience. In any case, to survive, we must build true faith in the teachings of Christ Jesus. We must not allow ourselves to be led along by some sect of men who want to tell us what Jesus said, and/or, what he meant by what he said. If you allow that, you are actually choosing to worship their sect.<sup>(U)</sup> You will then believe anything they say. The blessings available to us, however, by being alive during these "last days," are wonderful nearly beyond comprehension. In most cases, during these final "last days" of this old system and the revelation of the authority of Christ's kingdom, God is dealing with mankind differently than He did in the days of Ananias and Sapphira. Rather than striking the wicked down, God is simply letting them continue to die as the product of their disobedience to what he sent his son to teach.<sup>(G)</sup> At the same time, He is preserving alive all who are made righteous in God's eyes by their faith in his son. It's similar to the days of Noah.<sup>QQ</sup> Our disobedience to God and the resultant hatred among men, along with mankind's ravaging of our earthly home, has brought the tribulation by our own hand. God has provided salvation for us all by means of the kingdom of Christ. Those who get on board by expressing personal faith in Christ will be preserved alive. The faithless will be swept away as they continue on to die in their sins. RR

I hope this explains why I remain comfortable with my understanding of Ananias and Sapphira, and how I see their judgment as a perfect fit in among the great works our God is doing. Above all else, however, I always try to remember and

acknowledge this is my personal understanding: I strive to remain a student of the Bible. As long as I can do that, it keeps me from being judgmental and hateful toward others. If you have other scriptures that shed more light on Ananias and Sapphira, or on my hope in general, please let me know. If it's anything except what the Bible clearly says, however, I am inclined to avoid taking any chance on building faith in something some well-meaning person might be wrong about.<sup>SS</sup>

As examples of things I don't worry about: One group says God is a trinity and those who don't accept their teaching are lost. Taking the opposite stand, another group says God is head of a theocracy and anyone who doesn't express faith in their understanding is lost. Did you know neither of the words trinity or theocracy appear at all in the Bible? Where, then, do those words come from? From sects of men making up words to "enlighten" those they can deceive to follow after them (as they attempt to replace Christ as leader among men).<sup>TT</sup> Both groups seek followers who will help

Knowing at least part of what God taught us by means of his son, then,<sup>(G)</sup> I do my best not to get caught up in fighting for the justification of sectarian doctrine. Rather, I just try and parrot what Jesus said. If I do that, neither trinity nor theocracy ever even come up. (On and on the list of doctrinal teachings go: Was Jesus killed by hanging him on a single stake, or on a cross; is it hell fire of torment, or hell fire of destruction; etc.?) I do have strong personal beliefs about most of those doctrines. I have also realized, however, if I just stick with teaching what Jesus taught, those doctrinal points of contention don't even come up. It seems foolish to risk my life by joining some group who assert they have reasoned out the "proper" understanding of those matters, topics which the Bible does not specifically make clear, and then to join in their bold judgment against all who don't share their faith.<sup>UU</sup>

wearing Scripture verses on their foreheads and arms, and they wear big tassels for everyone to see. (6) They love the best seats at banquets and the front seats in the meeting places. You can always spot "religionists" in their "preaching" activity. In any discussion they start with you, they always seek to find some point of contention. Then, they explain what truth "really is," and judge you lost if you don't agree with their viewpoint (with their faith). (Christians, on the other hand, simply seek to share Jesus's words.) Most non-Christian doctrinal contentious beliefs don't have any positive impact on building and exercising faith in what Jesus Christ taught. They are simply the tools used by sectarian groups to judge others and extoll their own self-righteousness. I do my best to leave it to those who are choosing to continue to die, to continue to debate the doctrines of men.<sup>VV</sup> I have a simple

God, just like the ones who don't eat meat. (7) Whether we live or die, it must be for God, rather than for ourselves. (8) Whether we live or die, it must be for the Lord. Alive or dead, we still belong to the Lord. (9) This is because Christ died and rose to life, so that he would be the Lord of the dead and of the living. (10) Why do you criticize other followers of the Lord? Why do you look down on them? The day is coming when God will judge all of us. (11) In the Scriptures God says, "I swear by my very life that everyone will kneel down and praise my name!" (12) And so, each of us must give an account to God for what we do. (13) We must stop judging others. We must also make up our minds not to upset anyone's faith.

These website booklets amount to records of my own personal Bible study. They are more for me than anyone. Not only does it help me as I look up the scriptures to construct the booklets, but some of the webpages are getting eight or ten years old by now. I review them on a regular basis because I forget. My primary focus, however, remains the Bible.) God willing then, the gist of this letter will soon be a part of a new booklet on the website (JustBibleTruth.com).

Over half a million people were killed in Syria in the few years prior to 2016. Sixty five million people were made homeless throughout the earth in 2015. That's just two of the troubles that readily come to mind from the tribulation consuming our day. I was in an auto tire store the other day for maybe an hour. During that hour, two young men came in looking for jobs and a third came in spraying cleaner on the carpet trying to sell the cleaner. Our nation is not immune to the sufferings of most of the world. Many people believe America has been protected in the past because a large portion of the nation had faith in the Bible. I don't doubt that, but I am not sure it can be said any longer. People often confuse faith in God with faith in the Bible. They are very different. We must have both. The Bible, and more specifically the teachings God's son, is our only source of knowledge about the true God. These are terrible days and they are not getting better.<sup>YY</sup>

I must love everyone!<sup>CCC</sup> And, I can be happy! Happy because I do have faith, even in the midst of all these troubles, God is helping every single person who is looking to him for a way out. The only help I can really be, then, is to be prepared to explain to everyone what is happening to them and why it is happening; when and if they give me a chance to do so.<sup>(XX)</sup> Building faith in Christ is what can help each one of us directly, and then, can help all those who will listen to Christ through us. The creation is being put back on the same track (and probably even the same timetable) it would be on if Satan had never even interfered with God's handiwork.<sup>(OO)</sup> Once again, God will look at the works of his hands and say it is "very good."<sup>(DD)</sup> Ananias and Sapphira, along with all the Bible record, will stand forever as examples of why there will never again be any need to tolerate badness. Everyone will know and fully understand the terrible consequences brought by

Ananias and Sapphira knew that (because they were being specifically used by God as He worked to fix the problems afflicting mankind)! They just didn't care.~ **Psalms 83:13-18 King James Version** O my God, make them (the wicked) like a wheel; as the stubble before the wind. (14) As the fire burneth a wood, and as the flame setteth the mountains on fire; (15) So persecute them with thy tempest, and make them afraid with thy storm. (16) Fill their faces with shame; that they may seek thy name, O LORD **[Galler]**. (17) Let them be confounded and troubled for ever; yea, let them be put to shame, and perish: (18) That *men* may know that thou, whose name alone *is* JEHOVAH **[Galler]**. (17) *art* the most high over all the earth.

A Confession: To please God we must start by knowing what He promised, so we can then have faith to receive those promises. Knowing what is true, however, does not make you righteous, or put you in line for the reward. I wrote this letter, and, if you have read the account of Ananias and Sapphira,<sup>(H)</sup> you know what a serious matter telling a lie can be. The righteous do not lie! In the midst of writing the letter (it took several days), and looking up the scriptures about these two people who were killed by God, I coincidentally backed into a concrete slab and damaged my truck. It happened late at night and in a deserted area so no one knew. When I reported the event, the thought entered my mind that the insurance company might view me in a better light about raising my rates if I had not been driving the truck. They would have to pay the same for the damage, however it happened. No one could know! So, I lied and told them it happened in a parking lot and I didn't know exactly how. Again, no one would know! It finally dawned on me, while saying in this letter I could not imagine how Ananias and Sapphira could lie like they did, that I was doing precisely what that  $couple^{(H)}$  (as well as Achan and his household) had done. I had seen something I wanted (to not have my insurance rates raised), and so I took it.<sup>(Q)</sup> So... I called my insurance company, told them what I had done, and corrected my statement. If we love God, we must express our faith through obedience.<sup>FFF</sup> I pray and have faith God has forgiven me, but it certainly


